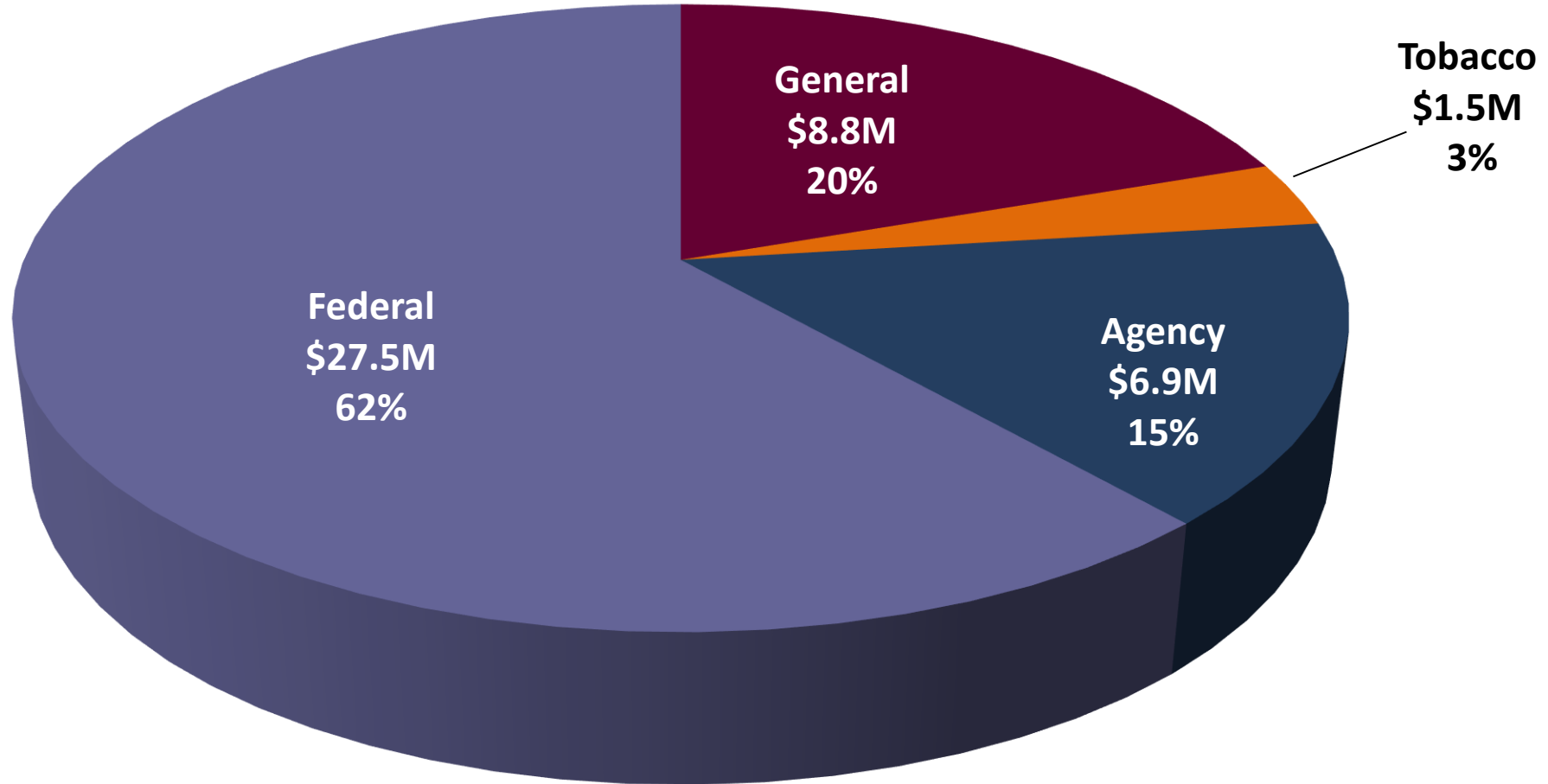
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Department Overview

