In accordance with the provisions of KRS 45.750-800, the Finance and Administration Cabinet is reporting the attached actions involving:

### New Project - Federal and State Pool Funds

General Government, Department of Military Affairs - DMA Danville Readiness Center Interior Restoration project in the amount of \$2,500,000 funded with \$1,250,000 federal funds and \$1,250,000 General Fund from the National Guard Modernization Pool.

#### Reporting of Pool Project in Excess of \$1,000,000

Department of Education - Kentucky School for the Blind Roofs project in the amount of \$1,760,000 funded from the 2020-2022 bond funded State Schools Roof Replacement Pool account.

Department of Education – Kentucky School for the Deaf Roofs project in the amount of \$1,979,220 funded from the 2022-2024 State Schools Roof Repair and Replacement Pool General Fund account.

### Capital Construction and Equipment Purchase Contingency Account Transfer

A transfer of \$971,800 from the Capital Construction and Equipment Purchase Contingency Account to the Finance and Administration Cabinet, Department for Facilities and Support Services for moving costs. Pursuant to KRS 45.760(7), the Secretary of the Finance and Administration Cabinet has approved a new project in the amount of \$2,500,000 for the Department of Military Danville Readiness Center Interior Restoration Project. This project will be funded with \$1,250,000 National Guard Bureau Minor Construction federal funds and \$1,250,000 general funds from the National Guard Modernization Pool authorized in budget bill (HB 1 from the 2022 Regular Session).

The Danville RC was constructed in 1954. This project will be a complete interior renovation of the facility. This facility requires upgrades to the interior to include latrines, lactation room, HVAC system, lighting, electrical, ATFP windows, flooring, and walls.

The KYARNG plans to station the 223 Military Police Company in this facility after the renovation.

This letter is to inform you that approval has been granted for an allocation of \$971,800 from the Capital Construction and Equipment Purchase Contingency Fund pursuant to KRS 45.770(4). This allocation is for fiscal year 2022 non-recurring moving costs associated with the relocation of staff from the Finance and Administration Cabinet and the Office of State Budget Director from the Capitol Annex building to the Transportation Cabinet Office building in Frankfort. This letter also certifies that the costs are non-recurring and that the bulk of the benefits of the move accrued to the legislative branch. Other benefits were that the Administration was able to efficiently use space in the Transportation Cabinet Office building with accommodation from the Cabinet's leadership and staff. Also, that approach provided an ability to quickly and temporarily use the existing floor configuration given the short timeframe permitted to complete the move, and that obviated any need to resort to leased space. The incurred costs include those associated with moving out of one facility into another and follow-on costs of reconfiguring one floor of the Transportation Cabinet Office building to efficiently occupy the new space.

Pursuant to KRS 45.770(4), the Secretary of the Finance and Administration Cabinet has approved an allocation from the Capital Construction & Equipment Purchase Contingency Fund to cover costs associated with the move of the Finance and Administration Cabinet and the Office of State Budget Director from the Capitol Annex to the Transportation Cabinet Office Building at the direction of the General Assembly.

In July 2021, the Finance Cabinet Secretary received communication from the Legislative Research Commission that it intended to occupy the West Wing of the Capitol Annex and gave the Executive Branch until December 1, 2021 to vacate the building. Despite the short time frame, the Finance Cabinet was able to conduct an extensive examination of both state-owned and leased space. With the cooperation of the Transportation Cabinet, it was determined that Finance Cabinet and Office of State Budget Director staff formerly housed in the Annex would occupy the fifth floor of the Transportation Cabinet Office Building, relocating 170 Executive Branch employees quickly and efficiently. Costs associated with the move include moving supplies, moving services provided by Correctional Industries, technology costs for purchasing and installing audio/visual equipment, and reconfiguration of existing space on the fifth floor.

**SUBJECT:** Finance and Administration Cabinet (FAC) Relocation Allocation Request

Pursuant to KRS 45.770(4), the Finance and Administration Cabinet is requesting an allocation from the Capital Construction and Equipment Purchase Contingency Fund in the amount of \$971,800. This request is for non-recurring fiscal year 2022 moving expenses associated with the relocation of Finance and Administration Cabinet agencies and the Office of State Budget Director (OSBD) from 702 Capitol Avenue to 200 Mero Street at the direction of the General Assembly.

In early July 2021, the Legislative Research Commission notified the Finance and Administration Cabinet of its plan to occupy the West Wing of the Capitol Annex and directed Executive Branch agencies to vacate the Annex by December 1, 2021. The Legislative Branch was the main beneficiary of this move; however, along with our partners in the Transportation Cabinet, the cabinet was able to swiftly respond and relocated over 170 executive branch employees in a short period of time to existing state-owned space.

I certify that these expenses are non-recurring and include modification of the fifth floor of the Transportation Cabinet Office Building to make efficient use of the existing space, moving services provided by Kentucky Correctional Industries, Commonwealth Office of Technology expenses for purchasing and installing audio/visual equipment for conference rooms, and moving supplies.
