Shawn,

Again, thank you for your patience as we put together information for the Capital Planning Advisory Board (CPAB). I have updated the attached spreadsheet to include additional information as requested by CPAB.

I am including some additional information in hopes that it provides further clarity on the requested information.

- Prioritized listing or ranking of the projects
- As we discussed after our last meeting, I have included information from the Kentucky Facilities Inventory and Classification System (KFICS) and Asset Planner. KFICS provides school districts and third party architects the ability to collect, integrate, and maintain facilities inventory information. This report does not contain any requests for new facilities. Additionally, KFICS also supports a standard scoring methodology for building conditions and educational suitability. This information is provided by participating districts and third party architects and not all districts participate and nor are all schools included. Asset Planner allows KDE to create a State Report using this information which is provided to LRC every biennium. The State Report ranks buildings' physical conditions using a Kentucky School Score. The Kentucky School Score is an aggregate of the Condition Index (75\%) and the Educational Suitability ( $25 \%$ ). KDE reviews the district submitted data prior to the information being used in the State Report. Please note, each type of school may have its own respective ranking when compared to other like facilities. More information can be found on the field description tab of the most recent State Report.
- Building capacity
- As footnoted, the enrollment/capacity is from the most recently published district facility plan (DFP). Districts are required by statute to do a new DFP every four years, unless they request a waiver, in which case they are permitted up to 8 years. In cases where a combination of schools or grades existed, a combined enrollment/capacity was used. As attendance was not recorded in the last several years due to COVID-19, we do not have an appropriate percentage of growth or loss of students over the last several years from independent sources.
- Projects in a flood zone
- When available, this district provided information is included. It should be noted that existing regulations does not allow new construction to take place in the 100 year flood plain unless specific mitigation efforts are provided for in the construction.
- Prior funding from the budget bills and SFCC
- The most recent funding from SFCC and/or LAVEC funding was included in the spreadsheet. However, including previous budget bill funding will take me longer to compile if this information is needed
- Project justification
- It is important to understand that the school planning and construction is a locally driven process starting with the Local Planning Committee (LPC) and local School Board. While KDE is involved in providing support throughout the planning and construction process, we are likely not the best voice to provide justification on these projects.

Per your request, the Boyd County LAVEC project was removed as well.

As always, I am happy to discuss these details further with you all when convenient.

I am following up with you in regard to yesterday's post-meeting with Rep. McCool. Based on notes compiled by our staff, Rep. McCool is requesting additional data as listed below. This item will be included on the October 11 agenda.

1. Project justification
2. Prioritized listing or ranking of the projects - the discussion noted potential use of the Kentucky Facilities Inventory and Classification System (KFICS) or an internal prioritization model based on safety concerns, age of building, and building capacity. It may be useful to see the projects utilizing both KFICS and the aforementioned model as well.
3. Building capacity (e.g. is the facility overcrowded? What is the annual \% of increase in students?)
4. Remove LAVEC projects
5. Are any of the projects in a flood zone?
6. Also discussed was the possibly of listing prior funding from the budget bills and SFCC
