Farmers Market, Youth Cost-Share Program and Farm Retail Market Among Twenty-Eight Agricultural Investments Approved More than \$1.8 million invested in Kentucky Agricultural Development Funds

LOUISVILLE, Ky. (August 16, 2019) – The Kentucky Agricultural Development Board approved \$1,835,203 in 28 agricultural diversification and rural development projects across the Commonwealth at its monthly board meeting.

State Investments:

Farmers Market Structure

Rockcastle County Industrial Development Authority was approved for up to \$170,000 in State and \$5,000 in Rockcastle County funds to construct a farmers market building and covered pavilion. Farmers Market Improvement

Youth Cost-Share Program

Hancock County Cattleman's Association LTD was approved for up to \$5,000 in Hancock County funds for its Youth Agriculture Production Cost-Share Program. For more information on this project, contact Evan Tate at (270) 668-3167 or <u>evan.tate@uky.edu</u>.

On-Farm Investments

The County Agricultural Investment Program (CAIP) offers 11 investment areas that give Kentucky agricultural producers the ability to increase net farm income, add value to their products and diversify their operation. CAIP benefits and enhances agriculture across the state by stimulating markets for Kentucky agricultural products. Seven CAIPs were approved by the board totaling \$1,352,474 for Barren (\$280,000), Bourbon (\$400,000), Franklin (\$152,474), Grayson (\$120,000), Jefferson (\$55,000), Mason (\$275,000), and McCracken (\$70,000) counties.

In addition to these new approvals, an additional \$190,557 was approved to enhance existing CAIPs in Bullitt (\$50,172), Carroll (\$7,200), Harrison (\$17,834), Ohio (\$81,751), and Whitley (\$33,600) counties.

County Agricultural Development Council Administration

\$7,822 was approved to the following counties as part of the 4% County Agricultural Development Council Administrative Funds in Anderson (\$2,000), Carlisle (\$700), Casey (\$1,500), Clay (\$2,000) and Shelby (\$1,622).

Environmental Stewardship

The Deceased Farm Animal Removal Program serves as a measure to facilitate the coordination of environmentally sound and cost effective disposal of deceased livestock for Kentucky producers. Four Deceased Farm Animal Removal Programs totaling \$27,000 were approved for Casey (\$7,500), Franklin (\$4,500), Harrison (\$7,500), and Nicholas (\$7,500) counties.

Youth Agricultural Incentives Program

The Youth Agricultural Incentives Program (Youth) was developed to facilitate a growing need for a specialized program that would encourage youth to engage in and explore agricultural opportunities. Three Youth Programs were approved by the board totaling \$45,000 for Carroll (\$15,000), Rowan (\$20,000), and Wayne (\$10,000) counties.

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Great strides continue being made toward lessening Kentucky's dependence on tobacco production while revitalizing the farm economy by investing a portion of Kentucky's Master Settlement Agreement Funds into the Kentucky Agricultural Development Fund.

To date, Kentucky has invested more than \$605 million in an array of county, regional and state projects designed to increase net farm income and create sustainable new farm-based business enterprises. These funding approvals, made possible by the Kentucky Agricultural Development Fund, represent just a few of the more than 6,100 projects approved, since the inception of the program in January 2001.

Project Summary:

FUNDING REQUEST

PHARM Roadside Market LLC is requesting \$51,000 in State funds and \$9,000 in Trimble County funds to renovate and expand an existing roadside farmers retail market space.

APPLICATION SUMMARY

The applicant plans to renovate an existing road side market to offer a viable retail space to sell local produce (flowers, vegetables and fruit), honey, sorghum, cheese, as well as food products (ice cream and coffee) and other homemade goods. Additionally, the market will be used to sell flowers and other items raised by local high school and middle school students the proceeds going towards the school. The KADB funds will used to install a HVAC system, repair walk-in cooler, renovate the market, and add insulation, marketing products, new ice cream maker, coffee supplies and barn repairs.

