## Guidance for this plan:

- \*Reduce SAC travel time
- \*Increase student service time
- \*Move to a preventative model
- \*Consistent coverage for schools
- \*Establish new protocol for emergencies
- \* Support in feeder patterns - family
- \* Once per week/30 minutes-minimum
- \* Flexible model for growth
- \* Sustainability model over 3 years
- \* Additional Family Support

## 2021 - 2022:

- 1 : 359 (school counselors to students)
- 1 : 244 (school counselors/mental health therapists to students)
- 1 : 157 (full SEL/family support with counselors/therapists/FRYSC to students)

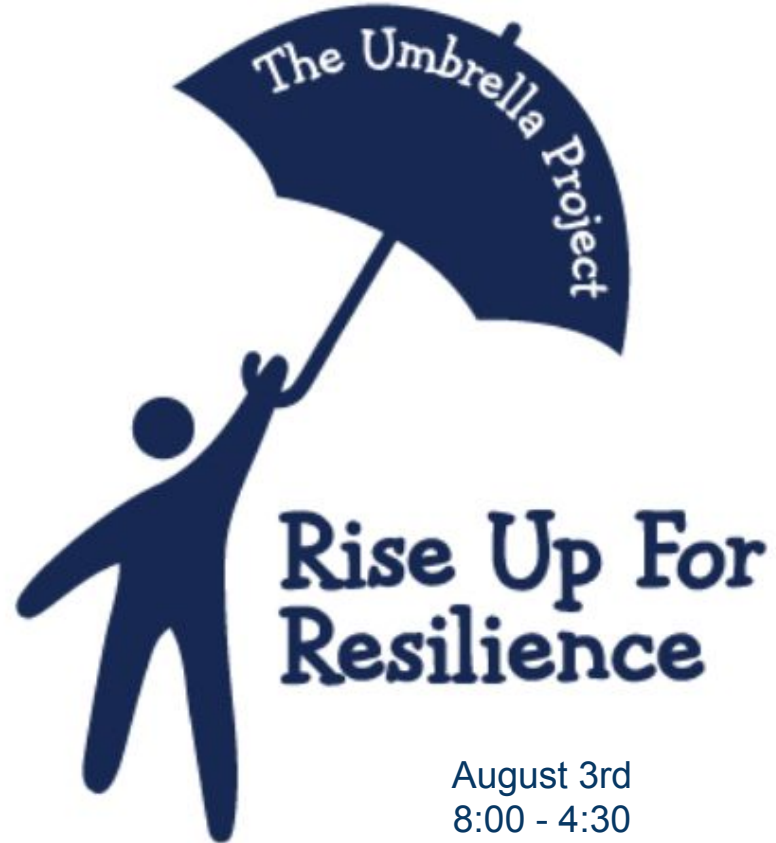
