Project Description: Addison Field, located in the Sandy Hook area of Elliott County on 31 acres, serves many purposes, hosting events such as youth soccer, the Elliott County Farmers Market, Elliott County Soil Conservation Office, and a God's Pantry food drop. In addition, the University of Kentucky Cooperative Extension Service Office hosts several different events on the grounds throughout the year. Despite all of these activities, Addison Field still does not have a public restroom and must rely on porta-potties. Elliott County Fiscal Court is seeking GRANT Program funds to construct a permanent (storm ready) facility on the field's grounds to meet these needs. The proposed project would include a single building that would house restrooms, concessions, changing areas, and storage for maintenance and equipment. This area would also be available to any person having special needs or disabilities. It would be constructed to be certified storm-ready, so anyone at any of the adjacent facilities could seek shelter if needed.