The total project cost is anticipated to be \$120,000 with funding from the following sources:

\$51,000 KADF State Funds

\$9,000 Trimble County (secured)

\$30,000 Owner Investment (secured)

\$30,000 United Citizen Bank Loan (pending)

PROJECTED PRODUCER IMPACT

The applicant states that 14 farm families will be impacted by this project.

Committee Recommendation:

The White Application Review Committee recommends matching \$9,000 in State funds to Trimble County Agricultural Development Council commitment of \$9,000 for a total of \$18,000 in eligible expenses subject to the following terms and conditions:

TERMS & CONDITIONS

- 1. Funds shall be available upon the execution of the Legal Agreement in the form of a costreimbursement grant.
- 2. The Recipient shall use the funds for the following budget categories:repairs to walk in cooler (\$10,000), new ice cream maker (\$1,000) and renovations to market (\$7,000).
- 3. Prior to the disbursement of funds the recipient shall submit documentation of secured matching funds for each of the approved budget categories.
- 4. The Recipient may request reimbursement for expenses incurred in completing the project for up to 12 months. The Board shall reimburse the Recipient \$0.50 per \$1.00 of approved documented payments, in accordance with the budget, which shall be attached as an exhibit to the Legal Agreement. The Recipient shall submit itemized receipts/invoices and either a cancelled check or copy of the relevant credit card statement as documentation of payment. The Board shall not reimburse the Recipient for purchases made with cash.

- 5. If Recipient sells its business or equipment within 5 years of the execution of the Legal Agreement, the grant shall be refunded on a prorated basis.
- 6. The Recipient shall submit annual reports detailing the amounts and types of farmers produce sold. Any other indicators to evaluate impacts of this project.

FUNDING REQUEST

Hancock County Cattleman's Association LTD. is requesting \$5,000 in Hancock County funds for a Hancock County Youth Agriculture Production Cost-Share Program.

APPLICATION SUMMARY

The applicant plans to implement a cost-share program on a reimbursement basis for agricultural projects for Hancock County youth. Youth will submit their applications along with a farm business plan and marketing plan describing how purchased items and supplies will be utilized in their projects. This will be a 50 percent cost share reimbursement, with the maximum being \$500 if \$1,000 or more is spent.

The total cost of the project is estimated at \$10,000 with funding from the following sources: \$5,000 Hancock County KADB funds \$5,000 Applicant Cash (secured)

PRODUCER IMPACT

Twelve Hancock County youth will directly benefit from this project.

Committee Recommendation:

The White Application Review Committee recommends funding \$5,000 in Hancock County funds, subject to the following terms and conditions:

TERMS & CONDITIONS

- 1. Funds shall be available upon execution of the Legal Agreement in the form of a grant.
- 2. Before disbursing grant funds, the Recipient shall provide the Board with a copy of the 2019 Hancock County Youth Agriculture Production application describing the criteria that will be used to determine the Recipient's basis for selecting eligible participants.
- 3. The Recipient shall use the funds to reimburse participants on a 50% cost-share basis for the eligible items as described by the Hancock County Youth Agriculture Production.
- 4. On or before the one year anniversary of the execution of the Legal Agreement, the Recipient shall provide the Board with a list of participants approved for the cost-share reimbursement, the amount each participant received, and the type of project carried out by the participant.
- 5. Any unused funds shall expire one year from the execution date of the Legal Agreement and shall be returned to the Kentucky Agricultural Development Fund (KADF).

The Nicholas County Cooperative Extension, is requesting \$3,000 in Nicholas County funds to build a 10x12 structure behind the Nicholas County Livestock Pavilion to serve as a ham house.

The applicant plans to construct a ham house for Nicholas County 4-H members. Nicholas County 4-H members have been participating in a ham project since 2009. The 4-H members currently house their hams in Harrison County. This project would allow youth and adults to participate in the preservation processing country hams without having to travel to another county.

