Court Transports

Louisville Metro Transportation Unit (LMTU) transported 393 youth from Jefferson Regional Juvenile Detention Center (JRJDC) to court. Additionally, 36 youth were detained at court and transported from court to JRJDC. Total youth transported to and/or from court was 429. 404* of these transports were for juvenile court and 26* were for circuit court. *NOTE: 1 youth was seen in both juvenile and circuit court on 06/02/2022.

For these transports, 4,445.2 miles were recorded.

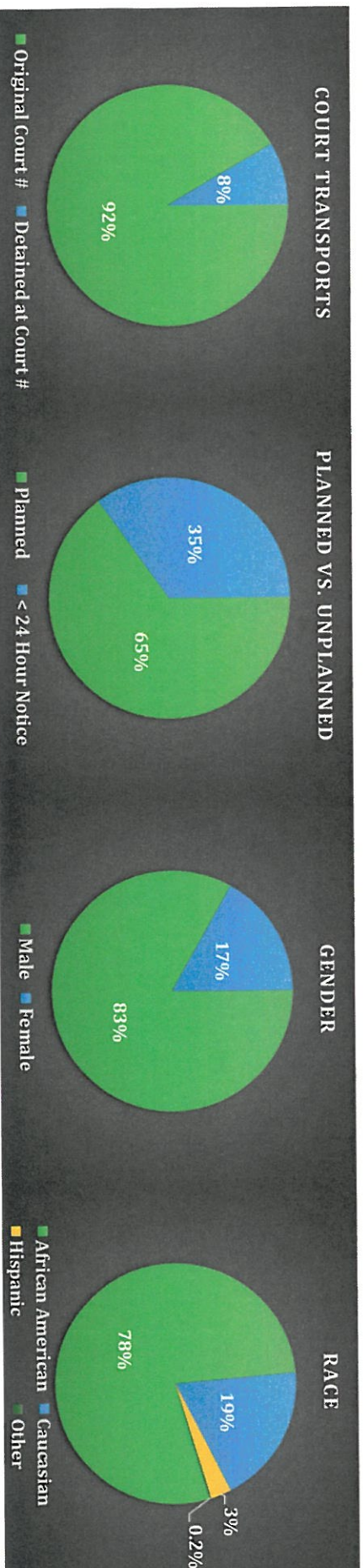

For these transports, 11,837.3 miles were recorded.

