Freedom House

- A nationally recognized program, and the only of its kind in Kentucky, providing residential treatment for pregnant and parenting women with substance use disorder.
 - ALL children, regardless of age, may accompany their mothers into treatment.
- Data-driven and evidence-based treatment.
- We are doubling our capacity in Manchester to accommodate the demand for our services. Also expanding to Stanford, Owensboro, and possibly Northern Kentucky.







Freedom House

- Designed for pregnant and parenting women.
- We accept women at any stage in pregnancy.
- All children under 18 can live with mom at Freedom House.

- 16 Total beds








Services provided at Freedom House

- Access to high-risk prenatal services
- Health and nutrition
- Licensed medical, clinical services
- Peer support services
- Parenting classes: bonding and attaching to your infant
- Trauma focused therapy
- Case management





Cost Savings

- NICU stays and long-term health outcomes for mothers and babies.
- \$29,212 Approximate cost of an 18-day NICU stay.
- 3.5 days Average NICU stay for Freedom House babies.
- Approximate cost savings due to shorter stay is \$20,000.
- 92% of Freedom House babies were born healthy in FY22 based on APGAR scoring.



Responsible Service Provision

- What is the ROI?
- Value Based Contracting with MCOs that prioritizes tangible outcomes should be prioritized to provide the best treatment for Kentuckians.
- For the past year, VOA has partnered with 5 MCOs to develop Value Based Contracts.





Project Strong

- In January 2023, VOA launched Project Strong, a five-year longitudinal program evaluation that measures the long-term impacts of Freedom House from 2022-2027.
- The primary focus of this evaluation is to better understand the social and financial benefits to communities.
- This project collects initial baseline data from graduates of the Freedom House program and then follow-up data every six months for a three-year period.
- Funded by a \$500,000 grant from Humana Foundation and an \$800,000 gift from an anonymous donor.






















Summary
