In accordance with the provisions of KRS 45.750-800, the Finance and Administration Cabinet is reporting the attached actions involving:

**New Projects – Amendments**

General Government, Department of Military Affairs – Danville Interior Restoration project in the amount of \$2,500,000 amendment to the fund source split from 50% federal and 50% state funds to 75% federal and 25% state funds.

General Government, Department of Military Affairs – Murray Readiness Center appropriation increase in the amount of \$258,300 funded with 50% federal and 50% state funds for a total of \$2,208,300.

General Government, Department of Military Affairs – Jackson Readiness Center Interior Restoration project appropriation increase in the amount of \$566,000 for a revised total of \$2,466,000 funded with 100% federal funds.

**Appropriation Increase – Road Fund**

The fund source will change from 50% federal funds 50% general funds to 75% federal funds 25% state general funds: \$1,875,000 federal funds, \$555,850 state general funds from the National Guard Modernization Pool, \$69,150 investment income funds from the 2020-2022 Maintenance Pool.

This project was originally approved by the Secretary in July 2022 in the amount of \$2,500,000: \$1,250,000 federal funds and \$1,250,000 from the Department's National Guard Modernization Pool.

Pursuant to KRS 45.760(7), the Secretary of the Finance and Administration Cabinet has approved an amendment for the Department of Military Affairs Murray Readiness Center Interior Restoration Project.

This project is 50% federally funded with \$1,104,150 and 50% state funded with \$1,104,150 maintenance pool funds for a total of \$2,208,300. This project was originally approved as 100% federally funded for \$1,950,000 due to the agency requesting full reimbursement under federal COVID guidelines; however, federal funds were not fully awarded.

This project consists of the selective demolition and subsequent renovation of areas in the existing Readiness Center which was originally constructed in 1985.

The demolition work includes the removal of existing windows, latrines, removal and offsite disposal of existing architectural finishes, acoustic ceiling systems, vinyl flooring, and doors required to accommodate new building improvements. The renovation includes installation of new Antiterrorism/Force Protection compliant windows and store front, updating the existing male and female latrines, new hollow metal doors and frames, new door hardware, new acoustic tile ceilings at selected locations, new carpet tile in offices, concrete in hallways, and flooring in existing kitchens and latrines.

In accordance with HB192, Part II, Paragraph 4, the 2020-2022 biennial budget act and HB1, Part II, Paragraph 4, the 2022-2024 biennial budget act, please accept this memorandum as a request to report to CPBOC a capital project greater than \$1,000,000 funded from a pool. The project will make necessary repairs to the CHR building's Central Utility Plant (CUP) in the amount of \$2,816,020.

The Cabinet for Human Resources central utilities plant (CUP) serves electrical power, steam, hot and chilled water to the CHR complex which includes the Cabinet for Human Resources (CHR) Building, Health Services Building (HSB), Commonwealth Office of Technology (COT) and the Jones Building. This project consists of a mechanical renovation to the existing plant that will incorporate controls renovation scope of work. New equipment will be added, and existing equipment will be substantially altered or demolished to achieve the design sequence of operation. This scope will include taking receipt of an owner-furnished boiler system deaerator and condensate surge tank that was purchased by the owner to be installed as part of this project. Additionally, demolition and/or salvage of existing steam boilers is to be performed under this contract.

Due to the RCC kitchen drain lines and its underground sewage system failing, there is immediate need for replacement of the kitchen sewage system which is crucial to provide adequate cooking and proper sanitation. This project includes a temporary kitchen, replacement of drain lines, replacement of grease trap, lift station, and replacement of kitchen floor.

Approval is requested, pursuant to 2022 Regular Session, House Bill 1, Part II, (4) Appropriations for Projects Not Line-Itemized for approval of a new Capital Construction project to repair/replace the Kitchen Drain Line at the Roederer Correctional Complex (RCC). This appropriation request of \$2,406,500 is funded from \$391,500 from C9SN-Maintenance Pool 2020-2022 and \$2,015,000 from CAL5-Maintenance Pool 2022-2024 for a total project estimated costs of \$2,406,500.

The RCC kitchen drain lines and its underground sewage system are failing. This is due to collapsed and severe deterioration that have impeded the floor causing sewage to backup and needs immediate replacement. This serves the kitchen equipment, dining area, restrooms, and kitchen laundry. The RCC kitchen drain lines repair/replacement project includes a temporary kitchen, replacement of drain lines, replacement of the grease trap, lift station, and replacement of kitchen floor. A temporary kitchen is also included in the cost, the temporary kitchen will provide cooking and the ability to continue serving the 3 meals per day to the current inmate population.

RCC's immediate need for replacement of the kitchen sewage system is crucial to provide adequate cooking and proper sanitation for RCC's kitchen.