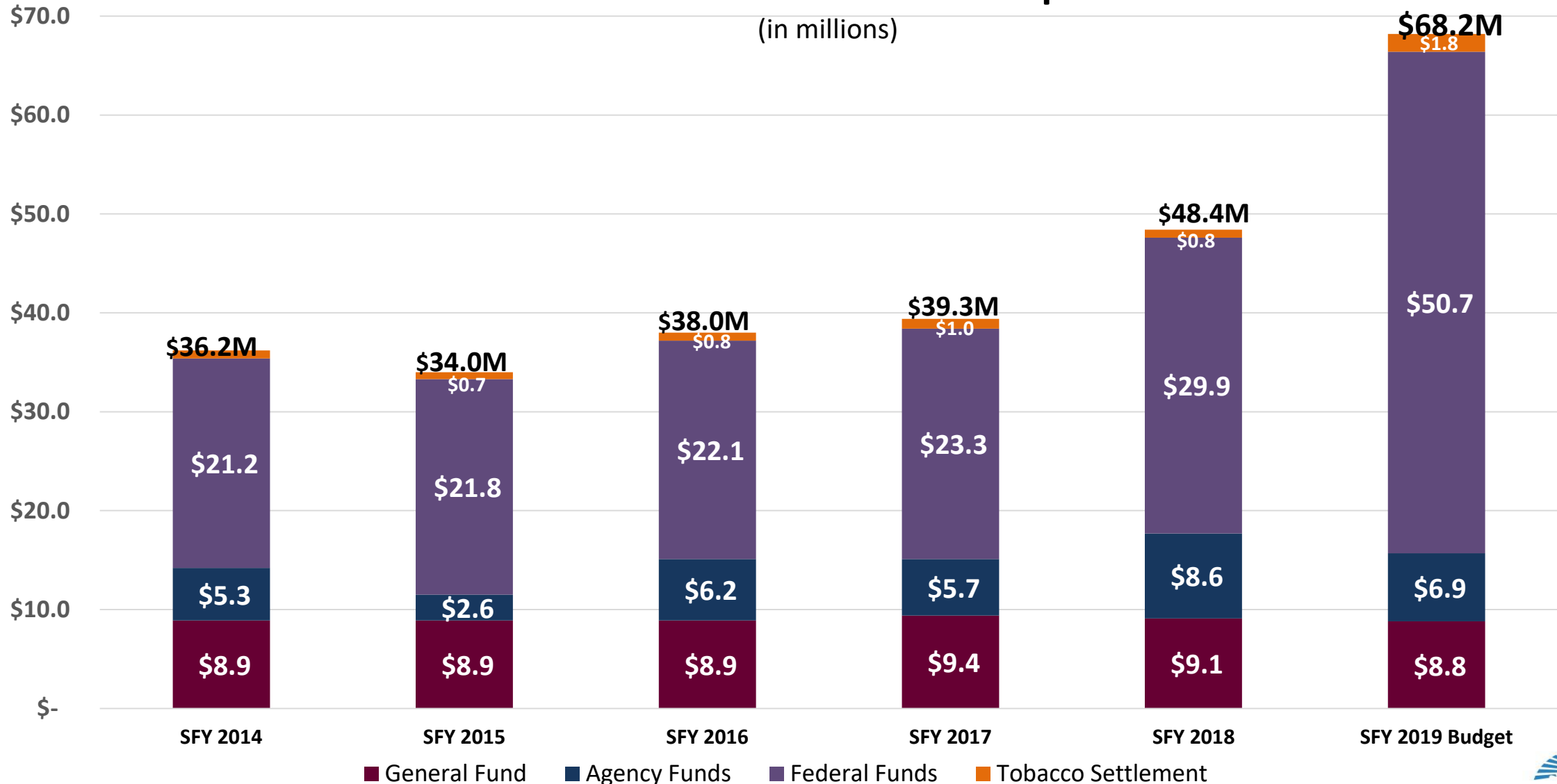

- \$10.5 million

