

FAST FACTS


- Yearly 2022-23 Budget \$3.77 BILLION

KYTC snowfighters:

- Maintain passable roads during snow and ice events
- Clear fallen trees and debris on state roadways
- Maintain access to critical services

Year-round, KYTC crews perform duties to minimize flood damage


- Clear clogged pipes and ditches

Debris Removal FAST FACTS:

- Nearly 490,000 tons of debris collected
- 615 miles of streams cleared of debris that threatens infrastructure, health and safety






EASTERN KENTUCKY FLOOD 2022 Chavies School Road in PERRY COUNTY


