








Current Airport Maintenance Funds Projects FY 2019




Airport Maintenance Funds Projects FY 2017 - 2019






All State Funded Airport Projects FY 2017 - 2020

Additional Airport Funding

- \$3.5 million in federal apportionment (Requires 10% state/local match)
- Every FAA classified airport in Kentucky receives at least \$150,000 per year
 - Our 50 classified airports bring in more than \$11 million per year for projects
 - These funds are provided to the local airport board by the FAA
 - These funds require a 10% match. The state provides 7.5% of that match
- Kentucky airports can ask for federal discretionary funding
- The FAA provided an additional \$1.7 million grant to Lexington-Blue Grass
