FUNDING REQUESTED

Jessamine County FFA Alumni Association, Inc. is requesting \$8,000 in Jessamine County funds for a Jessamine County 4-H and FFA cost-share program.

APPLICATION SUMMARY

Jessamine County FFA Alumni Association, Inc. is requesting county funds to do a 50/50 cost-share program on agriculture projects for Jessamine County 4-H and FFA students. Students will submit their applications, along with a brief essay, on their projects and their future goals. Students can participate for two years in the program with the hope of being self-sustaining by the third year. Students that reapply for funds the second year are asked to reinvest in their previous projects to improve and expand each year. In the past, Jessamine County FFA Alumni Association, Inc. approved \$500 the first year and \$250 the second year this approach they believe allows more student to participate in the program.

The total cost of the project is estimated at \$16,000 with funding from the following sources:

\$8,000 Jessamine County funds (secure)

\$8,000 from Jessamine Community (secure)

PRODUCER IMPACT

Fourteen Jessamine County students will directly benefit from this project.

FUNDING REQUEST

Washington County Fiscal Court is requesting \$6,953 in Washington County funds to purchase a trailer for its deceased animal removal program.

APPLICATION SUMMARY

The applicant will be purchasing a new dump trailer to be used for the county deceased animal removal program. In 2019, the Fiscal Court picked up 402 animals throughout the county. The new trailer will be used solely for the pick-up of deceased animals from farms and locations in Washington County.

The total cost of the project is estimated at \$13,907 with funding from the following sources:

\$6,953 Washington County Fiscal Court (secured)

PROJECTED PRODUCER IMPACT

The applicant states that 131 farmers and residents utilized the program in 2020.

Kentucky Agricultural Development Board Approves \$150,649 for Projects Across the Commonwealth

Projects and programs approved span the diverse array of Kentucky agriculture

FRANKFORT, Ky. (April 16, 2021) – The Kentucky Agricultural Development Board approved \$150,649 for agricultural diversification and rural development projects across the commonwealth at its monthly board meeting.

County Investments:

Bracken County

Bracken County Soil Conservation District was approved for \$4,568 in Bracken County Funds for a DAR Program and \$33,901 for a no-till drill under the Shared-Use Equipment Program.

Green County

Green County Cattlemen's Association was approved for \$5,451 for a pasture aerator, a field aerator and a poly seeder under the Shared-Use Equipment Program.

Harlan County

Harlan County Soil Conservation District was approved for \$323 in Harlan County Funds and \$29,686 in state funds for CAIP with a maximum producer limit of \$5,000.

Henry County

Henry County Cattlemen's Association was approved for \$15,000 in Henry County Funds for a Youth Program.

Jessamine County

Jessamine County FFA Alumni Association was approved for \$8,000 in Jessamine County Funds for a 50/50 cost share program on agriculture projects for Jessamine County 4-H and FFA students.

LaRue County

LaRue County Conservation District was approved for \$23,767 in LaRue County Funds for a no-till drill under the Shared-Use Equipment Program.

Lincoln County

Lincoln County Fiscal Court was approved for \$15,000 in Bracken County Funds for a DAR program.

Pulaski County

Pulaski County Conservation District was approved for \$8,000 for a post driver under the Shared-Use Equipment Program.

Washington County

Washington County Fiscal Court was approved for \$6,953 in Washington County funds to purchase a dump trailer to support the county's deceased animal removal program.

KADF Program Information:

The **County Agricultural Investment Program** (CAIP) provides farmers with incentives to allow them to improve and diversify their current production practices. CAIP covers a wide variety of agricultural enterprises in its 11 investment areas, including, but not limited to, bees and honey; equine; forage; beef and dairy cattle; goats and sheep; horticulture; poultry; swine; timber and technology, as well as energy efficiency and production; farm infrastructure and water enhancement; marketing; and value-added production.

The **Deceased Farm Animal Removal Program** (DAR) serves as a measure to facilitate the coordination of environmentally sound and cost-effective disposal of deceased livestock for Kentucky producers.

The **Shared-Use Equipment Program** assists broad-based community organizations with the purchase of farm equipment. The equipment purchased is made available for producer use in a specific county on a leased basis.

The **Youth Agricultural Incentives Program** (Youth) encourages youth to engage in and explore agricultural opportunities. All application periods and deadlines for CAIP and Youth programs will be advertised locally.
