

KCTCS Performance Funding Pool

MANDATED PROGRAMS

Adult Agriculture Program = \$1M in FY2022-23

(provides education in all facets of ag production and farm management)

State Fire and Rescue Training= \$1.9M in FY2022-23

(provides state fire rescue training to students across the state)

KCTCS TRAINS = \$4.1M in FY2022-23

(provides customized training and support for businesses and industries to meet workforce needs)



1 State Appropriation for all 16 Colleges

\$165,761,600

KCTCS colleges receive base Education and General (E&G) funding plus any performance funding earned through the KCTCS statewide performance funding model.

KCTCS colleges have a separate performance funding model from the 4-year universities and compete against each other based on prior year metrics and outcomes.



Education and General (E&G) Base Funding

- Colleges receive base general education funding to carry out core mission of the colleges and support E&G operations.
- Colleges base funding levels are carried over as allocated in prior years and reflect adjustments through state budget bills and other state-approved allocations/reductions.
- KRS 164.092 was enacted in 2021-22 preventing any reductions from college base funding levels below the 2020-21 base (Floor 21).



Performance Funding Pool

\$21,513,800

- Total Postsecondary Education Performance Funding allocation determined in state biennial budget; currently, KCTCS colleges are allocated 22.1% of total funding pool.
- KCTCS colleges are allocated performance funds on non-recurring basis based on funding model calculation as outlined in KRS 164.092.



Did You Know?

The System Office (Versailles, KY) is not allocated any of the State Appropriation. Rather, the 16 Colleges support the System Office via charge backs for Systemwide contracts and services.



What Happens at the System Office?

Think of it as a franchise headquarters.

We can provide services at scale to the Colleges so they can focus on mission & students...examples include:

Human Resources / Payroll
Information Technology / Cybersecurity
Accounting / Accounts Payable / Purchasing
Legal Services
Financial Aid
Marketing

We have the purchasing power of a system and can negotiate contracts and services that would otherwise be unattainable for a community college.



TUITION

Tuition Rates for All KCTCS Colleges:

In-State & Online-Only: \$182/credit hour

Out-of-State Contiguous Counties: \$364/credit hour

Out-of-State: \$637/credit hour

Tuition generated: \$216.7M in FY 2021.

Each College retains tuition revenue generated.



The Cost of Attendance

A 12-hour credit semester at KCTCS for 2022 = \$2,280

A 12-hour credit semester at Kentucky State University = \$3,900

A student can start at KCTCS and seamlessly transfer all general education courses to a four-year after their first two years, significantly reducing the cost of obtaining a college degree.



- \$4.2 M appropriation annually
- Colleges work with local businesses to create training plans.
- TRAINS pays up to 75% of company costs and 100% for approved new economic development.
- Originally branded as KY WINS in 2000 and rebranded as TRAINS in 2014, this funding has supported 307,828 enrollments.

- FY 22 was the highest performing year in TRAINS history with:
 - 240 unique projects
 - 19,000 + enrollments
 - 136 new companies served
 - 104 retuning company clients
