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Commercial Kitchen, Farmers Market Improvements, Community Gardens Among Twenty-Eight Agricultural Investments Approved

More than \$2 million invested in Kentucky Agricultural Development Funds

FRANKFORT, Ky. (June 15, 2018) – The Kentucky Agricultural Development Board approved \$2,034,628 in 28 agricultural diversification and rural development projects across the Commonwealth at its monthly board meeting.

State Investments:

Sale Ring

Casey County Cattlemen's Association, Inc. was approved for up to \$8,000 in Casey County funds, as well as additional county funds matched with state funds not to exceed one half of the project costs, to purchase panels and a sale ring. Commercial Kitchen

On-Farm Investments

The County Agricultural Investment Program (CAIP) offers 11 investment areas that give Kentucky agricultural producers the ability to increase net farm income, add value to their products and diversify their operation. CAIP benefits and enhances agriculture across the state by stimulating markets for Kentucky agricultural products. Twelve CAIPs were approved by the board totaling \$1,659,378 for Adair (\$151,000), Anderson (\$106,000), Carlisle (\$93,450), Carroll (\$101,462), Grant (\$155,000), Grayson (\$120,000), Hancock (\$79,908), Harrison (\$243,005), Laurel (\$157,850), Mercer (\$168,053), Nelson (\$107,650) and Russell (\$176,000) counties.

In addition to these new approvals, an additional \$221,500 was approved to enhance an existing CAIP in Lee (\$32,900), Owsley (\$107,900), Powell (\$7,000) and Wayne (\$102,700) counties.

Environmental Stewardship

The Deceased Farm Animal Removal Program serves as a measure to facilitate the coordination of environmentally sound and cost effective disposal of deceased livestock for Kentucky producers. Four Deceased Farm Animal Removal Programs totaling \$26,875 were approved for Madison (\$7,500), Mercer (\$7,500), Nelson (\$7,500) and Russell (\$4,375) counties.

Shared-use Equipment Program

The Shared-use Equipment Program assists broad-based community organizations with the purchase of farm equipment. The equipment purchased is made available for producer use in a specific county on a leased basis. One Shared-use Equipment Program totaling \$2,625 was approved for Marion County.

Youth Agricultural Incentives Program

The Youth Agricultural Incentives Program serves as a measure to facilitate the growing need for a specialized program that benefits youth actively engaged in agriculture. One Youth Agricultural Incentives Program totaling \$26,250 was approved for Adair County.

FUNDING REQUEST

Seedleaf, Inc. is requesting \$2,500 in Fayette County funds for a community garden.

APPLICATION SUMMARY

The applicant's community farm is located on two acres of land and will serve as a space to educate, empower and inspire those wanting to grow food in north Lexington. The garden is located where residents are at a higher risk of hunger and have limited access to fresh, nutritious food.

The total cost of the project is estimated at \$28,150 with funding from the following sources:

PROJECTED PRODUCER IMPACT

The applicant indicates that the garden will serve more than 200 people and provide up to 500 pounds of harvest.

Committee Recommendation:

The White Application Review Committee recommends funding the request for \$2,500 in Fayette County funds subject to the terms and conditions below:

- 1. Funds up to \$2,500 shall be available upon the execution of the Legal Agreement in the form of a cost-reimbursement grant.
- 2. Funds shall be disbursed upon the Recipient submitting itemized receipts/invoices and either a copy of a cancelled check or a copy of the relevant credit card statement as proof of payment. Cash purchases shall not be eligible for cost-reimbursement. The Recipient may request reimbursement for expenses up to 12 months from the date of the executed Legal Agreement and shall be returned to the Agricultural Development Fund. The reimbursement rate shall be \$.50 per dollar of approved documented expenses.
- 3. The Recipient shall submit an annual report detailing the number of participants and the types and amount of produce grown. For educational programs, the Recipient shall include the number of workshops/events held and the number of attendees.

FUNDING REQUEST

The Lincoln County Fiscal Court is requesting \$12,350 in Lincoln County funds to enhance the existing farmers market facility.

APPLICATION SUMMARY

The applicant indicates that the funding will enhance its existing facility by paving and striping the parking lot and driveway along with increasing signage leading into the facility.

The total cost of the project is estimated at \$24,700 with funding from the following sources:

\$ 7,500 KADF Lincoln County funds (secure)

\$17,200 Lincoln County Fiscal Court (secure)

PROJECTED PRODUCER IMPACT

The applicant indicates that more than 500 people attend the farmers market from June to October.

