


County Infrastructure at a Glance






- Counties own and maintain half of the road miles and over a third of the bridges in the state.
- In many rural counties, closer to two-thirds of road miles are maintained by the county.

County Road Aid Model


Motor Fuels Revenue Sharing Model




- The sole source of funding for county road aid is the motor fuels tax.
- Counties receive 18.3% of the motor fuels tax revenue allocated through the revenue sharing model.
- County road aid is distributed to counties based on the formula of fifths.
