Kentucky Agricultural Finance Corp. approves more than \$2.9 million in loans

Financing bolsters beef, forage, poultry, and grain farmers across the Commonwealth

FRANKFORT (Jan. 17, 2025) – The Kentucky Agricultural Finance Corp. (KAFC) approved 14 agricultural loans totaling \$2,909,442.50 for projects across the Commonwealth today at its monthly board meeting.

Agricultural Infrastructure Loan Program (AILP)

Four Agricultural Infrastructure loans totaling up to \$880,442.50 were approved. Loan recipients were in Adair (\$250,000), Anderson (\$130,442.50), Daviess (\$250,000), and Hickman (\$250,000) counties.

KAFC participates with lenders to provide financing to producers making capital expenditures for agricultural projects through the AILP. Eligible projects include permanent farm structures with attached equipment that improves the profitability of farming operations. Producers may be eligible for up to \$250,000 not to exceed 50 percent of the project.

Beginning Farmer Loan Program (BFLP)

Ten Beginning Farmer loans totaling up to \$2,029,000 were approved. Loan recipients were in Adair (\$250,000), Breckenridge (\$70,000), Casey (\$170,000), Fleming (\$250,000), Grayson (\$250,000), Henderson (\$184,000), Madison (\$121,250), Monroe (\$250,000), Todd (\$250,000), and Wayne (\$233,750) counties.

The BFLP is designed to assist individuals with some farming experience who desire to develop, expand, or buy into a farming operation. Beginning farmers may qualify for financing to purchase livestock, equipment, or agriculture facilities; to secure permanent working capital; for the purchase of farm real estate; or to invest in a partnership or LLC.

FUNDING REQUEST

The Community Farm Alliance (CFA) is requesting \$868,008 in State funds over a 2 year period to continue supporting market and nutrition incentives, increasing access to local food for low income populations, and leveraging federal funds to support the food and farming systems in Kentucky.

APPLICATION SUMMARY

CFA's project is aimed at increasing sales and income for Kentucky farmers, increasing access to local food for low income populations, and leveraging federal food and nutrition program funds. CFA is building on nearly 8 years of work to accomplish these goals through a broad scope of programs such as: Farmers Market Support Program (FMSP), Farmers Market Resiliency Program (FMRP), Kentucky Double Dollars (KDD), and Fresh Rx for MOMS. Funding for this project will go towards materials/supplies, market manager support, incentives, and personnel to run these programs.

FUNDING REQUEST

The Kentucky State Beekeepers Association is requesting \$109,000 in state funds over 2 years to support the Certified Kentucky Honey Program.

APPLICATION SUMMARY

The Certified Kentucky Honey Program (CKHP) is the marketing program of the Kentucky State Beekeepers Association (KSBA), which started in 2019 with the support of the Kentucky Agricultural Development Fund. This program was implemented to address the issues with adulterated and/or mislabeling of honey in Kentucky. Honey is currently the 3rd most adulterated commodity in the US (behind milk and olive oil) and there is no national quality standard.

There are 3 goals of this program: first, to educate consumers and promote the sale of local honey that is produced by the beekeepers of the KSBA and is a certified product of the state; second, to connect the CKHP beekeepers with consumers who desire to purchase certified local honey; and third, provide Kentucky beekeepers with education and support to grow their apiaries to supply more CKHP honey.

KADB funds will be used for part-time salary, travel, marketing, promotional & educational materials, financial & accounting support, supplies, and equipment.

The total cost of the project is estimated at \$218,000 with funding from the following sources:

FUNDING REQUEST

The Kentucky Young Farmers Association is requesting \$30,885 in state and multi-county funds to purchase welders for 25 farmers who complete the requirements of a welding training program.

APPLICATION SUMMARY

The Kentucky Young Farmers Association/KCTCS Adult Ag Program has a rich history of providing valuable training and resources to farmers across the state. In the early 2000's the program successfully implemented welding classes for farmers where they received thorough training and a welder upon completion, allowing them to make repairs on the farm. Building upon the success of the initial project, the program launched a pilot welding program in 2023-2024 in partnership with KCTCS Workforce Solutions. This pilot program was conducted at SKYCTC and involved 25 participants who completed a comprehensive stick welding course. After a successful pilot program, the applicant has decided to conduct it again at SKYCTC with plans underway to offer it at four other locations in Central and Western Kentucky .

KADB funds will be used to provide welders for 25 participants at the SKYCTC location. 16 will receive a Miller, Millermatic 215 multiprocess MIG, TIG, & Stick welder and 9 will receive a Miller Millermatic 142 MIG welder. After lengthy discussion with past and present participants, offering this training with welder options at varying prices was indicated as a necessity.

FUNDING REQUEST

Marksbury Farm Foods LLC is requesting \$250,000 in state funds to expand processing operations.

APPLICATION SUMMARY

Funding will be used to upgrade multiple domains of processing operations: fabrication floor, inedibles, dry-goods storage, and slaughter operations. The applicant states that current storage for boxes and dry goods are in 8 shipping containers and two offsite garages. The applicant plans to add 1000 square feet of storage space to eliminate this burden. The applicant also plans to install finishes and an auger to the inedible room, build restrooms for employees, and purchase an automatic labeling machine and other tools for the kill floor. This project is part one of a multi-stage upgrade that Marksbury Farm Foods LLC hope to implement over 2-3 years.

The total cost of the project is estimated at \$613,058.40 with funding from the following sources: \$250,000 KADF State Funds \$200,000 Line of Credit \$163,058.40 Cash Contributions

PROJECTED PRODUCER IMPACT

The applicant states that they work with over 200 farm families that would directly benefit from this project.

Committee Recommendation:

CAIP provides Kentucky agricultural producers with cost-share assistance on practices to allow them to improve and diversify their current farm operations. CAIP covers a wide variety of agricultural enterprises in its 11 investment areas, including, but not limited to, beef and dairy cattle; farm infrastructure, fencing, and water enhancement; equine; forage; goats and sheep; horticulture; poultry; swine; bees and honey; timber and technology, as well as energy efficiency and production; marketing; and value-added production.
