<u>Action Question</u>: Should the Board approve revisions to the mission statements of Hazard Community and Technical College (HCTC), Jefferson Community and Technical College (JCTC), and West Kentucky Community and Technical College (WKCTC)?

<u>Recommendation</u>: Approve; it is recommended that the KCTCS Board of Regents approve revisions to the mission statements of HCTC, JCTC, and WKCTC to comply with Kentucky House Bill 4.

Background:

KCTCS Board of Regents Policy 1.2 states,

- The Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Colleges (SACSCOC) accreditation standards require that the college's statement of purpose be approved by the governing board and that the Kentucky Community and Technical College System (KCTCS) Board of Regents demonstrates that it periodically reviews and approves mission statements of each of the SACSCOC accredited colleges under its jurisdiction.
- Consistent with this requirement, it is the policy of the KCTCS Board of Regents that each SACSCOC accredited college have a Board-approved mission statement that is consistent with state statutes, the Council on Postsecondary Education's strategic agenda, and the KCTCS mission.
- The KCTCS President is authorized to develop procedures which assure that SACSCOC-accredited colleges' mission statements are periodically reviewed and approved. These procedures must include endorsement by the college's local board of directors, review by the KCTCS Chancellor (now Executive Vice-President and Provost), and approval by the KCTCS President and Board of Regents.

KCTCS Administrative Policy 1.2.1 states,

- KCTCS Board of Regents policy and accreditation criteria require that each college's mission statement be periodically reviewed and approved by the governing board, the KCTCS Board of Regents.
- The college mission statement is to be consistent with state statutes, the Council on Postsecondary Education's strategic agenda, and the KCTCS mission. It shall be clearly defined, published, specific to the institution, and appropriate to an institution of higher education, addressing teaching and learning and, where applicable, research and public service.
- Mission Statement Approval Process
 - Review of mission statement by college faculty, staff, and administration.

- Endorsement by local college Board of Directors.
- Review by Chancellor (now Executive Vice-President and Provost).
- Review and approval by the KCTCS President and KCTCS Board of Regents.

Rationale:

The KCTCS Board of Regents reviews and approves college mission statements on a regular interval to meet policy and accreditation requirements. To expedite the review and ensure an appropriate timeline within the KCTCS strategic planning process, KCTCS Administrative Policy 1.2.1 requires a review of all college mission statements by the Board of Regents for approval at their June meeting in the fiscal year in which the KCTCS Strategic Plan is approved. However, on June 27, 2025, Kentucky House Bill 4 will go into effect requiring education institutions to be in compliance with initiatives related to diversity, equity, and inclusion. As a result, the mission statements at HCTC, JCTC, and WKCTC must be revised ahead of schedule to ensure compliance with state law. KCTCS Administrative Policy 1.2.1 allows for mission review/approval outside of the normal sequence with approval by the KCTCS President, provided regular review processes are followed.

The following pages contain revised mission statements for HCTC, JCTC, and WKCTC, as well as a summary of institutional review processes.
