Kentucky Agricultural Finance Corp. approves more than \$2.9 million in loans

Financing bolsters beef, forage, poultry, and grain farmers across the Commonwealth

GEORGETOWN (Oct 10, 2024) – The Kentucky Agricultural Finance Corp. (KAFC) approved 14 agricultural loans totaling \$2,950,475 for projects across the Commonwealth today at its monthly board meeting.

Agricultural Infrastructure Loan Program (AILP)

Four Agricultural Infrastructure Loans totaling up to \$675,000 were approved. Loan recipients were in Hardin (\$75,000 and \$150,000), Monroe (\$250,000), and Warren (\$200,000) counties.

KAFC participates with lenders to provide financing to producers making capital expenditures for agricultural projects through the AILP. Eligible projects include permanent farm structures with attached equipment that improves the profitability of farming operations. Producers may be eligible for up to \$250,000 not to exceed 50 percent of the project.

Beginning Farmer Loan Program (BFLP)

Ten Beginning Farmer Loans totaling up to \$2,275,475 were approved. Loan recipients were in Anderson (\$250,000), Barren (\$112,500), Breckenridge (\$250,000), Crittenden (\$236,500), Graves (\$250,000), Hart (\$250,000), Hopkins (\$250,000), Madison (\$176,475), Mercer (\$250,000) and Spencer (\$250,000) counties.

The BFLP is designed to assist individuals with some farming experience who desire to develop, expand, or buy into a farming operation. Beginning farmers may qualify for financing to purchase livestock, equipment, or agriculture facilities; to secure permanent working capital; for the purchase of farm real estate; or to invest in a partnership or LLC.

FUNDING REQUEST

Legacy Mobile Veterinary Services is requesting \$7,205 in multi-county funds and \$36,025 in state funds to purchase x-ray equipment, a generator and an ultrasound machine as part of the Large and Food Animal Veterinary Incentives Program.

APPLICATION SUMMARY

Funding will be used to purchase a portable x-ray machine, ultrasound machine, and a generator to run the x-ray machine. Legacy Mobile Veterinary Services is a mixed animal practice that offers services to clients in and around the Bowling Green area. The applicant states that adding this equipment to the practice will allow additional services to be provided on the farm, eliminating the need for farmers to transport livestock.

The total cost of the project is estimated at \$57,639.76 with funding from the following sources: \$36,025 state funds \$7,205 multi-county funds (Secured) \$14,410 Cash (Secured)

PROJECTED PRODUCER IMPACT

The applicant states that any farm family within a 35 miles radius of Bowling Green is eligible for care. The applicant serves clients in Warren, Barren, Allen, Butler, Edmonson, and Logan counties.

FUNDING REQUEST

Skinner Farms, LLC is requesting \$10,000 in Shelby County funds and \$6,175 in State funds to purchase a walk-in freezer.

APPLICATION SUMMARY

The applicant plans to purchase a walk-in freezer to increase their freezer storage on their farm. The extra freezer space will give them the ability to have their products stored on their farm as well as offer temporary cold storage to other similar farms. They currently have frozen meat stored approximately 200 miles away in Bradford OH alongside other local farms including Slaughter Family Farm. They have previously worked with other local farms to provide cold storage, such as Bluegrass Beef, Lone Pear Farm, and Titus and Christy Riner. This project would also enable them to use their current freezer as a cooler to store eggs that they sell for Chelsey's Eggs and produce that they offer from various local farms.

The total cost of the project is estimated at \$16,175 with the following funding sources:

\$10,000 Shelby -county funds (Secured)

\$16,175 Personal Savings (Secured)

PROJECTED PRODUCER IMPACT

The applicant states that at least 6 farm families will be impacted by this project.

On-Farm Energy Efficiency Incentives Program

The On-Farm Energy Efficiency Incentives Program provides incentives for Kentucky farm families to increase the energy efficiency of existing equipment or facilities on the farm.

Seven On-Farm Energy Efficiency Incentives Programs were approved by the board totaling \$77,162:

County Programs

County Agricultural Investment Program (CAIP)

CAIP provides Kentucky agricultural producers with cost-share assistance on practices to allow them to improve and diversify their current farm operations. CAIP covers a wide variety of agricultural enterprises in its 11 investment areas, including, but not limited to, beef and dairy cattle; farm infrastructure, fencing, and water enhancement; equine; forage; goats and sheep; horticulture; poultry; swine; bees and honey; timber and technology, as well as energy efficiency and production; marketing; and value-added production.

Five CAIPs were approved by the board in the following counties totaling \$556,071:

- Caldwell (\$111,697)
- Henry (\$26,000)*
- Martin (\$95,072)
- Mercer (\$18,302)*
- Scott (\$305,000)

Next Generation Farmer Program (NextGen)

NextGen addresses the growing need for a specialized program that would benefit producers ages 18 to 40 that have been engaged in an agricultural operation for a minimum of three years.

Youth Agricultural Incentives Program (YAIP)
