I. Program Data Report

1. Executive Summary

The purpose of this report is to provide baseline enrollment, admission, and financial data for the Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BSN), RN-BSN, Doctor of Nursing Practice (DNP), and Occupational Therapy (OT) programs. Review of 2022-2023 admission data indicates that there were several open seats in BSN, RN-BSN, DNP-Family Nurse Practitioner (FNP), and Occupational Therapy (OT) programs. The DNP-Nurse Anesthesia program was at capacity for the 22-23 year.

Although we have seen a decline in the number of qualified applicants for the BSN program since fall 2022, we anticipate an increase over the next few semesters. This is evidenced by the fall 2023 FTF enrollment numbers. Enrollment in the introductory nursing course has increased by 39%.

Murray State University continues to effectively and efficiently prepare students for certification exams including NCLEX. This is evidenced by the NCLEX/certification pass rates. The NCLEX pass rate for the May 2023 graduates was 97%. Employment rates are 100% for all programs. Murray State University has worked to eliminate financial barriers for students. This is evidenced by the financial initiatives described below. This includes the new scholarship model implemented during the fall 2023.

During the reporting period, Murray State University School of Nursing and Health Professions developed several important initiatives to assist in the healthcare workforce needs of Kentucky by utilizing funds provided by the CPE. The first initiative was the development and implementation of a Dedicated Education Unit (DEU) in partnership with Murray Calloway County Hospital (MCCH). The second initiative was the development of scholarships to help support Registered Nurses who were attending MSU to complete the Bachelor of Science in Nursing degree.



The DEU offered benefits to the students, clinical instructors, and the hospital. The students benefited by building positive relationships with the unit staff and increasing self-confidence as a senior nursing student. The clinical instructors benefited by engaging in opportunities to learn how to mentor and teach senior nursing students, engaging in leadership skills, and being recognized as a clinical expert. The hospital benefited by continuing a strong partnership with MSU, promoting a culture of teaching/learning, and serving as a recruitment strategy for future nurses.

The scholarship awards provided financial support to RNs who were returning to school to complete the BSN degree. The funding provided benefited working Registered Nurses by financially supporting their return to complete the BSN degree.

12. Financial Barrier Reduction Actions

Murray State University has implemented several new actions during the reporting period to reduce financial barriers. The following describes several of the action plans.

Murray State University implemented a new scholarship award model which began fall 2023. This model provides scholarship funding to students based on academic achievement including GPA and ACT scores. The model includes funding for students who have achieved a GPA of 2.75 up to a 4.00.

The "Racers Give Award" was been established during the Racers Give Campaign by gifts from alumni and friends to the Murray State University Foundation, Inc. (MSU Foundation) as a way to assist students at Murray State University in obtaining an education. Racers Give is a comprehensive giving campaign involving the entire Racer community – alumni, faculty, staff and students. Every dollar raised supports scholarships for Murray State University students.

Through the Murray State Promise, the university is committed to access and affordability. The Murray State Promise helps full-time, first-time freshmen and full-time, first-time transfer students who are Pell eligible by paying for tuition and mandatory fees, if the combined federal, state, institutional and private gift aid total is less than the cost of Murray State's tuition.

13. Conclusion

Murray State University has had an increase in enrollment for the fall 2023 semester. We anticipate that this will impact the number of BSN applications over the next few semesters. The BSN NCLEX pass rates remain above the national average and the May 2023 NCLEX pass rate was 97%. The OT program has had a decline in the number of qualified applicants. This is a national trend. We plan to develop a strategic plan to actively recruit students into this program.
