Project Description: Society of St. Vincent de Paul, Council of Louisville's Domestic Violence Transitional and Rapid Rehousing Program (DV TH/RR) serves people in Jefferson County who are homeless under HUD's Category 4 definition of homelessness. The DV TH/RR program has a dedicated Transitional Housing facility on SVDP's Shelby Park campus, which includes 18 bedrooms that provide up to 37 beds. All participants receive case management services with rapid exit to permanent housing as the primary goal, and referrals to supportive services. Participants in the project also receive housing navigation support for finding eligible housing units. This program has been funded through HUD for the past 5 years, and during its last completed grant year, provided services to 229 individuals in 105 households, with 87% of those who exited the program doing so to permanent housing solutions.
