RE: EKSAFE Funds Report

Dear Co-Chairs Senator McDaniel and Representative Jason Petrie:

HB 1 (2022 SS) establishes the East Kentucky State Aid Funds for Emergencies (EKSAFE) Fund to provide disaster relief for areas impacted by the July 2022 storms and flooding. Included in the appropriation is \$40M to the Kentucky Department of Education (KDE) for impacted school districts. KDE is required to report to the Interim Joint Committee on Appropriations and Revenue beginning on September 10, 2022, and every month thereafter through July 10, 2024. The report is to include the name of each school district receiving EKSAFE funds, the dollar amount of funds issued, a description of how the funds were used, and a list of all requests submitted. The list of submitted requests shall include the amount requested, any denials with the reason for denial, and if the award is more or less than requested, an explanation for the increase or decrease. Please allow this letter to serve as the initial required report.

The HB 1 appropriation to KDE, provides funds to school districts for the following:

1. Providing the necessary wrap-around services for school children and their families in recovering from the impact of the storms and tornadoes, including after-school services and activities held at the school facilities or elsewhere in the community, mental health counseling services, and outside-of-school tutoring and other services to advance the scholastic progress of students;
2. Assisting school districts in addressing the additional transportation costs to provide transportation to students that are displaced from their district or county; and
3. Transferring a portion to the School Facilities Construction Commission to offer funding for the construction and repairs of school building facilities that have been destroyed or severely damaged by the storms and tornadoes. If a school district receives insurance funds for the facility, the school district shall reimburse the fund an amount equal to the amount received from insurance proceeds.

To expeditiously provide funds to impacted districts, KDE held a webcast on September 1, 2022, to make impacted school districts aware of the passage of HB 1 and answer district questions. Following passage of the bill, KDE created a EKSAFE Account in its budget structure and funds were transferred into the account. KDE staff created a simple district application to request funds. An additional webinar was held with impacted districts to discuss the application and disbursement process. The application is available on KDE's state grants website. The application permits districts to provide KDE with important information related to their challenges and fiscal needs. KDE continues to hold regular meetings with impacted districts. Disbursement of EKSAFE funds a top priority for KDE, and the initial requests will be paid as soon as possible after receipt. Thereafter requests will be paid monthly.

As of the January 9, 2023, KDE has not yet received any applications for EKSAFE Funds. KDE is in continued communication with impacted districts. Districts are in communications as well with their insurance providers and FEMA representatives. KDE will expeditiously process applications and make payments upon receipt.
