
Dear Secretary Landrum:

I am writing to inform you that the Kentucky Department of Fish and Wildlife Resources (KDFWR) is reporting a capital project entitled "FILO-Rich Wildlife Management Area (WMA) – Red Oak Creek," identified as account number C71U, to the Capital Projects and Bond Oversight Committee, pursuant to the 2016-2018 biennial budget. The Red Oak Creek project, located in Owen County, Kentucky, was selected due to its degree of impact, likelihood of success, and its proximity to existing protected sites. The Red Oak Creek property is adjacent to the eastern section of the Dr. James R. Rich WMA. This project is providing the state match for KDFWR Wildlife Division's 600-acre addition to the existing WMA. The project on "drainage C" has an estimated project cost of \$2,347,192.00. This includes the design fee for all drainages on the project area: A, B, C, and D. The project will be funded 100% from the "Kentucky Wetland and Stream Mitigation Fund," pursuant to KRS 150.255.

The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, which governs the FILO program, authorized the project to restore and permanently protect 12,475 linear feet of stream. The construction phase of the project is ready to begin. As required by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, the project will fulfill an obligation of 7,514 AMU Advanced Stream Credits purchased from the FILO program in the Lower Kentucky River Service Area.

Pursuant to KRS 45.760, the Secretary of the Finance and Administration Cabinet has approved an appropriation increase in the amount of \$425,054 for a total of \$1,803,151 for the Department of Military Affairs Interior Renovation of Wellman National Guard Armory at Boone National Guard Center in Frankfort, KY capital project. The project is funded with 75% federal funds and 25% State funds from agency restricted funds from the Combined Clothing Distribution Facility (CCDF).

This project was previously report in October 2017 as a new project in the amount of \$1,378,097 funded with 75% federal and 25% restricted funds.

This change order is necessary to replace the communication wiring for the entire building in order to comply with the 2012 National Electric Code. This change order also funds design changes to the infrastructure of the armory to support future processing of sensitive information in a secure open storage environment.

Dear Secretary Landrum:

Authorization is requested, pursuant to KRS 45.760, for approval of a Capital Construction project to renovate the interior of the Wellman National Guard Armory at Boone National Guard Center in Frankfort. The initial appropriation requested was \$1,378,097.00 with 75% federally funded from DoD Cooperative Agreement Army Operations and Maintenance 2017 and 25% state funded from Agency Restricted funds from the Combined Clothing Distribution Facility (CCDF). This request is for an appropriation increase of \$425,054.00. This request will be funded with 75% federally funds from DoD Cooperative Agreement Army Operations and Maintenance 2017 and 25% state funds from Agency Restricted funds from the Combined Clothing Distribution Facility (CCDF).

The project increase consists of (1) code compliance because the existing communication wiring did not meet the current 2012 National Electric Code resulting in the communication wiring to be replaced for the entire building and (2) design changes to meet the current mission requirements and emerging demands for the processing of Personally Identifiable Information (PII) along with operational and threat information that is transmitted at the SECRET level via Secure Internet Protocol Router terminals. The changes in design facilitate the infrastructure to support future processing of sensitive information in a secure open storage environment.
