Introduction

As required in HB6 of the 2024 Regular Session of the General Assembly, the Energy and Environment Cabinet, Department for Environmental Protection submits a report recommending the priority ranking and funding mechanisms for the rehabilitation of public and private High Hazard dams.

The DEP regulates one hundred seventy-six (176) dams rated High Hazard in Kentucky. The most recent inspections for these structures show twenty-two (22) rated Satisfactory, sixty-six (66) rated Fair, and eighty-eight (88) rated Poor or Unsatisfactory, on the National Inventory of Dams (NID) condition assessment.

Rehabilitation Prioritization

To prioritize for rehabilitation, DEP excluded:

- Eighty-eight (88) dams rated Satisfactory or Fair because rehabilitation is not currently required or anticipated based on inspection trends; and
- Seventeen (17) dams rated Poor only for maintenance reasons because those items are not currently impacting the structural stability of the dam and is otherwise compliant with all applicable regulations.

Of the remaining seventy-one (71) High Hazard dams, DEP first prioritized those rated Unsatisfactory above those rated Poor, and then used the Federal Emergency Management Agency's (FEMA) Decision Support System for Water Infrastructure Security (DSS-WISE) dam breach modeling tool to develop Population at Risk (PAR) data to prioritize sixty-five (65) of those dams based on screening level risk (this data was unavailable for the remaining 6 dams). DEP sorted the final list to make Unsatisfactory dams the highest priority, which were then ranked by PAR, and finally by total points assigned for structural and hydraulic deficiencies. Dams are sorted by highest priority ranking of 1 to lower priority of 71. The six dams with no available PAR data were included at the bottom of the list (after those with PARs), then sorted by the reason for the Unsatisfactory/Poor rating (3 points for structural/1 point for hydraulic), and finally sorted by highest to lowest total points.

Of the seventy-one (71) total prioritized dams:

- Thirteen (13) are under an enforcement action or are the subject of current legal cases to compel dam remediation; and
- Seven (7) have improvements or mitigation in development or in progress.

Of the Top 20 prioritized dams:

• Nine (9) are under an enforcement action or are the subject current legal cases to compel dam remediation; and

• Three (3) have improvements or mitigation in development or in progress.

Funding Mechanisms

The DEP notes that engineering expertise, materials, and other items required for dam repair are extremely expensive. Since 2019, approximately \$25 million in State Owned Dam Repair (SODR) funds have been expended for extensive repairs to two state-owned dams in Kentucky (Bullock Pen Lake Dam and Scenic Lake Dam). To be eligible for SODR funding, dams must be owned by the Commonwealth per KRS 151.291. SODR projects in development are Willisburg Lake Dam (current estimate ranges from \$25 - \$30 million) and Clements Lake Dam (current estimate ranges from \$15 - 20 million). Since private owners of dams are not required to report amounts spent to repair their dams, the DEP is unable to assess additional monies spent on those projects.

Of the prioritized dams in the attached list, SODR funding is available for four (4) dams - Boltz Lake Dam, Mud River MPS 51, Marion County Sportsman's Dam, and Willisburg Lake Dam (with prioritization ratings of 31, 43, 47 and 63, respectively). Willisburg Lake Dam has an active, funded SODR project currently in the engineering design phase with construction scheduled to begin in late 2025 or early 2026.

Funding mechanisms for dam repair include the following:

- 1. USDA Natural Resources Conservation Service-prioritized funding for Watershed Protection and Flood Prevention Act (PL-566) structures with state or local funding match requirements. HB 1 2022 RS authorized 5,000,000 in FY23 for the Soil and Water Conservation Commission (KRS146.110) to leverage federal and local funds to establish a Watershed Dam Infrastructure Revolving Fund for the purpose of rehabilitating non-compliant or high hazard Kentucky watershed dams. This funding is being used as match with federal USDA NRCS funding.
- 2. State or Federal appropriations/earmarks for repair of specific SODR dam(s).
- 3. Local community or dam owner funding.