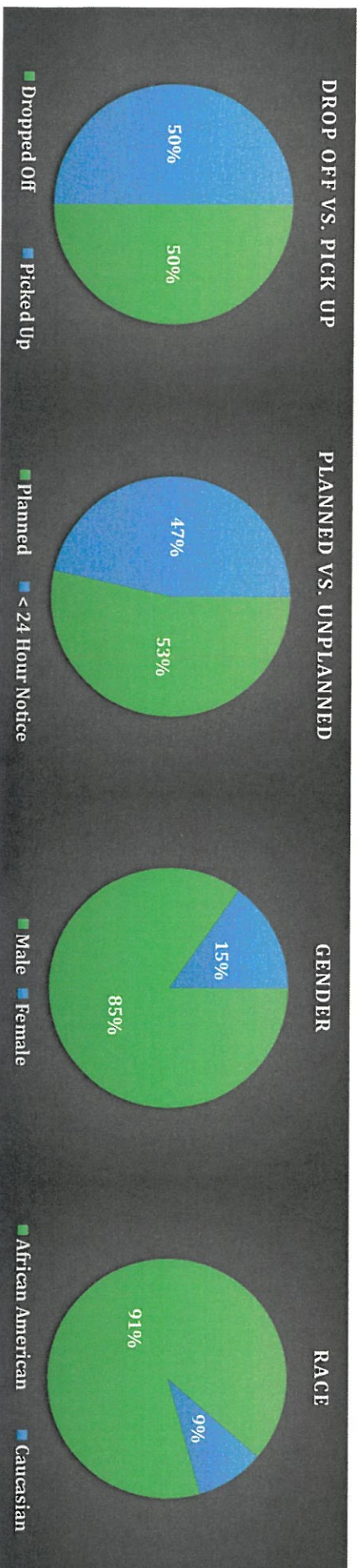

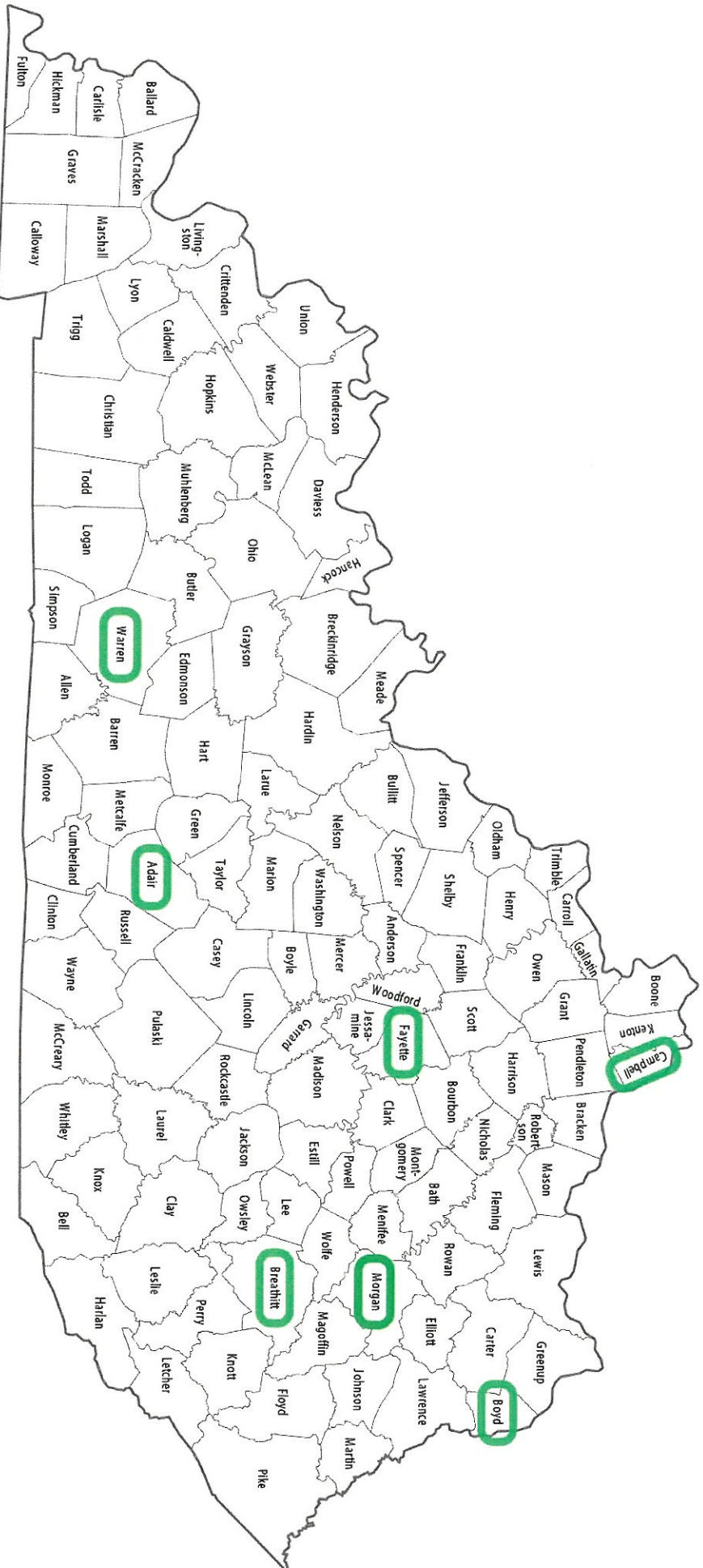

- 184 were not able to be serviced.

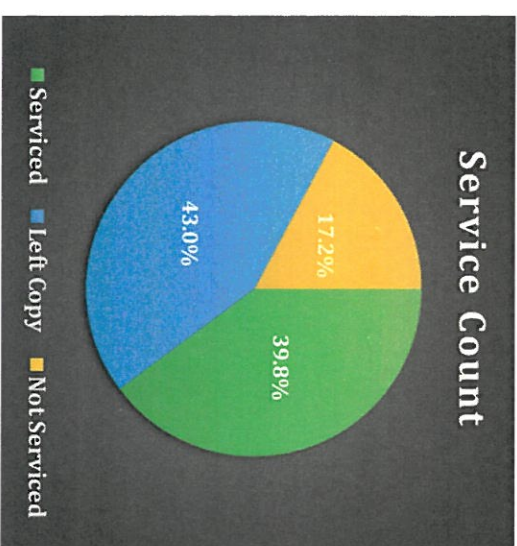

Youth Screening Center

Youth Screening Center went live on May 29th, 2022. Since then, 33 youth have been screened in the facility. 2 youth were deferred for medical clearance.

