Kentucky is losing out on a credentialed workforce every time a college student takes beyond 4 years to complete a bachelor's degree.

The average time it takes a student to complete a bachelor's degree in Kentucky is 4.9 years.

20% of Kentucky college students drop out after the first year.

We know that 79% of students who complete 30 or more college credit hours in their first year of full-time college end up completing their degree.

The YSA model is a shared-ownership, collaborative effort between K-12 and higher education to ensure students hit this critical benchmark and become productive members of Kentucky's workforce.



The YSA model is currently a collaboration between Northern Kentucky University, the Northern Kentucky Cooperative for Educational Services, and nine individual school districts.

- Students are fully immersed as non-residential NKU full-time students for 2 years.
- NKU funds two full-time positions dedicated to the YSA student experience.
- Participating districts fund two full-time positions dedicated to the YSA student experience.
- All teammates are extensively trained as NKU academic advisors and serve as adjunct instructors.
- YSA blends the transition to higher education through a team of stakeholders on the fiscal/programmatic level and the everyday "on the ground" level.

"When we first learned about the YSA program, we were skeptical because our son is very much of an introvert. We were concerned that he wasn't ready to be 'on his own' in terms of being responsible for his own schedule, finding his way around campus, and getting any help he may need. However, that is why we ultimately decided that YSA was the best place for him! It's given him an opportunity to come out of his shell and be his own person, while still having the full support of a staff completely dedicated to these students. ## NU Young Scholars Academy

- Students admitted in cohort model prior to their junior year of high school
- YSA students are fully immersed NKU students during their junior/senior years, completing:
  - Dual credit enrollment for final high school requirements
  - An estimated 60 hours towards an Associates and/or Bachelors degree
  - General education requirements
  - Entry-level coursework in one or more disciplines of interest
- Scholars have the opportunity to earn an Associate of Arts in Integrative Studies

"As a first-generation student, I always dreamed of going to college and my parents were always excited for me to have an opportunity that they worked so hard for me to have. Being able to start college two years early was so exciting to me and being able to get my associate's degree at the same time I graduated high school was a dream come true. The YSA team oversees the entire experience: recruitment, advising, orientation, intervention, programming, teaching UNV 101,school/family communication, and enrollment projections.

Staff are based at NKU full time (7:30-4:00), M-F to coordinate all aspects of scholars' experiences with stakeholders, including high schools, NKU faculty and staff, and parents and families.

YSA's regional staff members are based at NKU but are funded through financial contributions from participating districts.

YSA staff uniquely coordinate all aspects of the scholar experience from both the K-12 and higher ed sides, with a dedicated director and coordinator on each side.

Dayton Independent Schools

- In 2012-2013, Dayton High School students earned a total of 6 Dual Credit College Hours.
- In 2022-2023, Dayton High School students earned a total of 736 Dual Credit College Hours.

- 422 students served since 2020
  - o 2020-21 Kenton pilot
  - o 2021-22 Kenton pilot
  - o 2022-23 Regional
  - o 2023-24 Regional
- Average College GPA: 3.28\*
  - 73% with GPA of 3.0 or higher\*
- 90% retention rate between two years of the program\*
- 97% of program graduates are now attending college post-program
  - 83% of them are in-state
- 51% of scholars are first-generation college students
- 51% of scholars are low-income (as defined by qualification for free/reduced lunch)
- 15% are underrepresented minorities



## Young Scholars Academy

- Initial \$100K investment from Kenton County School District in 2020-21.
- Annual \$484,000 investment from participating districts for tuition, transportation, and meals.
- NKU provides full-time services at discounted dual credit rate, equalling annual investment over 2 million.

This academy has proven to be a tremendous success for our scholars.

- Minimum 300 total scholars
- 10% allocated to state



## Young Scholars Academy

- State Success 2024 and Beyond:
  - Increase the number of NKY school districts participating in YSA.
  - Include statewide scholars, 10% of total population to be housed at NKU.
  - NKU/Districts working collaboratively to include more business engagement/support.

- \$7,000,000 Total
- Local Districts continued support:
  - Funding existing P-12 Staff
  - Transportation/Textbooks
- NKU continued support:
