Motorcycle Education Program Annual Report 2024 Fiscal Year

Introduction

The Motorcycle Rider Education Program ("Program") was established in 1992 to help new riders learn the needed skills to be safe on the roadways, as well as veteran riders to hone and improve their skills. The program is paid for in part by a portion of all motorcycle license and registration fees to help subsidize the costs of providing the classes KRS 175.5065.

Pursuant to KRS 176.5061 the Transportation Cabinet ("Cabinet") shall establish a motorcycle safety education program. The program shall provide instructor training courses, instructor approval, and rider training courses for novice riders that shall be held at locations throughout the state. The program may provide for the following: rider training courses for experienced riders; activities to increase the awareness of a motorcyclist's knowledge of the effects of alcohol and drug use; driver improvement efforts; licensing improvement efforts; program promotion activities; enhancement of the public's awareness of motorcycles; and enhancement of motorcycle safety through education.

The Motorcycle Safety Education Commission ("Commission") is established as an independent body to help foster the growth and development of the Program established under KRS 176.505 – 506, KRS 176-5067 -5068 and 601 KAR 14:050 detail the powers and duties of the Program, Cabinet and Commission.

Program Overview

This year the program saw its greatest number of students in the history of the program with 4776 students being impacted by the program. The program could have been able to reach even more students but was constrained by budgetary limits. Some sites had to reschedule classes into the next fiscal year or conducted classes without a reimbursement in some cases.

Currently the program is capped at approximately \$850,000 per year and under the current reimbursement schedule it will not allow for any further expansion of the program. The Program Fund is solvent and can support additional students. The fund is supported by existing fees on motorcycle licenses and registrations. As more people look to motorcycles with rising gas prices the fund will grow along with the need to train more riders.

Finances to the program are currently being helped with a pair of NHTSA grants which help to fund the training of instructors, quality assurance program and the marketing of the program. This helps to free more program funds for student reimbursements.

This year saw some changes in the Quality Assurance Program. We limited the number of people doing the visits to some of the more experienced instructors within the program. With that said, there is still an effort to certify more instructors in the QA process so there is a thorough understanding of the process from all sides. The Quality Assurance Specialists (QAS) that were making the visits also tried when possible, to get a more complete picture of the class by attending all (1-3) days of the course depending on the format used by the site and the course being observed. This seemed to work much better and allowed the QAS more time to bond and work with the instructors when needed.

The marketing program is helping drive students to the program. After review of crash statistics within the state we have identified a need to reach more already licensed riders. Just under half of the crashes in 2023 were licensed riders who simply ran off the road in a single vehicle crash. This speaks to a lack of cornering and braking skills within the overall motorcycle population. Paired with an effort to have more instructors trained in the experienced rider courses, the goal is to offer more options for existing riders to improve their riding abilities.

Site Providers

The program currently has contracts with ten (10) site providers and 11 sites to deliver instruction to students. The Elizabethtown Community College location has been inoperable for most of the calendar year 2024, due to the range surface deteriorating. Repairs were made during the year but due to a change in personnel at the College the painting was put on hold until later in 2024. Currently the plan is to be fully operational by the Spring of 2025. We are continuing to look for new locations to host classes, especially in the western portion of the state.

There was a clerical issue at the end of the fiscal year with reporting into an updated EMARS system. Due to that difficulty, some of the expenditures for the program that happened in FY24 were posted in FY25. This amounted to approximately \$100,000 bringing the total expenditures near the budget cap of \$850,000.

Tuitions are paid by the students and go to the training providers to help cover the costs of instructors, books, materials and other consumables. Tuition is capped at \$150 per class but training providers may charge less depending on the type of course being offered and promotions they may offer.

The program has a cash balance carry forward of **\$2,271,865.57** into FY 2023. There was a net cash gain in the fund from FY 22 of **\$116,757.15**.

During FY24 we were able to conduct 2 Rider Coach Prep (RCP) classes to train new instructors to the program. 14 Candidates entered the RCPs and 10 were approved and added to the instructor team. For existing instructors a 3-Wheel Basic Rider Course (3WBRC) certification was held where 11 instructors signed up and 7 were able to complete it successfully. Additionally, we added 9 more instructors with a Quality Assurance Specialist certification.

CY25 has planned to hold 2 RCP courses, a 3WBRC and an Advanced Rider Course (ARC) certification.
