

1 AN ACT relating to voter registration.

2 *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky:*

3 ➔SECTION 1. A NEW SECTION OF KRS CHAPTER 116 IS CREATED TO
4 READ AS FOLLOWS:

- 5 *(1) The Secretary of State, in cooperation with the State Board of Elections, shall*
6 *issue a comprehensive status report regarding voter registration records cleanup*
7 *activities on a quarterly basis to the Interim Joint Committee on State*
8 *Government and shall also make the report available to the public on their*
9 *respective official websites.*
- 10 *(2) The report shall be sorted by county and shall contain every address in each*
11 *county that lists a registered voter and the number of voters registered at that*
12 *address. Any personal identifying information shall be redacted, and any persons*
13 *residing at those addresses may not be contacted about their registration except*
14 *by mail. The Secretary of State and State Board of Elections shall provide a*
15 *publicly available link on their official websites for citizens to report anomalies or*
16 *discrepancies.*
- 17 *(3) The report shall include:*
- 18 *(a) Any activities to resolve reported anomalies per address, such as a high*
19 *number of people living at a single-family home address, voters registered at*
20 *a commercial location, or voters registered at an address that is a vacant lot;*
- 21 *(b) Incidents of multiple people registered at the same address with the same*
22 *age that have minor variations in the spelling of the name and the status of*
23 *the resolution of those duplicates;*
- 24 *(c) The quantity and quality of voter registration records cleanup activities,*
25 *which shall include comparisons to other state and federal records by*
26 *address, such as operator's license renewal records, state and federal*
27 *benefit recipient records, Social Security records, and the National Change*

- 1 of Address database maintained by the United States Postal Service;
2 (d) The number of voter eligibility changes, which shall include relocation out
3 of state, death, incarceration, expungement, and citizenship status changes;
4 (e) The use of any national voter registration clearinghouse system to remove
5 inaccurate or fraudulent registrations, and the quantity and cost of any
6 efforts to register unregistered voters as a result of a state contract with that
7 clearinghouse; and
8 (f) The number of people added and removed from the voter registration
9 records which shall be broken down by party registration and county.
10 (4) Citizens of each county shall have in-person access to the report at the county
11 clerk's office, as well as online access via the Secretary of State's official website,
12 to verify that his or her address is not being used fraudulently by other registered
13 voters as the address of record. Any discrepancies may be reported via the
14 publicly available link on the Secretary of State's and State Board of Elections'
15 official websites.
