Allocated – \$10.6M


Expended/obligated to date – \$10.6M

April 2024 – project completion


Ongoing upgrades – \$3.5M annually, 50 systems per year will be upgraded.

SOLUTION GENERATION	DESCRIPTION
1 st Generation Pre-pandemic 463 installs	JAVS/Codec (Vidyo) used for arraignment proceedings only. 428 courtrooms required upgrades; remaining rooms did not require VA/VC (contained standalone systems).
2 nd Generation Remote Court 154 installs 8/23 34 installs 10/23	Laptop Interface allowed remote participation for hybrid proceedings while accurately recording the proceedings into the JAVS system.
3 rd Generation Hybrid Court 192 installs 8/23 273 installs 10/23	TAP IP/Lenovo bundle provides a seamless hybrid solution for remote as well as in-person proceedings using a dedicated video interface.
4 th Generation New Tech 82 installs 8/23 121 installs 10/23	HDX JAVS 8.0 combines the most technically current JAVS solution with the video conferencing solution (TAP IP/Lenovo bundle).

DLG disburses the funds.



Vendor	Trace3. Provides first – line support and training services.
Device	CISCO Conferencing Room System
CRC License	AOC is funding this cost initially, but it will be recurring.
Installation	50/77 detention centers are installed. Training materials are distributed during installation.
Connectivity with Courtroom	Working as expected. No issues.
Project Completion	November 2023.

JSS Certification Program

- Program began in 2022.
- Currently, 187 JSS have been trained (meaning attended the Instructor Led course), 179 have been certified, and 153 are active. JSSs assist one to many judges.
- JSSs facilitate remote proceedings (schedule events, greet participants, move participants, resolve audio issues, etc.), assist judges with eFilings, and adopt other court technology as necessary (Analytics data).

ITEM	DESCRIPTION
Created	This program was created by a change to the Kentucky Court of Justice Pay Practices Section 5(c) of Supreme Court Amended Order 2022-06.
Increment	JSSs supporting a judge who uses e-Filing and conducts remote court proceedings is eligible to receive a 7% increase in pay following completion of required training.
Training	6-hour course focusing on eFiling, remote court proceedings, Zoom software, courtroom hardware, and Analytics. Annual recertification required (3 hours).
Compliance Reporting	Monthly reporting on Remote Court Proceedings and eFilings processed.

Efiling & Orders

Coming Soon - DirectFile

On the horizon is a new Quick Submit feature called DirectFile. DirectFile allows users with the appropriate permissions to electronically route scanned or signed orders and documents directly to the Clerk's eQueue for processing, bypassing the Judge's Review and Sign Queue. DirectFile has been piloted in several counties and statewide rollout is scheduled for later this year. DirectFile does not replace just-in-time direct scanning, which allows clerks to scan documents directly into the case management system. Simultaneous Remote Interpreting (SRI)

- Less than 5% remote before the pandemic; 100% remote during height of pandemic.
- Currently providing 20%- 30% remote services.
