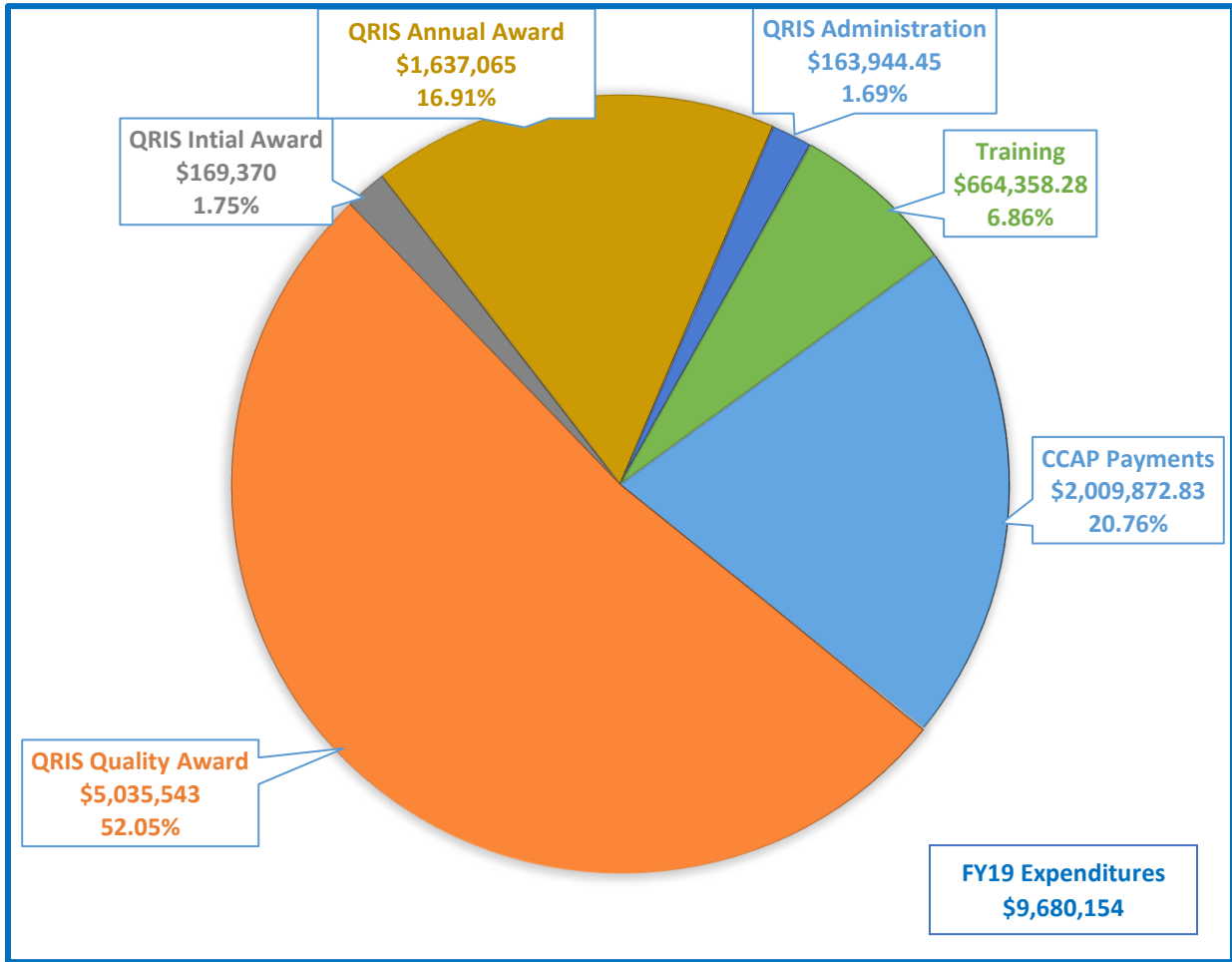


Kentucky Tobacco Settlement Funds

Division of Child Care FY19 Actual Expenditures



Tobacco Funds are used to meet the Mandatory State Match for the Child Care Development Block Grant. The required match for FY 19 is \$8.98M.

CCAP incentives are paid monthly. Totals above reimbursement rates are estimated and will vary based on license type, CCAP children served, location, and days attended.

All STARS incentives are paid annually and require completion of an Annual Quality review or Standards Verification Checklist.

Calculations above are based on hypothetical center located in a western rural county serving 6 infants and toddlers and 12 preschool children plus half day care for 6 school-age children for 20 days of attendance per month per child.

In FY18, the Tobacco Settlement Fund helped to support

25,051 children receiving CCAP were served in high quality centers
