





UK Total Research and Development Expenditures and Bucks for Brains Appropriations


Fiscal Year 1986 to Fiscal Year 2023



- Debt as percentage of the adjusted budget a decade ago: 2.62












- Debt payments as percentage of the adjusted budget: 1.92%
- Our construction:






- Average annual increase in housing costs: 3%
- Tuition and mandatory fees
 - Four-year rolling average for third straight year under 2%
- About 25% of Kentucky undergraduate students are firstgeneration
- About 25% of Kentucky undergraduate students come from families with a median household income of less than \$25,000
 - Those students are paying zero in tuition and mandatory fees
 - They are also receiving dollars back to help with additional costs