The total cost of the project is estimated at \$6,000 with the following funding sources:

- \$1,000Kentucky 4-H Foundation Grant (secured)
- \$1,000 Nicholas County Cooperative Extension (secured)

PROJECTED PRODUCER IMPACT

The applicant states that approximately 50 farm families will benefit from this project.

The White Application Review Committee recommends funding the request for up to \$3,000 in Nicholas County funds, subject to the terms and conditions below:

TERMS & CONDITIONS

- 1. Funds shall be available upon the execution of the Legal Agreement in the form of a costreimbursement grant.
- 2. The Recipient may request reimbursement for expenses incurred in completing the project for up to 12 months. The Board shall reimburse the Recipient \$0.50 per \$1.00 of approved documented payments, in accordance with the budget, which shall be attached as an exhibit to the Legal Agreement. The Recipient shall submit itemized receipts/invoices and either a cancelled check or copy of the relevant credit card statement as documentation of payment. The Board shall not reimburse the Recipient for purchases made with cash.
- 3. The Recipient shall provide the Governor's Office of Agricultural Policy with a copy of the 2019 UK Country Ham Project contract form and any other documents that the Recipient will require the youth or their parents to sign off on.

FUNDING REQUEST

City of Marion KY Tourism Commission is requesting \$11,350 in State funds and \$3,000 in Crittenden County funds to pave the parking lot at the farmers market structure.

APPLICATION SUMMARY

The applicant plans to expand and pave the parking lot for the farmers market. Currently, there are only seven parking spaces. The new parking lot will provide at least twenty additional spaces. By expanding the parking lot, there will be additional handicap parking as well as give consumers and producers more parking space. City of Marion Kentucky Tourism Commission was awarded \$50,000 in State and \$5,000 in Crittenden County funds in 2015 for a farmers market.

The total project cost is anticipated to be \$33,700 with funding from the following sources: \$11,350 KADF State Funds \$3,000 Crittenden County KADF Funds (unsecured) \$19,350 City of Marion Kentucky Tourism Commission (secured)

PROJECTED PRODUCER IMPACT

The applicant states that 15 to 20 farm families will be impacted by this project.

NEED, on behalf of the Kentucky Project, is requesting \$150,625 in KADF State funds to implement Energy for Ag Workshops.

APPLICATION SUMMARY

The applicant will facilitate three, one-day energy workshops across the state for agricultural teachers and FFA leaders. The workshops will focus on renewable energy, energy efficiency and conservation of energy in schools and rural communities. Students will be provided opportunities to visit agricultural sites that have implemented solar and/or energy efficient strategies. Content and resources will also be provided to FFA summer camps for both student and teacher education. Each workshop will provide teachers with NEED curriculum, a Science of Energy kit and either NEED's Solar or Energy Efficiency and Conservation kit.

The total cost of the project is estimated at \$150,625 with funding from the following sources: \$150,625 KADF State funds

PROJECTED PRODUCER IMPACT

The applicant states that producer/farm impact is unknown until implementation begins, however; data will be collected for reporting.

Verti Grow Farms, LLC is requesting \$2,000,000 in KADF State funds to construct an agritourism and organic farm.

APPLICATION SUMMARY

The applicant will be repurposing an unused school building and 4 acres in Falmouth, KY into an indoor environmentally controlled growing site. The site will have approximately 32,000 square feet of grow space and will produce 12 months a year. The school will also be converted into an agritourism site with a store, an interactive grow facility and a farmers market. Greenhouse construction will also be done onsite to produce 34,000 additional square feet of grow space.

The total cost of the project is estimated at \$7,875,000 with funding from the following sources: \$2,000,000 KADF State funds \$1,575,000 Private Equity (partially secured)

\$4,300,000 Kemba Federal Credit Union, Heritage Bank, Rainstar Capital (unsecured)

PROJECTED PRODUCER IMPACT

The applicant estimates that nearly 20 farm families will be impacted in year two and an additional 20 farm families in year three through five.
