


FEMA REIMBURSEMENT

- It requires enormous amounts of documentation




HISTORICAL MOTOR FUELS TAX REVENUES


COMPARING KENTUCKY'S GASOLINE TAX

Highway construction costs have increased by > 25% since 2015










Figure 11. Freezing Rain (Ice) accumulation from February 9-11 2021




Figure 12. Accumulation of Snow, Sleet, and Freezing Rain February 14-15 2021




Figure 13. Snowfall Accumulation February 17-18 2021

CLEARING A PATH THROUGH ICE AND SNOW

KYTC snowfighters worked around the clock investing *MORE THAN \$30 MILLION:*

- Removing snow and ice from the roadways
- Clear fallen trees and debris from the roadway
- Providing access to critical infrastructure



PROTECTING THE TRAVELING PUBLIC

DEVASTATING WEATHER IMPACTS:

- 500+ locations statewide impacted by high water and/or landslides
- Full extent of damage unknown as there are still locations which cannot be assessed
- Long-term impacts from flooding include:
 - Reduced life of roadway pavements
 - Clogged pipes which require cleaning
 - Roadway ditches need to be re-established



SUPPORTING LOCAL COMMUNITIES

KYTC worked has worked with the KY Division of Emergency Management to fulfill local needs:
