Dear Secretary Landrum:

In accordance with KRS 154.12-100, this letter shall serve as notice of my recommendation for the use of \$1,000,000 in Economic Development Bond (EDB) funds for making a grant to the City of Franklin for the benefit of Fritz Winter North America LP (Fritz Winter).

Fritz Winter specializes in iron cast auto parts such as brake rotors, drums, flywheels and more. The company constructed a 240,000 square foot facility in Franklin for the processing, storage and distribution of automotive and commercial products. The proposed EDB grant funds will be used to offset the cost associated with this project.

In consideration of this EDB grant, Fritz Winter will be required to create 265 new, full-time Kentucky resident jobs (excluding contract or temporary employees) in Simpson County in accordance with the following compliance schedule:

Fritz Winter will be required to pay these 265 new jobs an average hourly wage of not less than \$22.00, including benefits.

Under the terms of the EDB grant agreement, disbursement of grant funds will occur after the annual compliance reporting has occurred. The amount of the disbursements will be based on the performance requirements achieved. If Fritz Winter fails to create or maintain the job target as of each compliance date, then the amount of the grant payable after each compliance measurement date will be reduced by the sum of \$1,150 for each new, full-time job not created or maintained by the company at each of the four annual measurement dates. Furthermore, if Fritz Winter fails to pay these new jobs the average hourly wage of \$22.00, including benefits, the amount of the grant payable after each compliance measurement date will be reduced by a pro rata portion of the EDB grant based on a formula to be outlined in the EDB grant agreement.

Any funds repaid to the City of Franklin by Fritz Winter must be used for economic development purposes as approved by the Cabinet for Economic Development (Cabinet). In no event will the repayment of EDB grant proceeds exceed the EDB grant amount of \$1,000,000.

I respectfully request your concurrence in the funding of this project. If KEDFA approves this proposal, I would ask that you place this project on the next agenda of the State Property and Buildings Commission. Please feel free to contact me if you have any questions.