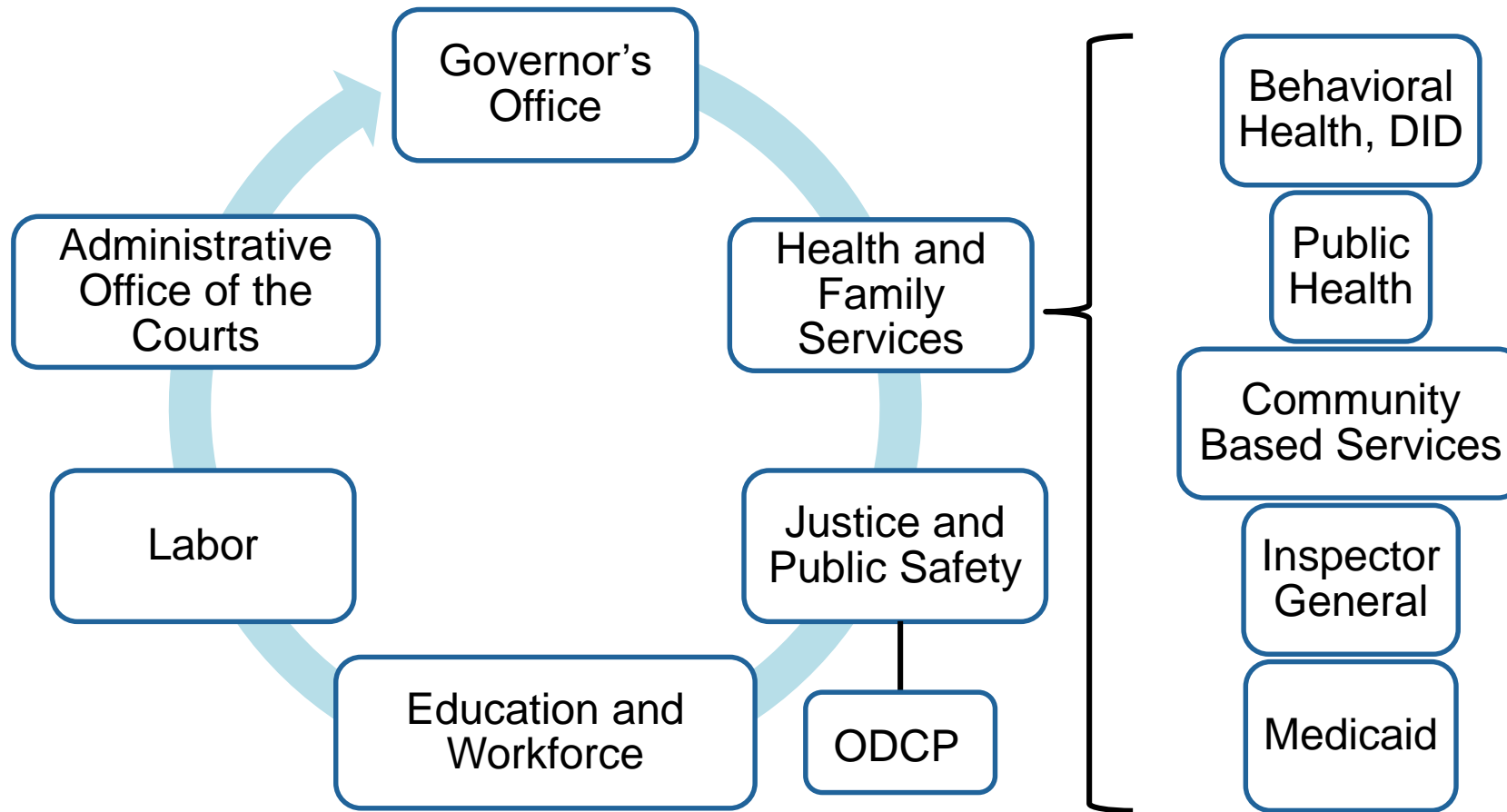
State Opioid Response (SOR) Grant– Year 1