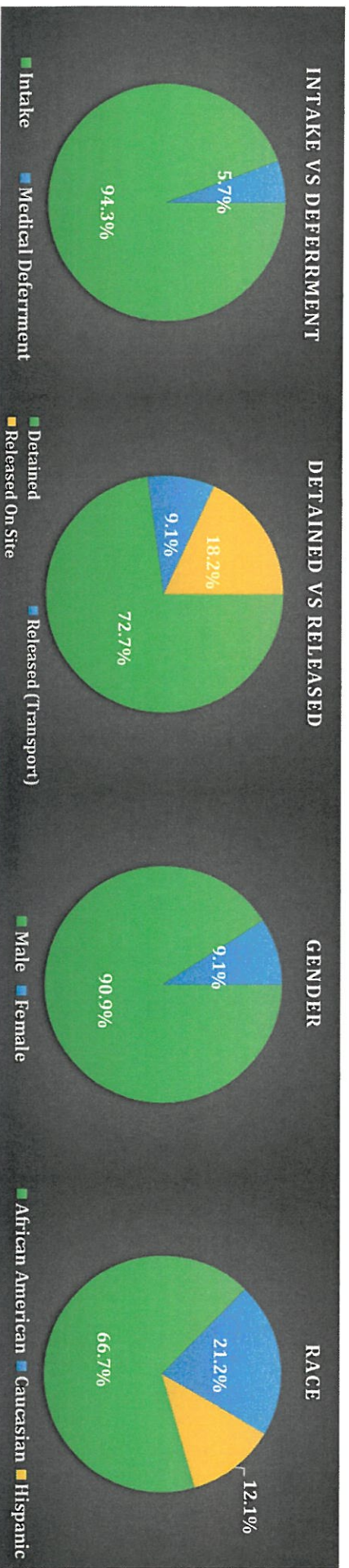

For these transports, 1531.6 miles were recorded.

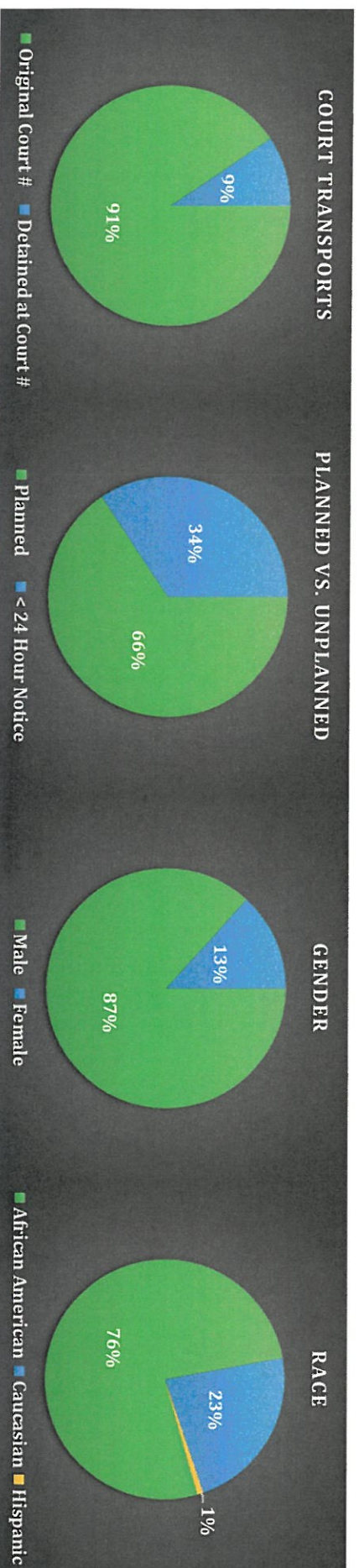
