FUNDING REQUEST

The Hickman County Board of Education is requesting \$42,909 in Hickman County funds for equipment and teaching materials to train students on agriculture workforce skills.

APPLICATION SUMMARY

Funding will be used to revitalize the agriculture skills training through investing in new materials, equipment, and a storage shed to house the equipment. The Hickman County Board of Education recognizes the need for skills based workforce development in their county and surrounding counties. The Hickman County Board of Education has utilized funding previously to implement a welding program, but this funding will help enhance that program. Their goal through getting this funding is to supply resources and materials needed to train students in valuable workforce skills that will benefit local agriculture in their county and the river industries.

The total cost of the project is estimated at \$85,819 with funding from the following sources:

- \$ 42,909 KADF Hickman County funds (24,860 KADF State allocated county funds)
- \$ 42,909 Hickman County Board of Education

PROJECTED PRODUCER IMPACT

The applicant states that at least fifteen farm families will benefit in the county while the long term impact will benefit all four river counties.

FUNDING REQUEST

Kentucky Horse Council, Inc. is requesting \$200,000 in State funds for a NASS Survey for the equine industry.

APPLICATION SUMMARY

The applicant plans to contract with NASS for an equine industry survey. NASS will be responsible for the following: mailing the questionnaires, telephone follow-up, field enumeration, and summary results. NASS will make the anonymous data available to researchers for use in further studies. Currently, the USDA Census of Agricultural does not include for-profit equine operations in the surveys.

The total cost of the project is estimated at \$400,000 with funding from the following sources:

The applicant indicates that around 35,000 equine operations would benefit from this project.

Nelson County Farm Bureau is requesting \$2,188 in Nelson County funds to purchase grain safety equipment for the Nelson County Fire Department.

APPLICATION SUMMARY

The applicant plans to purchase grain safety equipment for the Nelson County Fire Departments to utilize for dispatch for any farm safety calls regarding grain bin recue. Through this purchase, the Nelson County Farm Bureau plans to have on-going training with local departments for grain rescue catastrophes. The Grain Rescue Tube will be housed at the Nelson County Fire Department, which is centrally located and easily accessible.

The total estimated costs for the project is \$4,688 with funding from the following sources: \$2,188 Nelson County Funds (secured) \$2,500 Nelson County Farm Bureau (secured)

PRODUCER IMPACT

The applicant indicates that this addition would potentially prevent fatalities if producers were to be trapped in a grain bin.

FUNDING REQUEST

Upton Meats and Custom Processing, LLC is requesting \$138,238 in State funds for site preparation of the land, to build a USDA processing facility and purchase processing equipment.

APPLICATION SUMMARY

The applicant plans to build a butcher shop and a USDA processing facility in Green County to process beef, pork, and lamb and to sell retail meat products though the store front. In the first year of operation their goal is to process 10 cattle, 2 hogs, and 2 lambs per week. The applicants have hog processing experience and plan on spending more time at Wises Meats and UK Meats Processing Facility to learn how to processing cattle and to improve their hog processing techniques.

The total cost of the project is estimated at \$283,975 with funding from the following sources: \$138,238 State funds \$130,737 The Harrison Bank (Pending) \$15,000 Owner Investment (Secured)

PRODUCER IMPACT

The applicant estimates that the 10 surrounding counties will potentially benefit from this project

Committee Recommendation:

The Meat Processing Expansion Committee is recommending to no fund Upton Meats & Custom Processing LLC due to the applicant's failure to respond to the committee's request for information and documentation.

The Board denied the applicant's request based on the Committee's recommendation.

LOUISVILLE (Aug. 20, 2021) – The Kentucky Agricultural Development Board approved \$3,483,097 for agricultural diversification and rural development projects across the commonwealth at its monthly board meeting.

County Agricultural Investment Program (CAIP)

CAIP provides Kentucky agricultural producers with cost-share assistance on practices to allow them to improve and diversify their current farm operations. CAIP covers a wide variety of agricultural enterprises in its 11 investment areas, including, but not limited to, bees and honey; equine; forage; beef and dairy cattle; goats and sheep; horticulture; poultry; swine; timber and technology, as well as energy efficiency and production; farm infrastructure and water enhancement; marketing; and value-added production.

Deceased Farm Animal Removal (DAR)

DAR serves as a measure to facilitate the coordination of environmentally sound and costeffective disposal of deceased livestock for Kentucky producers.

Three Deceased Farm Animal Removal programs were approved by the board totaling \$36,250:

- Hardin (\$12,500)
- Hart (\$15,000)

Next Generation Farmer Program (NextGen)

NextGen addresses the growing need for a specialized program that would benefit producers ages 18 to 40 that have been engaged in an agricultural operation for a minimum of three years.

Two NextGen Program was approved by the board totaling \$43,000:

Shared-Use Equipment Program

Shared-Use Equipment Program assists broad-based community organizations with the purchase of farm equipment. The equipment purchased is made available for producer use in a specific county on a leased basis.