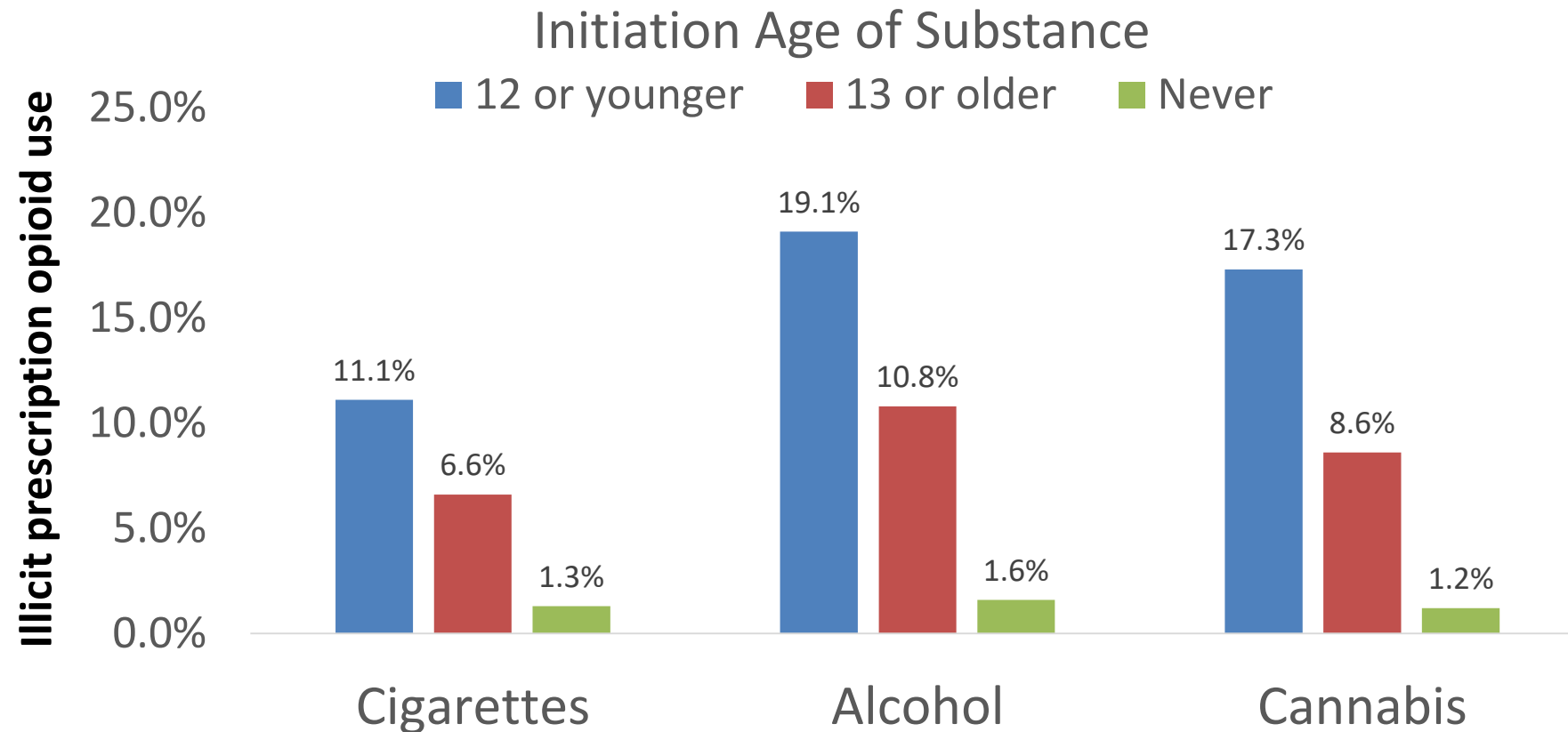

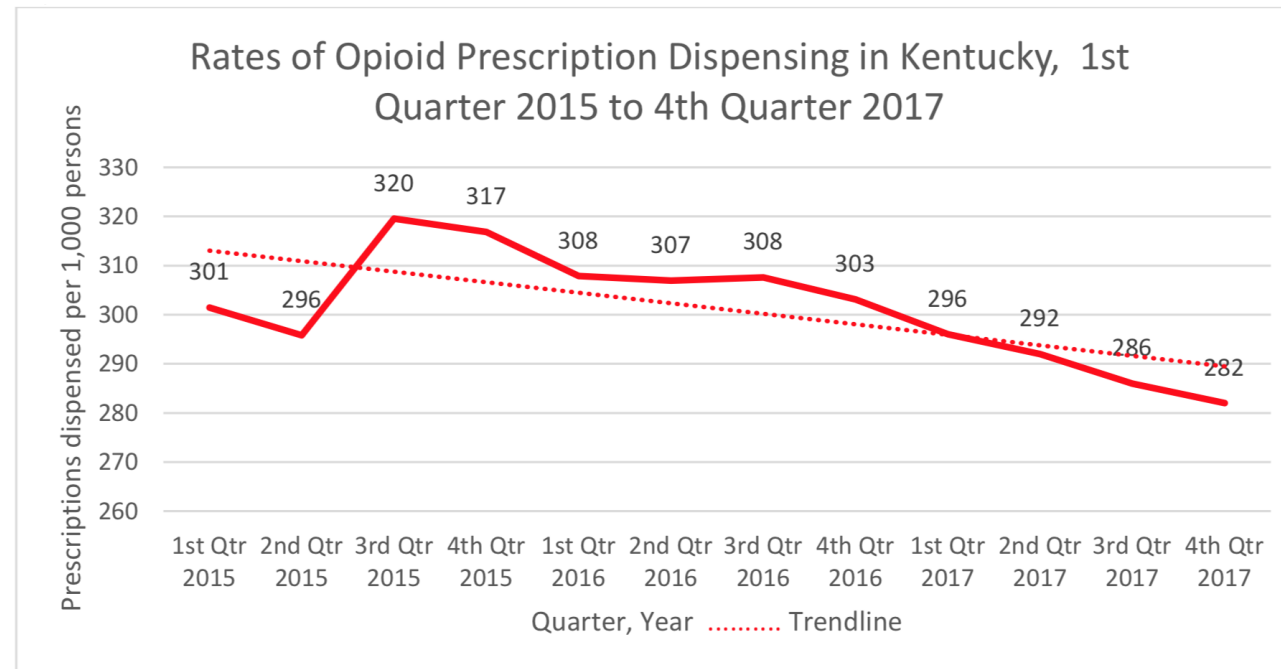


Early Initiation of Substance Use Predicts Current Rx Opioid Use Among 10th Graders



Opioid Stewardship

- Partnership with the Kentucky Hospital Association (KHA) and UK HealthCare (KY-SOS)
- Training and hospital certification to improve prescribing for opioid and non-opioid pain management



Screening, Brief Intervention, Referral to Treatment (SBIRT)

- Screening - quickly assess the severity of substance use and identify the appropriate level of treatment
- Brief intervention - increase insight and awareness regarding substance use and motivation toward behavioral change
- Referral to treatment - provide those needing more extensive treatment with access to specialty care

