Kentucky Agricultural Finance Corp. approves \$4,825,436 in loans

Financing bolsters beef, forage, poultry, and grain farmers across the Commonwealth

FRANKFORT, Ky. (May 10, 2024) – The Kentucky Agricultural Finance Corp. (KAFC) approved \$4,825,436 for 24 agricultural loans for projects across the Commonwealth at its monthly board meeting.

Agricultural Infrastructure Loan Program (AILP)

Five Agricultural Infrastructure loans totaling \$743,786 were approved. Loan recipients were in Casey (\$250,000), Graves (\$95,000, \$99,735, and \$250,000), and Nelson (\$49,051) counties. KAFC participates with lenders to provide financing to producers making capital expenditures for agricultural projects through the AILP. Eligible projects include permanent farm structures with attached equipment that improves the profitability of farming operations. Producers may be eligible for up to \$150,000 not to exceed 50 percent of the project.

Beginning Farmer Loan Program (BFLP)

Nineteen Beginning Farmer loans totaling up to \$4,081,650 were approved. Loan recipients were in Adair (\$250,000 and \$250,000), Bourbon (\$250,000), Calloway (\$250,000 and \$250,000), Christian (\$108,188), Clinton (\$145,000), Cumberland (\$250,000), Garrard (\$118,750), Graves (\$250,000), Hardin (\$155,000 and \$250,000), Hart (\$125,000), Hopkins (\$250,000), Marion (\$250,000), McLean (\$250,000), Ohio (\$244,712), Todd (\$250,000) and Wayne (\$185,000) counties. The BFLP is designed to assist individuals with some farming experience who desire to develop, expand, or buy into a farming operation. Beginning farmers may qualify for financing to purchase livestock, equipment, or agriculture facilities; to secure permanent working capital; for the purchase of farm real estate; or to invest in a partnership or LLC.

FUNDING REQUEST

Kentucky Veterinary Medical Association (KVMA) is requesting \$1,093,750 in state funds to establish The Kentucky Rural Veterinarian Loan Repayment Program.

APPLICATION SUMMARY

The Rural Kentucky Veterinarian Loan Repayment Program is being proposed to address critical veterinarian shortages in rural Kentucky. The program will provide loan repayment incentives to individuals who meet the eligibility requirements and practice in specified locations for up to five years. The maximum award is \$87,500 which will be paid in five increments.

KVMA is proposing a ten-year program to bring over 25 veterinarians into Kentucky's designated rural shortage areas. The proposal is to have the General Assembly and KADF split the cost 50/50. There is a financial tiered proposal that will accompany this application and a draft bill is being edited by LRC to be introduced in this Legislative session. KADB funds will be used to pay the loan repayment incentives.

The total cost of the project is estimated at \$2,187,500 with the following funding sources:

\$1,093,750 KADB State Funds

\$1,093,750 General Assembly Funds (Pending)

PROJECTED PRODUCER IMPACT

The applicant states that in the first year, 5 applicants will be selected. Ideally, the applicants will be spread throughout the state with an impact of 100 plus farm families benefiting.

FUNDING REQUEST

Logan Bethel Veterinary Services, LLC is requesting \$16,070 in Logan County funds and \$80,353 in state funds to expand and renovate the large animal treatment and surgery area at the clinic.

APPLICATION SUMMARY

Funding will be used to expand and renovate the large animal treatment and surgery area at the clinic. The applicant states that this will include an isolation stall for hospitalized small ruminants and bovines, as well as infectious equine cases. The project will include adding a foot trimming chute, surgery room with appropriate equipment and a privacy fence area for a compost pile. The applicant states that the current travel radius extends from Cadiz (Trigg) to Bowling Green (Warren), north to Bremen (Muhlenberg) and south to Greenbrier, TN.

The total cost of the project is estimated at \$128,564 with funding from the following sources:

Wilder's Corner LLC is requesting \$60,000 in Henry County funds to open a rural grocery / deli specializing in local products.

Wilder's Corner will be a rural grocery store that will carry meal staples and local meats, dairy, eggs and vegetables. It will have a small deli and full specialty coffee service as well. It is their mission to consign local producers' wares and promote and sell local products in as many areas as possible.

Dr. John Tabor, with Cornerstone Veterinary Services, serves producers in Logan, Todd, and Christian counties. He is planning to purchase a truck and vet box for ambulatory on-farm services and add a sweep tub and alley to the clinic's on-site handling facilities.

Christian County Board of Education is requesting \$212,500 in Christian County funds to build a 40' x 84' greenhouse at the newly merged Christian County High School.

APPLICATION SUMMARY

The Christian County Board of Education will be consolidating both high schools in the county, and therefore, have prioritized the construction of a new greenhouse due to the student impact in the ag department. The Applicant states that the previous greenhouse used in one of the high schools has been running for 20 years and allowed students to learn first-hand experience in plant propagation and production. The new greenhouse will also serve as a revenue stream through annual plant fundraisers for the local FFA chapter. The Christian County Board of Education will own the property; however, the high school ag advisors will manage day-to-day activities, record keeping, and accounting.

The total cost of the project is estimated at \$631,500 with the following funding sources: \$212,500 KADB Christian County Funds (Secured) \$419,000 Christian County Board of Education (Secured)

PROJECTED PRODUCER IMPACT

The applicant states that many students and farm families in Christian County will be directly affected by this project .

Southern Kentucky Floral Exchange is requesting \$11,000 in multi-county funds to increase their flower cold storage facilities.

APPLICATION SUMMARY

Funding will be used to build a 10'x12' floral cooler, processing and distribution supplies, and development of branding. Southern Kentucky (SOKY) Floral Exchange is a flower farm co-op that enables their collective Kentucky flower farms to be reached through their online sales platform "Rooted Farmers" by florists, freelance designers, and floral buyers. These flower farms members of SOKY Floral Exchange work together to sell cut flower through the wholesale channel to sell larger volumes and meet demand. The Applicants currently serve designers and buyers in Owensboro, Hopkinsville, Bowling Green, Franklin, and Nashville areas.

The total cost of the project is estimated at \$22,000 with funding from the following

The applicant states that 25 south central and western Kentucky flower farms will be directly impacted by this project.

FUNDING REQUEST

Rowlett's Milkhouse Creamery LLC is requesting \$48,345 in Henry County funds and \$48,345 in State funds to build an addition to house ice cream production.

APPLICATION SUMMARY

The applicant plans to build a 1,300 square foot addition for ice cream production at the creamery. This will allow the making of ice cream daily without regards to cheese and butter production in the factory due to the Milk Safety regulations of only one production at a time in their one room factory.

The total cost of the project is estimated at \$424,894 with the following funding sources:
