Dear Senator McDaniel and Representative Petrie:

As stipulated in HB1 of the 2022 Regular Session of the General Assembly, the Finance and Administration Cabinet (FAC) submits to your attention a report of the Computer Services Fund receipts from the Executive, Judicial and Legislative Branches of Government itemized by appropriation unit.

The COT cost allocation methodology is the cost of providing IT services for the Commonwealth and consists of direct and indirect costs applied to each billable COT service. Direct costs are those associated with a COT rated service. Indirect costs are those shared by all rated services. When indirect costs are incurred, they are allocated to COT's rated services, added to the direct costs, and thereby become part of the total service cost. This gives COT the ability to bill and reconcile appropriately for each rated service. The allocation of indirect costs to COT rated services is a function within the statewide accounting system that is processed monthly.

Annual billing was reduced by \$15.4M in the fourth quarter for services projected to over recover for the fiscal year. The total receipts on the Computer Service Fund Receipts Report are net of reduced billing.
