Subject: Sundry Research, Scientific and Medical Equipment

Dear Senator Girdler, Representative Frazier Gordon and Honorable Members of the Capital Projects and Bond Oversight Committee:

Pursuant to KRS §45.760(5), the University of Kentucky hereby reports the purchase of the following items of medical and research equipment in excess of \$200,000. Money specifically budgeted and appropriated by the General Assembly for another purpose or program was not used to acquire these items.

- An ultra-high performance liquid chromatography triple quadrapole mass spectrometer has been purchased from Agilent for use by the Department of Plant Pathology. This equipment is built for research and targeted analyses of molecular mechanisms. The mass spectrometer provides outstanding performance for targeted peptide, chemical and lipid quantification due to its ultrahigh sensitivity, reproducibility, and robustness. The total cost of the research equipment was \$377,762.75 and was purchased with federal funds from an USDA National Institute of Food and Agriculture grant. The item will be located in the Plant Sciences Building on the UK campus in Lexington, Kentucky.
- An OEC Elite Digital Mobile C-Arm has been purchased from GE Healthcare. The OEC C-Arm is comprised of an x-ray source and an image intensifier which makes the equipment ideally suited to a range of surgical needs including vascular, orthopedics, gastrointestinal, endoscopic, urologic, critical care, pain management and emergency procedures. The enhanced imaging allows physicians to minimize dose and exposure. The total cost of the medical equipment was \$238,986 and was purchased with UK restricted funds. The item will be located at the UK HealthCare Good Samaritan Hospital.
- An EPIQ CVx ultrasound system has been purchased from Philips Healthcare. The
  EPIQ CVx is a dedicated cardiac ultrasound solution which brings significant
  advancements in functionality, delivering better care through higher processing power,
  exceptional imaging and improved exam efficiencies. The system gives clinicians the
  ability to view cardiac structure and function in real-time improving cardiac anatomy
  analysis. The EPIQ CVx systems will expand services to cover additional volume in UK
  HealthCare's Gill Heart Institute. The total cost of the medical equipment was \$211,044
  and was purchased with UK restricted funds. The item will be located at UK HealthCare
  Albert B. Chandler Hospital.

Dear Senator Girdler, Representative Frazier Gordon, and Members of the Capital Projects and Bond Oversight Committee:

At its June 13, 2024 meeting, the University's Board of Trustees approved the initiation of the Improve Campus Parking and Transportation System and Improve Johnson Center Capital Project and authorized the Executive Vice President for Finance and Administration to negotiate and execute all documents necessary to create a viable Public-Private-Partnership (P-3). This project has two components: one component will expand an existing parking structure (Parking Structure #7) by an estimated 1,200 parking spaces which is located on South Campus adjacent to Complex Drive and Sports Center Drive. The second component will include a connected expansion of the adjacent Johnson Center recreation facility, with additional improvements to student recreation fields and greenspaces. The Board approved this capital project with a scope not to exceed \$115,000,000 using a P3 construction delivery method as such is in the best interest of the University.

The 2024 Session of the Kentucky General Assembly authorized the Improve Campus Parking and Transportation System capital project pool and the Improve Johnson Center capital project. The Improve Campus Parking and Transportation System pool is authorized for a total scope of \$200,000,000 of which \$100,000,000 is other funds. The Improve Johnson Center Capital Project is authorized for a total scope of \$75,000,000 in agency bonds. The University is reporting the consolidation of these two projects for a total scope of \$115,000,000 and the transfer of \$75,000,000 from agency bonds to other funds pursuant to KRS §45.760(6) for the budgeted project. As this project proceeds the University will comply with the provisions of KRS Chapters 45 and 45A as they relate to P3 projects.

# IMPROVE CAMPUS PARKING AND TRANSPORTATION SYSTEM (SOUTH CAMPUS PARKING STRUCTURE AND RECREATION SPACE) CAPITAL PROJECT

<u>Recommendation</u>: that the Board of Trustees approve the initiation of the Improve Parking and Transportation System (South Campus Parking Structure and Recreation Space) capital project and authorize the Executive Vice President for Finance and Administration to negotiate and execute all documents necessary to create a viable Public-Private-Partnership (P-3).

