In accordance with the provisions of KRS 45.750-800, the Finance and Administration Cabinet is reporting the attached actions involving:

Pool Projects in Excess of \$1,000,000

Type of Action: Appropriation Increase – Federal Funds

Pursuant to KRS 45.760(6)(a)1, the Secretary of the Finance and Administration Cabinet has approved an appropriation increase in the amount of \$300,000 from federal funds for the Upgrade Welding Shop-Big Sandy CTC-Mayo Campus project. This line-item project is authorized in the 2022-2024 appropriation act for \$1,500,000 in Restricted Funds, so this action brings the new total project scope to \$1,800,000.

Due to cost overruns on the construction portion of the project, additional funds are necessary to cover the welding equipment necessary to make the space functional for its intended use. The facility, which has not been upgraded since its construction in the 1960s, will be completely renovated to meet the needs of students.

Report of Capital Project Scope Increase

Kentucky Community and Technical College System

Dear Secretary Johnson:

The Kentucky Community and Technical College System (KCTCS) respectfully requests approval, pursuant to KRS 45.760(6)(a)1, of a capital construction project scope increase for \$300,000 for the Big Sandy Community and Technical College Mayo Campus Welding Upgrades project. The project received authorization in the 2022-2024 budget for \$1,500,000.

The additional funding would provide the total funding necessary for the project to purchase the welding equipment. The project will completely renovate the Mayo Campus welding shop at Big Sandy CTC that has had no facility upgrades since its construction in the 1960s. The shop is outdated and does not meet current OSHA, EPA, and electrical code guidelines. The current facility is inadequate regarding space, ventilation, lighting, and electrical availability.

The additional funding will be funded from federal funds in the amount of \$300,000. The design and construction of the project is being pursued through the Finance and Administration Cabinet. KCTCS Board of Regents will be approving the increase in scope on December 8, 2023.

RE: Request for Appropriation and Allotment for CB8W - RADC - Emergency Nurse Call Replacement

Pursuant to KRS 45.750(1)(g) and 45.780, the Kentucky Department of Veterans' Affairs requests approval of funds in the amount of \$2,421,000 for an Emergency Repair, Maintenance, and Replacement account capital project for RADC (Radcliff Veterans Center) – Emergency Nurse Call Replacement. This request is for the full replacement of the nurse call system.

Currently, the nurse call system is non-functioning in three out of four neighborhoods. The current system in place is now obsolete. During the process of attempting to repair our current system, we were notified by Johnson Controls that the system has been discontinued and all technical support officially ended on April 1, 2023.

RADC has been informed they will receive a deficiency for non-compliance at 42 CFR 483.90 (g)(1) and(g)(2) – Resident Call System. The regulation states "the facility must be adequately equipped to allow residents to call for staff assistance through a communication system which relays the call directly to a staff member or to a centralized staff work area from each resident's bedside; and toilet bathing facilities."

The surveyor guidance for 42 CFR 483.90(g)(1) and (g)(2) states "this requirement is met only if all portions of the system are functioning (e.g., system is not turned off at the nurses' station, the volume too low to be heard, the light above a room or rooms is not working, no staff at nurses' station), and calls are being answered. For wireless systems, compliance is met only if staff who answer resident calls have functioning devices in their possession and are answering resident calls."

RADC has implemented emergency protocols for monitoring veterans care needs until the system can be replaced.
