Families First Coronavirus Response Act – Medicaid*	\$204,160,003
Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act	\$124,070,008
Paycheck Protection Program and Health Care Enhancement Act	<u>\$97,738,054</u>
Total Funds Received	\$436,658,906

Coronavirus Preparedness and Response Supplemental Appropriations Act

Department for Public Health

- Cooperative Agreement for Emergency Response - \$7.5M



Families First Coronavirus Response Act

Department for Aging and Independent Living

- Congregate Meals \$1.1M
- Home Delivered Meals \$2.1M

Department for Medicaid Services

Temporary 6.2% increase to Federal Medical Assistance Percentage



Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act

Department for Aging and Independent Living

- Home and Community Based Supportive Services \$2.7M
- Family Caregivers \$1.3M
- Protection of Vulnerable Older Americans \$269K
- Congregate and Home Delivered Meals \$6.5M
- No Wrong Door System Funding \$750K



Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act

Department for Public Health

- Epidemiology and Laboratory Capacity \$8.3M
- Ryan White HIV/AIDS Part B \$491K

<u>Department for Behavioral Health, Developmental and Intellectual Disabilities</u>

- Medicare Provider Relief Funds \$2.3M
- Mental Health and Substance Use Disorders \$2M
- Suicide Prevention Programs TBD



Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act

Department for Community Based Services

- Child Care and Development Block Grant \$67.7M
- Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program \$13.7M
- Community Services Block Grant \$16.9M
- Child Welfare Services \$733K
- Family Violence Prevention Services \$469K
