Potential Cost Savings for Kentucky's Students and Families

In May 2018, Kentucky public and private high school students took a total of 29,986 AP' Exams that resulted in scores of 3, 4, or 5. Based on students' opportunity to earn at least 3 college credits for each AP Exam score of 3 or higher, this represents an estimated 89,958 college credits. At an average rate of \$357.00* per credit hour, the total potential cost savings for the state's students and families was \$32,115,006.

*Please note: These estimates are based on Table 5 of the 2018 College Board report, *Trends in College Pricing*. This report indicates that the average in-state tuition and fees at Kentucky public four-year colleges is \$10,710 per year or \$357.00 per credit, assuming 30 credits were taken by a full-time student. These estimates also assume that all of the 29,986 exams taken in Kentucky were applied toward college credit.
