- 4 Notwithstanding the provisions of KRS 61.870 to 61.884, when the Department of (1) Revenue has completed action on the assessment of property in any county and has 5 6 certified the assessment to the county clerk of that county, as provided for in KRS 7 133.180, the property tax roll, or a copy of the property tax roll, shall be retained in 8 the office of the property valuation administrator for maintenance as an open public 9 record for five (5) years. - 15 (9) The council shall have no funds of its own, and council members shall not receive 16 compensation of any kind from the council.
- (10) A majority of the members shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.

- Section 5. The coordination of annual updates by the Department of Revenue required in subsection (3) of Section 1 of this Act shall begin July 1, 2023.
