Dear Secretary Johnson:

Kentucky Educational Television requests approval of a capital construction project for the KET Next Gen Conversion (NGC) to replace end-of-life and failing equipment that will help ensure the technical reliability of the Network Center infrastructure and ready KET for the new broadcast industry standard, NextGenTV (ATSC 3.0). This work will allow KET to continue to produce and distribute instructional and professional development resources that help address learning loss experienced across our state as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic. This project has a total budget of \$11,500,000 to be funded with American Rescue Plan - Elementary and Secondary Schools Emergency Relief Funds and will extend through September 30, 2024.

KET creates and provides curriculum and evidence-based early childhood programming, workforce readiness resources, GED and literacy instruction, after school programs, summer enrichment, professional development and other educational resources that are made available through KET's statewide broadcast network, via KET.org and various streaming platforms. Used by more than one million Kentuckians each week and in every Kentucky public school, KET's trusted services offer significant learning opportunities for teachers, students, families, and learners of all ages. Accessible in homes and online, use of KET's educational programs and services have increased dramatically during the public health emergency over the last 18 months.

KET's broadcast and production equipment is close to 15 years old and rapidly exceeding its end-of-life with equipment failures becoming more frequent – including during live broadcasts. Many of these IT/computer-based systems can no longer run required software applications and cannot be updated with cybersecurity protections. To ensure the technical stability and reliability of the Network Center infrastructure, failing KET systems must be replaced and ready for the new industry standard, NextGenTV (ATSC 3.0), authorized by the FCC in 2017. The new standard makes it easier to receive over-the-air signals with an antenna, enables at-home

learning services, offers customizable audio for the hearing impaired, and allows the broadcast of internet-based content (without an ISP connection).

Pursuant to KRS 45.750(1)(g)(1) the Secretary of the Finance and Administration Cabinet is reporting an amended appropriation in the amount of \$1,800,000 from the Department of Parks Fort Boonesborough Parkwide Flood Reconstruction Project.

This project was originally reported in July 2021 in the amount of \$1,300,000. Project scope has increased to \$1,800,000. The increase in funding has been requested by the Division of Engineering as a result of increasing equipment and material costs and expanded scope resulting from found conditions in damaged infrastructure.

This Project includes site and building restoration and reconstruction efforts resulting from the parkwide flood that occurred early in calendar year 2021. This project will be funded by insurance proceeds.

This is truly a Parkwide Reconstruction Project. Effected buildings and areas include the Recreation Hall, campground area, campground shelters, campground bathhouses, maintenance shop, pole barn, playground areas, and the Beach House. Loss of equipment and site furnishings include tractors, mowers, park benches, fire rings, and various small equipment. Major electrical, plumbing and mechanical restoration will be required throughout the park.

The Tourism Arts and Heritage Cabinet, on behalf of the Kentucky Department of Parks, is requesting an amended project amount for the capital project entitled FB - Parkwide - Flood Reconstruction identified as fund number CA1J previously approved by the Finance and Administration Cabinet and submitted to the Capital Projects and Bond Oversight Committee on July 30.

The project includes parkwide site and building restoration and reconstruction efforts resulting from the early March flood event, is currently under construction and is funded under a cash override authority. Project scope increases have resulted in costs exceeding the original request of \$1,300,000. The current estimated cost of the project is \$1,800,000 with ongoing construction costs. The increase in funding has been requested by the Division of Engineering as a result of increasing equipment and material costs and expanded scope resulting from found conditions in damaged infrastructure.

Kentucky Department of Parks working in conjunction with the Division of Engineering and Contract Administration is coordinating the project funding with The Division of State Risk and Insurance Services and FM Global. The requested increase in funding is still expected to be fully reimbursed by Insurance along with a future request for FEMA related weather event coverage.