Committee Recommendation:

The White Application Review Committee recommends funding in the reduced amount based on the county council commitment of \$7,500 in Lincoln County funds subject to the terms and conditions below:

- 1. Funds shall be available upon the execution of the Legal Agreement in the form of a cost-reimbursement grant.
- 2. Funds shall be disbursed upon the Recipient submitting itemized receipts/invoices and either a cancelled check or a copy of the relevant credit card statement as proof of payment. Cash purchases shall not be eligible for cost-reimbursement. Funds may be drawn on the account for up to 12 months from the execution date of the Legal Agreement. Remaining funds shall expire 12 months from the date of the executed Legal Agreement. The reimbursement rate shall be \$.50 per dollar of approved documented expenses. Approved documented expenses may come from categories listed in the budget as an exhibit to the Legal Agreement.
- 3. The Recipient shall own and maintain the facility for at least 5 years from the execution date of the Legal Agreement.
- 4. The Recipient shall submit annual reports detailing number and types of vendors, market sales and other events held at the market.

FUNDING REQUEST

The Casey County Cattlemen's Association Inc. is requesting \$12,500 in Casey County funds and \$12,500 in State funds to purchase panels and a sale ring.

APPLICATION SUMMARY

The applicant indicates they are seeking money through a USDA grant to purchase panels and a sale ring to sponsor an annual bred and open heifer sale that will be held at the Casey County Ag Center. At this time, there are no panels or a sale ring at the facility for handling cattle. They are planning to use the equipment and sale ring to do host the inaugural sale and make available for future sales.

The total cost of the project is estimated at \$140,000 with funding from the following sources:

\$ 8,000 KADF Casey County funds (secure)

\$12,500 KADF State funds (unsecure)

\$90,000 USDA Rural Business Development Grant (pending)

\$22,500 EDA Grant (secure)

\$ 7,000 Contributions from local farmers (secure)

PROJECTED PRODUCER IMPACT

The applicant indicates that the initial sale will host approximately 150 head of cattle.

Committee Recommendation:

The White Application Review Committee recommends funding the request in the reduced amount of \$8,000 in Casey County funds and no more than half the project costs in county and state funds subject to the terms and conditions below:

- 1. The Recipient shall have until October 31, 2018 to secure additional county commitments. Should the recipient secure additional county funds those funds should be matched by state funds, not to exceed half of the project cost.
- 2. Funds up to 50% of the project shall be available upon the execution of the Legal Agreement in the form of a cost-reimbursement grant.
- 3. Funds shall be disbursed upon the Recipient submitting itemized receipts/invoices and either a copy of a cancelled check or a copy of the relevant credit card statement as proof of payment. Cash purchases shall not be eligible for cost-reimbursement. The Recipient may request reimbursement for expenses up to 16 months from the date of the executed Legal Agreement and shall be returned to the Agricultural Development Fund. The reimbursement rate shall be \$.50 per dollar of approved documented expenses.
- 4. The Recipient shall own and maintain the equipment for at least 5 years from the effective date of the Legal Agreement. In the event the Recipient sells the equipment prior to the expiration of the moratorium period, the Recipient shall refund the grant amount to the Kentucky Agricultural Development Fund on a pro-rated basis.
- 5. The Recipient shall submit annual reports detailing the usage of the equipment including the number and type of animals sold/show and number of participants at each event. For educational programs, the Recipient shall include the number of workshops/events held and the number of attendees.

APPLICATION SUMMARY

The applicant indicates that its community garden, "Garden of the Nations", will aid in starting peppers, tomatoes and long season plants in the early spring and house ethnic produce that may be overwintered such as ginger, taro, cassava, etc.

The total cost of the project is estimated at \$11,695 with funding from the following sources:

\$2,500 KADF Jessamine County funds (unsecure)

\$1,216 2016 Martha Jones Foundation (secure)

\$8,479 2018 Martha Jones Foundation (pending)

\$1,000 Sovereign Insurance (secure)

\$1,000 Kerr Foundation funds (pending)

PROJECTED PRODUCER IMPACT

The applicant indicates the garden will host between 30-50 families.

Committee Recommendation:

The White Application Review Committee recommends funding the request for \$2,500 in Jessamine County funds subject to the terms and conditions below:

- 1. Funds up to \$2,500 shall be available upon the execution of the Legal Agreement in the form of a cost-reimbursement grant.
- 2. Funds shall be disbursed upon the Recipient submitting itemized receipts/invoices and either a copy of a cancelled check or a copy of the relevant credit card statement as proof of payment. Cash purchases shall not be eligible for cost-reimbursement. The Recipient may request reimbursement for expenses up to 12 months from the date of the executed Legal Agreement and shall be returned to the Agricultural Development Fund. The reimbursement rate shall be \$.50 per dollar of approved documented expenses.
- 3. The Recipient shall submit an annual report detailing the number of participants and the types and amount of produce grown. For educational programs, the Recipient shall include the number of workshops/events held and the number of attendees.

