Project Description: The purpose of the City of Harlan Sanitary Sewer Assistance Project is to replace existing clay pipe installed in the 1960s to improve service to customers and reduce the potential for system overload leading to system failure. The customer base has quadrupled in recent decades, overloading the existing 10" lines. This project will eliminate the bottle neck between the Harlan lift station and the Baxter lift station. This project also replaces the Rio Vista lift station, which has been rehabbed twice since its installation in 1995 and currently carries more than it's design life anticipated.
