



Election Legislation (By the Numbers)








Voter ID Laws







FL: Free IDs for those with financial hardship

ME: Added tribal IDs

NH: Established provisional voting

UT: Required ID when voting if not provided at registration






Automated Voter Registration










Early In-Person Voting







- NJ, RI, SC, WY: Allowed absentee/mail processing to begin sooner
- IN, SC: Added additional ID requirements
- NJ: Created permanent absentee list
- RI, WV: Authorized electronic ballots for some voters



Finetuning Absentee/Mail Voting (2022 Enactments)







- 45 states have some kind of ballot tracking system
- AZ, MI, NY: Authorized ballot tracking systems in 2022



- CO: Prohibited open carry within 100 feet
- MI: Required drop boxes
- MO: Prohibited drop boxes
- UT: 24-hour surveillance
- WA: Prohibited electioneering within 25 feet




Ballot Drop Boxes
Enactments in 2022



- 24 states allow voters to cure their ballots
- LA: Created ballot cure process in 2022



Ballot Cure Processes





CA: In exit process, voter registration information is offered

MA: Requires prison staff to assist in voter registration requesting absentee/mail ballot for those are not yet convicted felons but are incarcerated

Felon Voting—2022







In 2021: AZ, AR, FL, GA, ID, IN, KS, ND, OH, TN & TX prohibited, limited or regulated the use of private funds in elections

In 2022: AL, KY, MS, MO, OK, PA, SD, UT, VA & WV did the same



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Foundational – registration was the original way states verified voter status

States must follow federal law

The list is never perfect



- Minors reach 18
- People become citizens
- People pass away
- Voters move and don't update their voter registration or even address with Post Office





National Voter Registration Act (1993)


- Requires DMV registration option
- Maintenance must be completed 90 days before Election Day
- Sets standards for voter registration deadlines and list maintenance



Federal Voter List Maintenance Requirements



- Death Records
- Prison Records
- National Change of Address
- O ERIC
- Jury Lists
- O Voter's Request—of course!



Data Sources to Check



Legislative Options for List Maintenance





Require activities more frequently



Compare data with other sources, states



Require regular reports to legislature



Create online removal tool for voters

Post-Election Audits








- Goal: To check paper ballots or records against the results produced by the voting system
- o Two main types:
 - Traditional: Set number of ballots audited
 - Risk-limiting: Number of ballots audited is statistically based, dependent on closeness of race




- Audit efficiently—may need fewer ballots to review
- Verifies that equipment counted correctly
- If done before certification, can correct errors in vote tabulation

- Proof of citizenship for registration requirements
- Confirm what ID used at DMV—birth certificate, naturalization papers
- Checking jury lists, other state lists
- Prohibiting non-citizens
 voting in local elections

 protocols from FOIA requests
- Require regular cyber reports
- Create "cyber navigators"
