FUNDING REQUEST

The Elliott Co. Board of Education is requesting \$15,000 in Elliott County funds for constructing a new greenhouse.

APPLICATION SUMMARY

Funding will be used to construct a new greenhouse at Elliott Co. High School. The old greenhouse is quite deteriorated and the agriculture program is highly focused on horticulture. A new greenhouse structure will be essential to providing hands-on experiences for Elliott County students.

The total cost of the project is estimated at \$33,455 with funding from the following sources:

- \$ 1,000 KY Soil Conservation District Board (secured)
- \$ 10,000 Marathon Community Investment Program (Secured)

FUNDING REQUEST

The University of Kentucky Research Foundation is requesting \$352,145 in State funds over a two-year period to support the state's Viticulture and Enology Extension Program.

APPLICATION SUMMARY

The applicant indicates UK will continue research focused on vineyard management and winery techniques specific to varieties know to thrive in Kentucky and newly released varieties. The applicant plans to help growers maneuver different field variations, by teaching adapting wine styles for those variations that are needed. The applicant's goal for this project is to provide research-based recommendations on new and existing vineyard methods and wine styles best suited to our climate, communities, and consumer preferences. Wine sales began on June 14, 2018, and have generated over \$40,000 which has been put directly back into the extension and research activities at UK. The UK Research Foundation has received funds for the State Viticulture and Enology Extension Program in 2014, 2016, 2018, and 2020. The total KADF received is \$2,049,936.

The total cost of the project is estimated at \$704,290 with funding from the following sources:

\$352,145 KADF State funds (unsecure)

\$133,572 UK Faculty Salaries & Fringe (secured)

\$218,573 Uncovered Indirect Cost (secured)

PROJECTED PRODUCER IMPACT

The applicant indicates that there are 72 wineries, more than 125 individual grape producers, and roughly 225 acres in Kentucky that will benefit from this project.

Kentucky Agricultural Development Board approves more than \$2.9 million for projects across the commonwealth

Funded projects focus on agricultural diversification, rural development

FRANKFORT (July 15, 2022) – The Kentucky Agricultural Development Board approved \$2,930,889 for agricultural diversification and rural development projects across the commonwealth at its monthly board meeting.

"Finding projects across the commonwealth that will diversify our agricultural output, while simultaneously enhancing our producers' way of life is one of the best ways to ensure Kentucky's agricultural future is maintained," Commissioner of Agriculture Dr. Ryan Quarles said. "Projects funded today helps accomplish these goals. It's an ongoing challenge, but one this board is ready to face with Kentucky's farmers."

County Agricultural Investment Program (CAIP)

CAIP provides Kentucky agricultural producers with cost-share assistance on practices to allow them to improve and diversify their current farm operations. CAIP covers a wide variety of agricultural enterprises in its 11 investment areas, including, but not limited to, bees and honey; equine; forage; beef and dairy cattle; goats and sheep; horticulture; poultry; swine; timber and technology, as well as energy efficiency and production; farm infrastructure and water enhancement; marketing; and value-added production.

Deceased Farm Animal Removal (DAR)

The Deceased Farm Animal Removal Program serves as a measure to facilitate the coordination of environmentally-sound and cost-effective disposal of deceased livestock for Kentucky producers.

Two DAR programs were approved by the board totaling \$30,000:

- Nelson (\$15,000)
- Taylor (\$15,000)

Next Generation Farmer Program (NextGen)

NextGen addresses the growing need for a specialized program that would benefit producers ages 18 to 40 that have been engaged in an agricultural operation for a minimum of three years.

Two NextGen programs were approved by the board totaling \$55,000:

- Anderson (\$30,000)
- Nelson (\$25,000)

Shared-Use Equipment Program

The Shared-Use Equipment Program assists broad-based community organizations with the purchase of farm equipment. The equipment purchased is made available for producer use in a specific county on a leased basis.

Two Shared-Use Equipment programs were approved by the board totaling \$27,188:

Youth Agricultural Incentives Program (YAIP)

YAIP encourages youth to engage in and explore agricultural opportunities.
