FUNDING REQUEST

Riverview Meat Company, LLC, is requesting \$250,000 in State funds to purchase an existing meat processing facility in Cynthiana, Kentucky.

APPLICATION SUMMARY

Riverview Meat Company is requesting funds to assist with the purchase of C&W Meat Packers in Cynthiana, Harrison County, Kentucky. The processing facility was built in the 1960's. The current owners wish to retire, and have significantly cut their hours and are operating at under 50% capacity. The community has a need to maximize operational capacity so that the area producers can have their livestock processed to meet consumer demands. The applicant has a 4 phase plan to do expansions to the current operation. Phase 1 expansion includes expanding/remodeling the livestock drop off to the back of building. Phase 2 expansion/remodeling would include replacing the roof, installing a stand-by generator, and replacing the condensing units. Phase 3 would include construction of a new refrigerated area, building moderations, and installation of new rail systems. Phase 4 of expansion/remodeling includes modifications of the building to enlarge the fabrication space. Following expansion of the refrigeration space, the fabrication room will need to be enlarged to avoid being bottlenecked.

The total cost of this phase of the project is estimated at \$896,125 with the following funding sources: \$149,350 State funds \$286,125 Loan from City National Bank (Secured)

\$205,000 Personal Funds (Secured)

PROJECTED PRODUCER IMPACT

The applicant indicates five counties will benefit from this project.

Board Decision:

Riverview Meat Company, LLC, was approved for up to \$250,000 in State funds as a forgivable loan and \$25,000 in multi-county funds as a cost-reimbursement grant to purchase an existing meat processing facility in Cynthiana, Ky. This is a Meat Processing Investment Program (MPIP) Level 4 project.

FUNDING REQUEST

Continental Refining Company LLC is requesting \$250,000 in Pulaski County funds and \$4,750,000 in State funds to establish a soybean processing facility.

APPLICATION SUMMARY

Continental Refining Company LLC (CRC) plans to build a mechanical crush facility to process regionally grown soybeans in Somerset, KY. The plant will yield soybean oil, meal, and hulls. Meal and hulls will be sold into multiple agriculture industries, specifically poultry, to be used as feed. The oil will be further processed in CRC's biodiesel facility and made into clean burning biodiesel to be sold throughout Kentucky. At full capacity, the plant will process up to 3.8 million bushels of soybeans. KADF funds will be utilized for engineering, procurement of equipment, construction, and installation.

The total cost of the project is estimated at \$10,987,525 with funding from the following sources:

\$4,694,389 State funds

\$6,043,138 Internal Funding (secured)

PROJECTED PRODUCER IMPACT

The applicant states that there will are 992 soybean farmers in the targeted counties that will potentially be impacted by the establishment of the plant.

Kentucky Training Center (TTC), LLC, is requesting \$2,930,000 in State funds to build six new equine barns.

APPLICATION SUMMARY

The applicant plans to build six new equine barns to update their facilities for the horses stabled at the Paris Pike location. This project will support the overall racing circuit in Kentucky. The horses stabled at TTC make a significate difference in the year-round racing circuit in Kentucky.

The total cost of the project is estimated at \$5,860,000 with funding from the following sources: \$2,930,000 State funds \$2,930,000 Association Funds (Secured)

PRODUCER IMPACT

The applicant estimates that the thoroughbreds producers in Fayette, Bourbon, Scott, and Woodford County will potentially benefit from this project.

Burgin Independent Schools is requesting \$12,296 in Mercer County funds to build a new high school greenhouse.

APPLICATION SUMMARY

The applicant plans to build a 12x48 gothic polycarbonate structure. The current greenhouse is over 25 years old, and due to several weather disasters it's time to replace the greenhouse. The new greenhouse will allow the CTE department to keep up to date with industry standards and help the community. This will provide students a needed facility to grow their skills in Horticultural, Agribusiness, and Ag Leadership.

The total cost of the project is estimated at \$24,796 with funding from the following sources:

FUNDING REQUEST

Kentucky Fresh Harvest LLC is requesting \$100,000 in State funds to aid in lining their water retention basin.

APPLICATION SUMMARY

Funding will be used for lining a water retention basin to create a closed loop water system for the applicant's production cycle. Kentucky Fresh Harvest realizes the amount of sustainability they can ensure through completing the construction of this 1.6 million gallon retention basin. Their goal creating this producer implemented project is not solely for their use, but to also educate producers on the importance and feasibility of closed-loop systems. Kentucky Fresh Harvest will be hosting various educational events, webinars, and on-site tours to educate producers on the impact of a closed-loop water system and how their water retention basin helps to ensure success.

The total cost of the project is estimated at \$761,669 with funding from the following sources:

- \$ 563,008 Cash on Hand
- \$ 98,661 Expenses incurred (Materials previously purchased)

PROJECTED PRODUCER IMPACT

The applicant states that producers across the state will benefit from the educational events held to teach them about closed-loop systems and how water retention basins have a hand in that system.

Kentucky Fresh Harvest LLC was approved for \$100,000 in State funds to complete the construction of a 1.6 million gallon water retention basin, as part of its closed-loop water system. This is an On-Farm Water Management Producer Implemented Project (PIP).

FUNDING REQUEST

American Farmland Trust is requesting \$550,000 in State funds for the Kentucky Commercial Rye Cover Crop Initiative.

APPLICATION SUMMARY

The Kentucky Commercial Rye Cover Crop Initiative's goal is to improve farmers' profitability, soil health and environmental quality while supporting local economies and businesses such as brewers, bakers and distillers who seek the unique flavor rye imparts in their products. Rye for grain in Kentucky will reduce the imports of rye from Europe and Canada and diversify farmers' crop mix to benefit both profits and overall soil health. American Farmland Trust (AFT) will be working in partnership with the University of Kentucky, Kentucky Small Grain Growers Association, Walnut Grove Farm and local farmers to evaluate the agronomic traits of rye. Funding will be used for project implementation, programming, management and research over a two year period.

The total cost of the project is estimated at \$1,131,040 with funding from the following sources:

FUNDING REQUEST

Allen Porter is requesting \$10,000 in State funds to increase capacity and water control of a pond on his farm. This will be a Small Scale Grant project in Scott County.

APPLICATION SUMMARY

Allen Porter is farming on 141 acres primarily focused on beef cattle, tobacco, hay, and grain production. To expand sustainable irrigation throughout the farm for hay and silage production, and better maintain an emergency water supply for his cattle, he plans to install a concrete water control monk to help raise pool level by 12 inches. This installation will increase pond size to 2 acres and capacity by about 650,000 gallons. An 18 inch outlet pipe will also be installed and repairs will be made to the dam, the waterway, and easily erodible contour surrounding the pond. Permanent exclusion fencing will be installed around the pond to prevent damage from cattle.

The total cost of the project is estimated at \$28,000 with the following funding sources: \$10,000 KADF State funds \$18,000 Personal Funds (secured)
