

Support Special Olympics Kentucky

State funding needed to meet the needs of our growing population

Overview: Special Olympics Kentucky provides unique and vital services to more than 10,200 Kentuckians with

intellectual disabilities. Special Olympics Kentucky currently receives no state funding and is dependent on individual and corporate donations to fund the much-needed programs and services to athletes across Kentucky. Recognizing the impact Special Olympics Kentucky makes on an individual and his/her family, Special Olympics Kentucky is seeking state funding to meet the growing needs of this population.

Request: \$50,000 in each fiscal year of the 2020-2022 executive branch budget

Impact: 400 additional athletes statewide

Programs: Funding would be utilized to support growth in three programs:

• **Year-Round Sports Program**: 15 year-round sports programs teaching athletes valuable skills that translate into school and work settings. Studies show that our athletes are 52% more likely to be employed than their peers who do not participate.

- **Healthy Athletes Initiative:** Over 1,300 free health screenings to athletes annually.
- **Unified Champion Schools Program:** Building stronger school communities through fostering acceptance between students with disabilities and their peers, currently serving 86 Kentucky schools.

Other States:

27 programs in 26 other states currently receive a state appropriation for various programs including support for sports competitions, Healthy Athletes, Unified Champion Schools and general programming needs.
