FUNDING REQUEST

The Woodford County Fiscal Court is requesting \$50,000 in Woodford County funds to install permanent bleachers around livestock, equine, and motor sport facilities at the Woodford County Park.

APPLICATION SUMMARY

The applicant indicates that the funds used to install permanent bleachers will allow for greater ability of events to host larger crowds and a potential for greater fundraising opportunities. The applicant states that the current portable bleachers severely limit the number of participants that can attend the events held at Woodford County Park.

The total cost of the project is estimated at \$190,000 with funding from the following sources:

FUNDING REQUEST

Auburn University is requesting \$64,880 in state funds over a 2 year period to fund travel costs and student stipends for the recruitment and support of veterinarians in rural areas of Kentucky.

APPLICATION SUMMARY

Since 1951, the Auburn University College of Veterinary Medicine (AUCVM) and the Commonwealth of Kentucky have had a formal relationship that reserves a fixed number of seats in each incoming AUCVM class for Kentucky students and guarantees those students will be charged the same rate as students who are residents of Alabama.

AUCVM's preceptorship program is an eight-week training experience for senior students to learn aspects of practice management, finances, client relations, personnel supervision, and housekeeping under the direct supervision of a practicing veterinarian. There are currently 347 active preceptor locations, with 56 being located in Kentucky. AUCVM also offers externship opportunities for students in all years of the curriculum (not just seniors). These externships give students a two-week hands-on training experience in a clinical practice environment. KADB funds will be used over a two-year period to fund travel to, from, and around Kentucky for the AUCVM Practice Management Director, AUCVM Associate Dean for Academic Affairs, AUCVM Dean, practice management students, or an AUCVM faculty member.

KADB funds will also be used to fund 8 student stipends each year (4 preceptorships & 4 externships). These stipends assist with travel/living expenses for AUCVM students completing these programs in rural designated areas in Kentucky.

The total cost of the project is estimated at \$131,441 with the following funding sources:

PROJECTED PRODUCER IMPACT

The applicant states that a large number of families, specifically in rural communities throughout Kentucky, will be directly affected by this project.

Originally, the application was submitted for the Shared-Use Equipment Program, however this piece of equipment is not currently an eligible item. Checkout for producers to lease this equipment would be provided by a local farm supply store and would maintain it for a fee. The clinic plans to construct a 40'x56' building equipped with pens, a sweep tub, an alley, and a chute to help them serve clients more efficiently and on a timely basis.

KADB funds will be used for site preparation, construction of the building, and purchasing the chute and handling equipment.

The Scott County Farmers Market has operated successfully for years and is seeking to partner with the Fiscal Court, the City of Georgetown, and the Tourism Board in order to grow and expand the market.

The applicant plans to build a permanent pavilion and support facilities in downtown Georgetown, KY. This pavilion will expand the Scott County Farmers Market from roughly 16 vendor spaces to 30 +.

KADB funds will be used for the materials and labor costs associated directly with the construction of the new farmers' market pavilion.

The total cost of the project is estimated at \$1,035,000 with the following funding sources:

Typically, more than 25 youth apply for the program each year.

The Chop Shop is currently operating at near capacity so additional income streams need to come from better utilization of by-products. The Chop Shop has been approached by an exporter with an exclusive contract to import processed beef tripe to China.

The applicant plans to build a 4,400 sq. ft. facility and obtain the equipment necessary to wash, refine, and process beef tripe.

KADB funds will be used to assist in purchasing and installing the tripe washers and refiners as well as constructing the room that will be attached to the existing processing facility.
