2nd Meeting

February 24, 2020

The House Budget Review Subcommittee on Transportation of the House Standing Committee on Appropriations and Revenue held its second meeting of the 2020 Regular Session on February 24, 2020, at 2:00 PM, in Room 131 of the Capitol Annex. The Chair called the meeting to order, and the secretary called the roll.

Approval of Minutes

Chair Santoro called for a motion to approve the minutes of the February 18, 2020 meeting. Motion was made by Representative Fugate, seconded by Representative Huff, and the minutes were approved without objection.

Public Transportation

Mr. Perez provided an overview of the Office of Transportation Delivery and its budgetary issues.

In response to a question from Chair Santoro regarding the amount of the federal grant for LexTran, Mr. Perez said they had been granted \$2.4 million in discretionary funds.

Department of Aviation

Mr. Bloch provided an overview of the Department of Aviation and its budgetary issues.

In response to a question from Chair Santoro regarding pavement maintenance, Mr. Bloch said it is still a significant need.

In response to a question from Representative Sims, Mr. Bloch said the drone port is located in Hazard between Knott and Perry Counties, and is not owned by the state, therefore nothing has been budgeted for it.

In response to a question from Representative Upchurch regarding the \$9 million bond in 2020, Mr. Bloch said not all of that has been spent, but there is a list of projects that will use those funds, and they are all accounted for.

In response to a question from Chair Santoro, Mr. Bloch said when airport lighting is replaced, it is being converted to LED.

Mr. Bloch said investment in airports would benefit community growth, which is very important in Kentucky. He said Thursday is Aviation Aerospace Day and there will be a unique opportunity to see the only World War I fighter plane left in existence during a big event to be held in Bowling Green on May 16 and 17, 2020.

Kentucky Infrastructure Coalition

Ms. Watts, Mr. Dieruf, Mr. Turner, and Mr. Moore provided information regarding the possibility of raising the motor fuels tax to help fund transportation infrastructure.