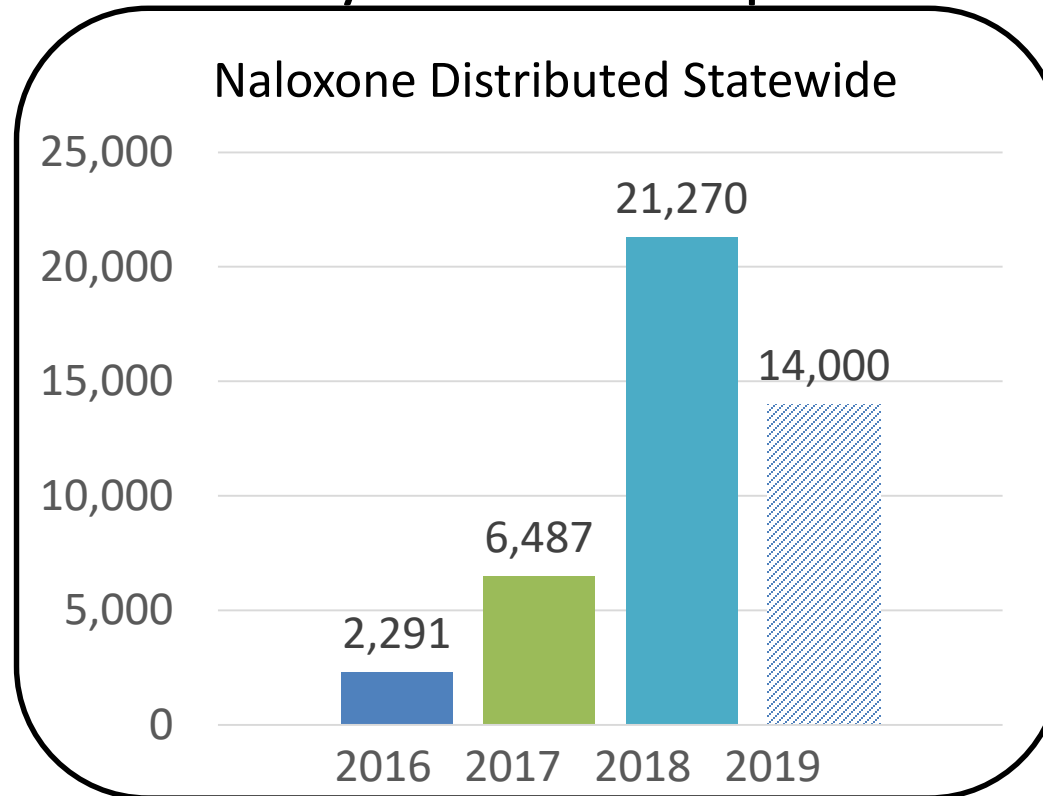

Centralized Naloxone Distribution

Distribution through hospitals, treatment programs, harm reduction and syringe exchange programs (HRSEPs), and community and mobile pharmacies



Treatment Goal:

Ready Access to Quality, Patient-Centered Treatment

- Bridge Clinics
- Treatment Stipend Programs
- Federally Qualified Health Centers – Medication Assisted Treatment
- Coordinated System of Care for Pregnant and Parenting Women

Bridge Clinics

- Conduct emergent assessments
- Initiate FDA-approved medications for OUD, Hepatitis C, and HIV testing
- On-site peer support and/or care coordination
- Overdose prevention training & naloxone
- Link to appropriate levels of ongoing care

Treatment & Methadone Stipend Program

Objective: Increase rapid access to treatment for individuals who lack a payer source

Eligible Programs

- Licensed AODE/BHSO residential programs
- CMHCs with residential and/or intensive outpatient treatment
- Provide access to medications for OUD