FUNDING REQUEST

The Warren County Conservation District is requesting \$2,500 in Warren County funds for its community garden.

APPLICATION SUMMARY

The applicant indicates that this program will be developed in conjunction with the Warren County Housing Authority. The applicant will provide garden plots, workshops on planting and cooking classes and conservation education classes to residents of the housing authority.

The total cost of the project is estimated at \$8,500 with funding from the following sources:

\$2,500 KADF Warren County funds (secure)

\$6,000 Warren County Conservation District (secure)

PROJECTED PRODUCER IMPACT

The applicant indicates that 45 families will be taking care of individual garden plots.

Committee Recommendation:

The White Application Review Committee recommends funding the request for \$2,500 in Warren County funds subject to the terms and conditions below:

- 1. Funds up to \$2,500 shall be available upon the execution of the Legal Agreement in the form of a cost-reimbursement grant.
- 2. Funds shall be disbursed upon the Recipient submitting itemized receipts/invoices and either a copy of a cancelled check or a copy of the relevant credit card statement as proof of payment. Cash purchases shall not be eligible for cost-reimbursement. The Recipient may request reimbursement for expenses up to 12 months from the date of the executed Legal Agreement and shall be returned to the Agricultural Development Fund. The reimbursement rate shall be \$.50 per dollar of approved documented expenses.
- 3. The Recipient shall submit an annual report detailing the number of participants and the types and amount of produce grown. For educational programs, the Recipient shall include the number of workshops/events held and the number of attendees.

Warren County Extension District Board is requesting \$75,000 in Warren County funds to build a commercial kitchen.

APPLICATION SUMMARY

The applicant indicates that the community kitchen will be constructed to offer hands on culinary education and business support to food entrepreneurs. The kitchen will also serve as a life skills development center for kids and limited families resources.

The total cost of the project is estimated at \$151,284 with funding from the following sources:

\$75,000 KADF Warren County funds (secure)

\$76,284 Warren County Extension District Board (secure)

PROJECTED PRODUCER IMPACT

The applicant indicates that 30-50 families will benefit from the kitchen in the first year of programming. Families will participate in the food entrepreneur class, youth culinary classes or value added production classes.

Committee Recommendation:

The White Application Review Committee recommends funding \$75,000 in Warren County funds subject to the terms and conditions below:

- 1. Funds shall be available upon the execution of the Legal Agreement in the form of a cost-reimbursement grant.
- 2. Funds shall be disbursed upon the Recipient submitting itemized receipts/invoices and either a cancelled check or a copy of the relevant credit card statement as proof of payment. Cash purchases shall not be eligible for cost-reimbursement. Funds may be drawn on the account for up to 12 months from the date of executed Legal Agreement. The reimbursement rate shall be \$0.50 per dollar of approved documented expenses. Approved documented expenses may come from categories listed in the budget as an exhibit to the Legal Agreement.
- 3. The Recipient shall provide documentation of matching funds before KADF funds are disbursed.
- 4. If the Recipient sells its equipment within 10 years of the execution of the Legal Agreement, the grant shall be refunded on a prorated basis.
- 5. The Recipient shall submit an annual report detailing number of people using the kitchen, number and type of demonstrations of educational sessions and other details of the kitchen's use.

Commercial Kitchen: The Warren County Extension District was approved for \$75,000 in Warren County funds to build a commercial kitchen.

FUNDING REQUEST

Baesler Farms is requesting \$47,500 in State funds to purchase hemp processing equipment.

APPLICATION SUMMARY

The applicant states they are currently processing hemp into oil for four different producers. The applicant has over 4,000 pounds of hemp to be processed. The additional processing equipment and 20' x 20' building will allow the applicant to expand and process quicker to serve more farmers.

The total cost of the project is estimated at \$95,000 with funding from the following sources:

\$47,500 KADF State funds (unsecure)

\$47,500 Cash on Hand (secure)

PROJECTED PRODUCER IMPACT

The applicant indicates that the 4 farm families that contract with them would benefit.

Committee Recommendation:

The White Application Review Committee recommends not funding this project due to limited producer impact and the uncertainty of the hemp status related to the Farm Bill making the longevity of the project difficult to justify KADF investment.

CBD Oil Processing: Baesler Farms was denied its funding request, based on the committee's recommendation.