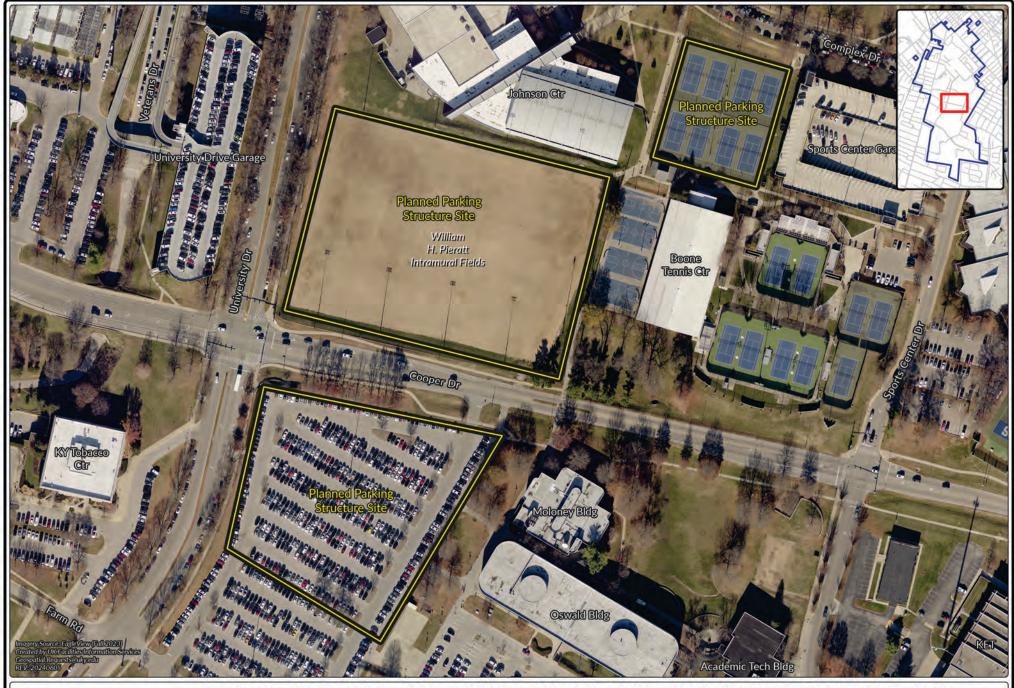
<u>Background</u>: Pursuant to Administrative Regulation 8:2, any capital project with an estimated cost of \$1,000,000 or more must be approved by the Board prior to initiation.

The University must address the pending loss of over 1,100 parking spaces due to the construction of the Forage Animal Production Laboratory by the United States Department of Agriculture in a portion of the current Orange Parking Lot and the planned expansion of the Albert B. Chandler Hospital (Patient Care Facility Expansion). While the Patient Care Facility Expansion project will include structured parking specifically for increased patient and visitor demands, additional structured parking will be needed primarily for UK HealthCare employees.

The planned new parking structure is estimated to accommodate approximately 1,200 vehicles and will be located on South Campus adjacent to University Drive and Cooper Drive. Additionally, the University is exploring the expansion of existing recreational spaces for South Campus as part of this P-3 project. Thus, this project will include a new parking structure and possibly the improvement and expansion of the Johnson Center recreation facility, student recreation fields and greenspaces.

The project is not expected to exceed \$115,000,000 and has been authorized by the 2024 Kentucky General Assembly. The project will be funded with third-party financing as a Public-Private Partnership pursuant to KRS Chapter 45A.

#### Secretary Johnson:

In accordance with KRS 48.111(6)(c), this letter serves as formal notification that the Capital Projects and Bond Oversight Committee, during its meeting on November 19, 2024, did not approve the proposed new lease submitted by the Division of Real Properties.

Specifically, Agenda Item 5.A.1., titled New Lease – Cabinet for Health and Family Services, Department for Community-Based Services, Harlan County, PR-5800, was not approved.

The Committee raised the following concerns regarding the accepted bid proposal:

- 1. The selected bid was \$114,931.50 higher, or 76% more, than the lowest bid received, despite the square footage requirements being met.
- 2. The decision to pursue new construction, despite the availability of existing structures within that geographic area.

In accordance with provisions of KRS 45.750(1)(f)(1), KRS 164A.600, the 2024 Acts of the Kentucky General Assembly Chapter 175, Part II, Section 4 and Sub-section I, Sub-part 3; Eastern Kentucky University (EKU), is reporting the following project budget items for several new FY24-26 Asset Preservation Pool capital projects. All reported projects were originally approved by the EKU Board of Regents and the Council on Postsecondary Education:

#### Demolish Building Assessment Pool

This project was originally included in the EKU FY24-26 biennial budget request under a slightly different title. This project will support planning and estimates for potential demolition of sites and structures no longer feasible to maintain and is budgeted for \$1,000,000.

Previously, this line was developed anticipating the need to demolish the Hummel Planetarium. Recently the EKU Board of Regents voted to renovate the facility which requires a budget adjustment for a new Asset Preservation renovation item; this Demolish Building line will remain for future budgeting purposes at a revised balance of \$0.

#### Renovate Hummel Building

This facility previously housed a Planetarium service and theater original to the facility since construction in 1976. Recent, accelerating, exigent deterioration of the brick exterior resulted in the need to evaluate renovation versus demolition. The Board voted in November to renovate the facility for academic course use. The estimate for the renovation expenses is \$1,000,000.

The Kentucky Community and Technical College System (KCTCS) respectfully requests the reporting to the Capital Projects and Bond Oversight Committee of two capital projects in excess of \$1,000,000 from the Asset Preservation Pool within the 2022-2024 enacted budget. The first project is the Jefferson Community and Technical College Safety and Security Upgrades. The total scope is \$3,000,000 and will be funded with 2022-2024 asset preservation funds in the amount of \$2,608,800 and KCTCS agency funds in the amount of \$391,200. The second project is the Somerset Community College Renovate or Replace Laurel South Campus. The total scope is \$3,000,000 for design only and will be funded with 2022-2024 asset preservation funds in the amount of \$2,608,800 and KCTCS agency funds in the amount of \$391,200.

The reporting of these projects to the Committee is pursuant to Part II, I., (1) of the 2022-2024 Commonwealth Budget.

The design and construction of these projects is being implemented through KCTCS Facilities Support Services Capital Construction Division. KCTCS Board of Regents and CPE have approved the projects.