Eligible clients

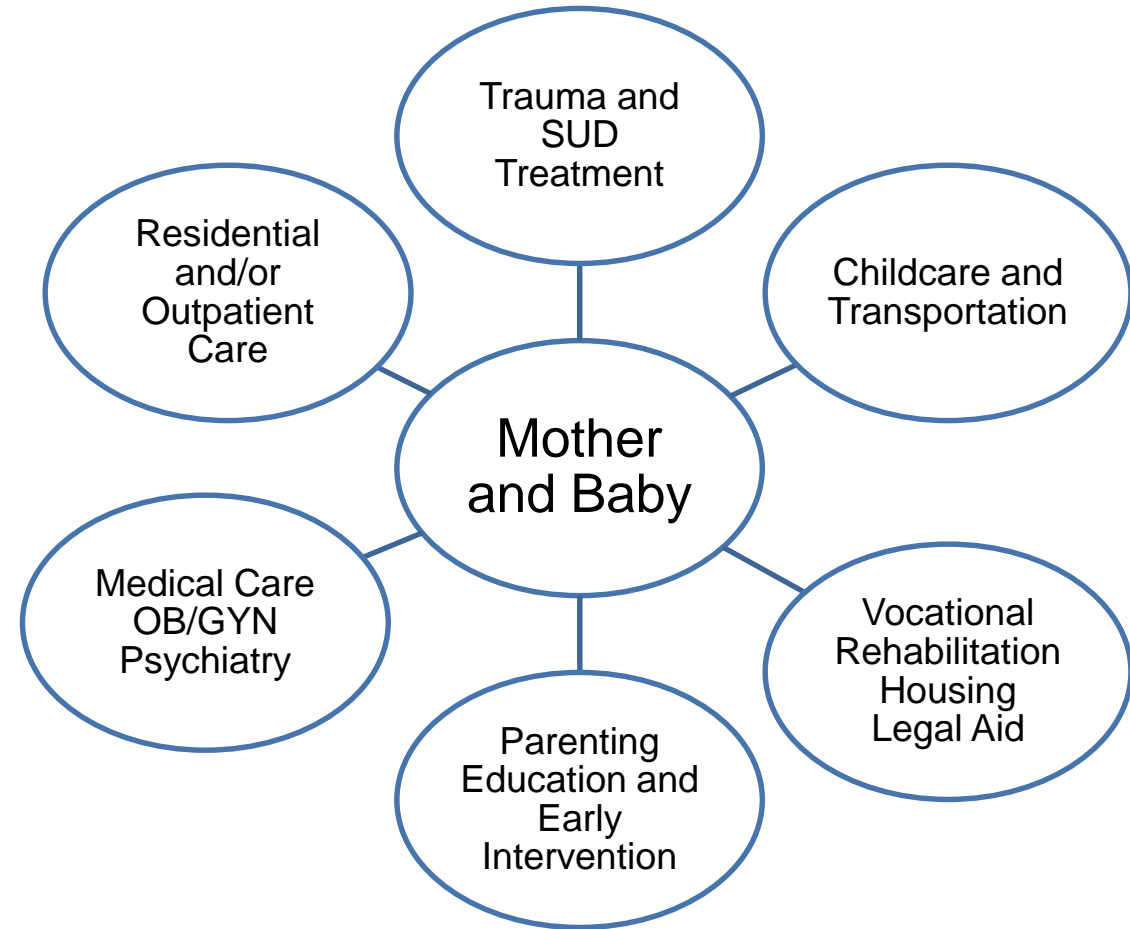
- Diagnosed with an opioid use disorder (OUD)
- Income < 150% federal poverty level

Community-based, non-clinical settings that are safe, welcoming, peer-led, and support all paths to recovery

