KYTC/Office of Transportation Delivery (OTD)

OTD is comprised of two Branches

- Public Transit Branch
 - Federal Transit Grants
 - Rural → Population less than 50,000
 - Small Urban → Population between 50,000-199,999
 - Large Urban → Population 200,000 or more
- Human Services Transportation Delivery Branch (HSTD)
 - Non-Emergency Medical Transportation (NEMT)
 - Office of Vocational Rehabilitation
 - Blind Services Division
 - Department of Corrections (Pilot)



Public Transit Branch

- Secure statewide federal transit grants
 - Federal Transit Administration (FTA)
 - Formula Funding: 5305, 5339, 5310, 5311 \$28 million
 - Competitive Funding: 5339(b) Additional \$7 million in FY19
- Match for grants
 - State General Fund \$1.7 million
 - Toll Credits \$5.4 million utilized as match in 2018
- Non-Public School Transportation Funds \$3.5 million

Public Transit Branch

- FY19 Statewide Statistics
 - Over 25 Million trips provided
 - Over 84.5 Millions miles driven
- Accomplishments
 - 5 State Management Reviews (15 straight years) with Zero findings from FTA
 - Partnership with the KY Department of Veterans Affairs



- Non-Emergency Medical Transportation is for Medicaid members who do not have access to free transportation that suits their medical needs and need to be transported to a medically necessary, Medicaid-covered service.
- Coordinated through the Department for Medicaid Services and the Transportation Cabinet and NOT under Managed Care Organizations.

HSTD Branch – How the Dollars Flow

- Agreements
 - Annual Agreements between Partners/Transportation Cabinet
 - Transportation Cabinet with Finance Cabinet
 - Annual Agreements with Transportation Broker
 - Transportation Broker
 - Agreement Subcontractor

HSTD Branch – Who is Eligible?

- Must be a KY Medicaid Recipient
- Traveling to or from a Medicaid covered service
- The medical service is determined to be medically necessary
- Free transportation which is appropriate for the recipient's medical needs is not available or use of an appropriate and operational household vehicle is not available



HSTD Branch - Vehicle in the Household Exceptions

- Medical Statement
 - Valid for 6 months and can be renewed
- Work/School Statement
 - Valid for 3 months and can be renewed
- Mechanic Statement
 - Valid for 30 days; may submit up to 3 per year
- Officially Cancel or Junk the Vehicle at the County Clerk's Office

Hours of Operation

- Reservation Line is available Monday Friday from 8:00am –
 4:30pm; and on Saturday 8:00am-1:00pm.
- Transportation Services are provided Monday Friday from 6:00am – 8:00pm; and on Saturday 8:00am-1:00pm.
- Services are closed on New Year's Day, Memorial Day, July 4th, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day, and Christmas Day.

- 72 Hour Notice Required
- Urgent Care Transportation (available 24/7)
- Medical Service Area
- Closest Available Medical Facility



HSTD Branch - Broker Responsibilities

- Serve as Gatekeepers
 - Verify the recipient's eligibility
 - Assess the recipient's need
 - Educate the recipients
 - Determine the appropriate transportation
 - 02 Regular Taxi Service (Ambulatory)
 - 03 Fixed Route Bus System
 - 04 Non-profit demand response bus service
 - 07 Ambulatory but disoriented
 - 08 Non-ambulatory who needs physical assistance

HSTD Branch - Broker Responsibilities

Serve as Monitors

- Vehicle maintenance, inspection and operation
- Driver qualifications and training, drug and alcohol testing
- Complaint tracking, courteous, safe and timely services

HSTD Branch – Customer Satisfaction

- 1-800 Line (State & Regional Level)
- Complaint Tracking (State & Regional Level)
- 3,462,963 Million Medicaid Trips (SFY 18)
- 12,889 Denials Issued for Ineligible Trips (SFY 18)
- Monthly Phone Surveys
 - 100% Customer Satisfaction (SYF 18)





HSTD Branch - New Services Provided Under NEMT

- Transport released inmates from correctional facility to residential substance abuse program.
- Methadone Treatment Substance Use Disorder
 - for Medication Assisted Treatment
 - Only transport to approved Narcotic Treatment Programs (NTPs)
 - Pregnant
 - Children (ages 16-18)
 - Former Foster Children (up to age 26)

HSTD Branch - Upcoming Partnership Initiatives

HSTD Branch - Upcoming Partnership Initiatives

- Department of Corrections Pilot Partnership
 - Anticipated to begin October 1, 2019
 - Eastern Kentucky, LaGrange, Pennyrile/Purchase Areas
- Approximate participant base of 50,000 citizens statewide
- Transport those on probation or parole to substance abuse facilities, medical appointments, job interviews, probation/parole meetings, etc.
- Partnership goal is to assist citizens in overcoming barriers leading to a decrease in recidivism and will be one additional tool in Kentucky's continued fight against the opioid epidemic.
