The Kentucky State Corrections Commission met on April 29, 2021 and awarded eight (8) grants for Fiscal Year 2022 to the entities which are described below.

The Christian County Fiscal Court (3<sup>rd</sup> Judicial Circuit) provides alternatives to incarceration utilizing electronic monitoring and home incarceration, targeting substance abuse offenders through drug screens and referrals to substance abuse counseling.

The Chrysalis House is a residential substance abuse disorder treatment program for women. Grant funds provide alcohol and drug screening services.

Involvement, Inc. (51<sup>st</sup> Judicial District) provides home incarceration and electronic monitoring. The program provides drug screening for program participants and indigent court defendants, as well as alternative sanctions for drug court participants.

The Hardin County Mental Health Court is conducted through the 9<sup>th</sup> Judicial Circuit and operates through Communicare, Inc. The program provides individual counseling, drug education, cognitive behavioral therapy, and peer support.

The Nelson County Mental Health Court is conducted through the 10<sup>th</sup> Judicial Circuit and operates through Communicare, Inc. The program provides individual counseling, drug education, cognitive behavioral therapy, and peer support.

The Daviess County Mental Health Program (6<sup>th</sup> Judicial Circuit) is geared towards identifying

eligible felony defendants for access to in-patient or out-patient treatment, alternative to detention placements, individualized case management, and wrap-around services.

The Kenton County Electronic Monitoring/Home Incarceration Program (16<sup>th</sup> Judicial Circuit) works in conjunction with the Kenton County Detention Center. It includes home incarceration and electronic monitoring as an alternative to incarceration.

The Northern Kentucky Regional Mental Health Court (NKRMMC) encompasses Boone, Kenton, and Campbell Counties. The program provides counseling, intensive case management, wrap-around services, and linkage to services such as emergency housing.

Attached are the program results for all eight (8) programs for FY2022. No pilot projects were funded in FY2022, therefore no performance incentive funding was appropriated under KRS 196.731.