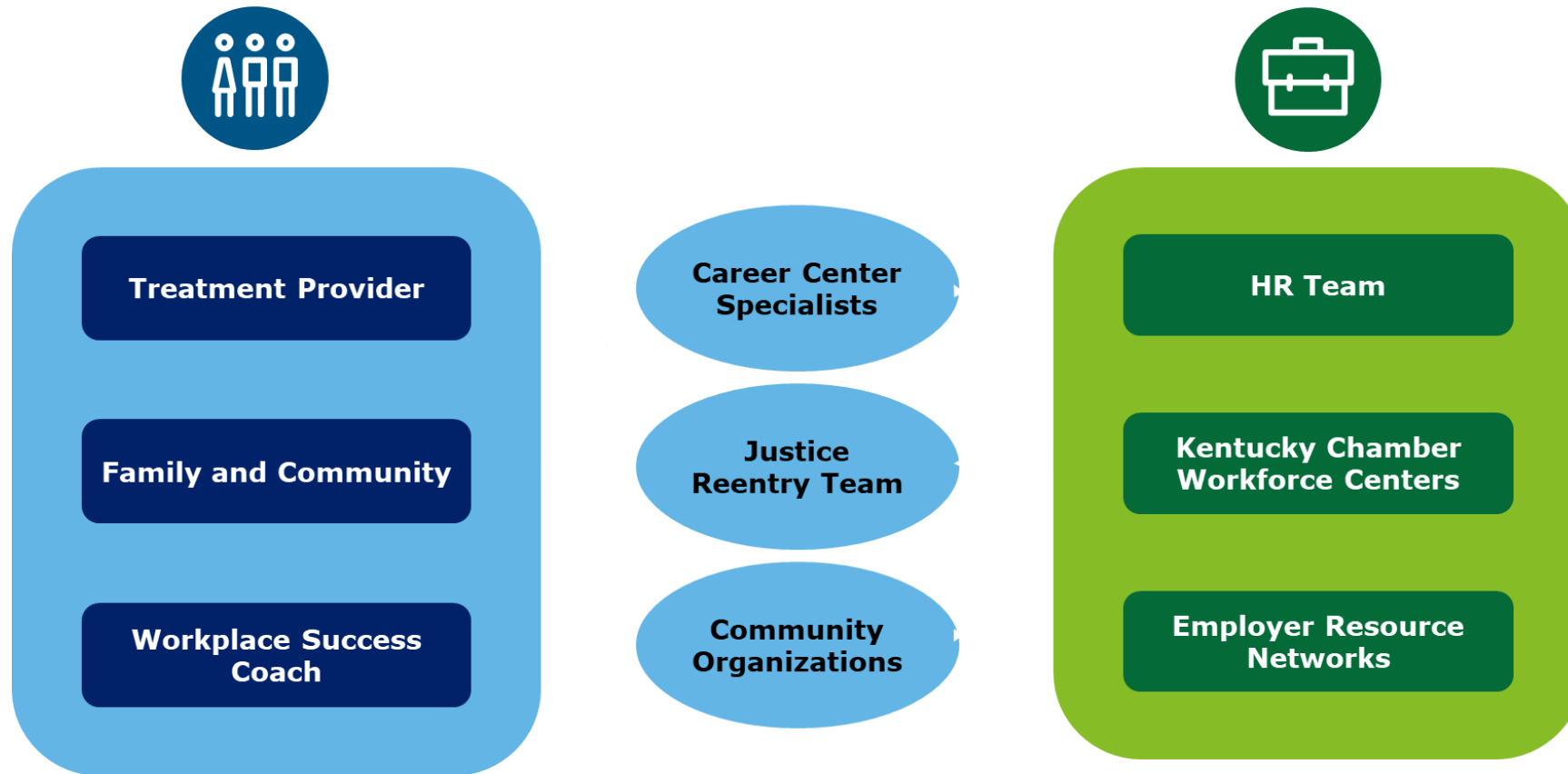

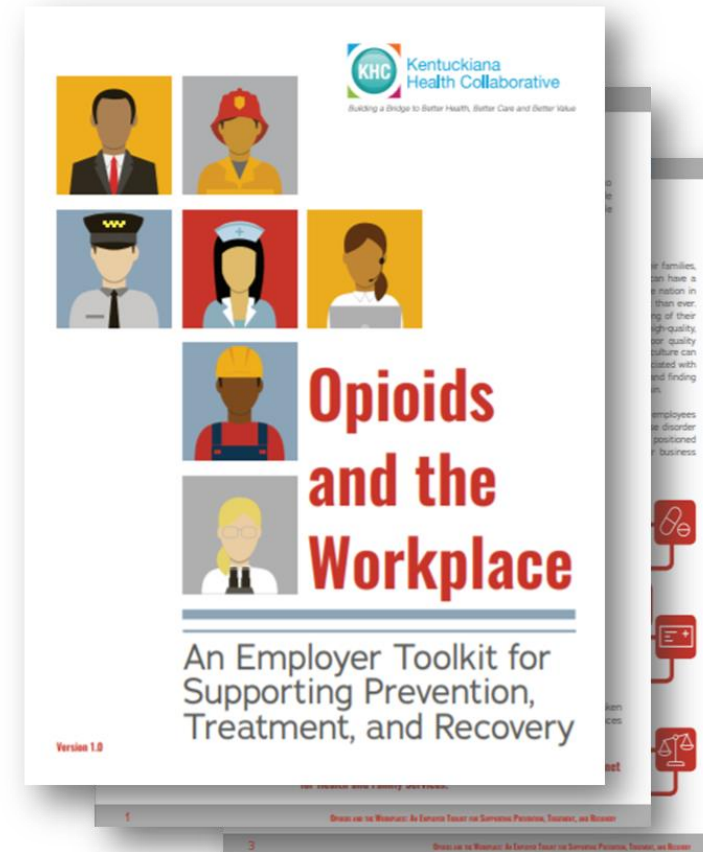
