



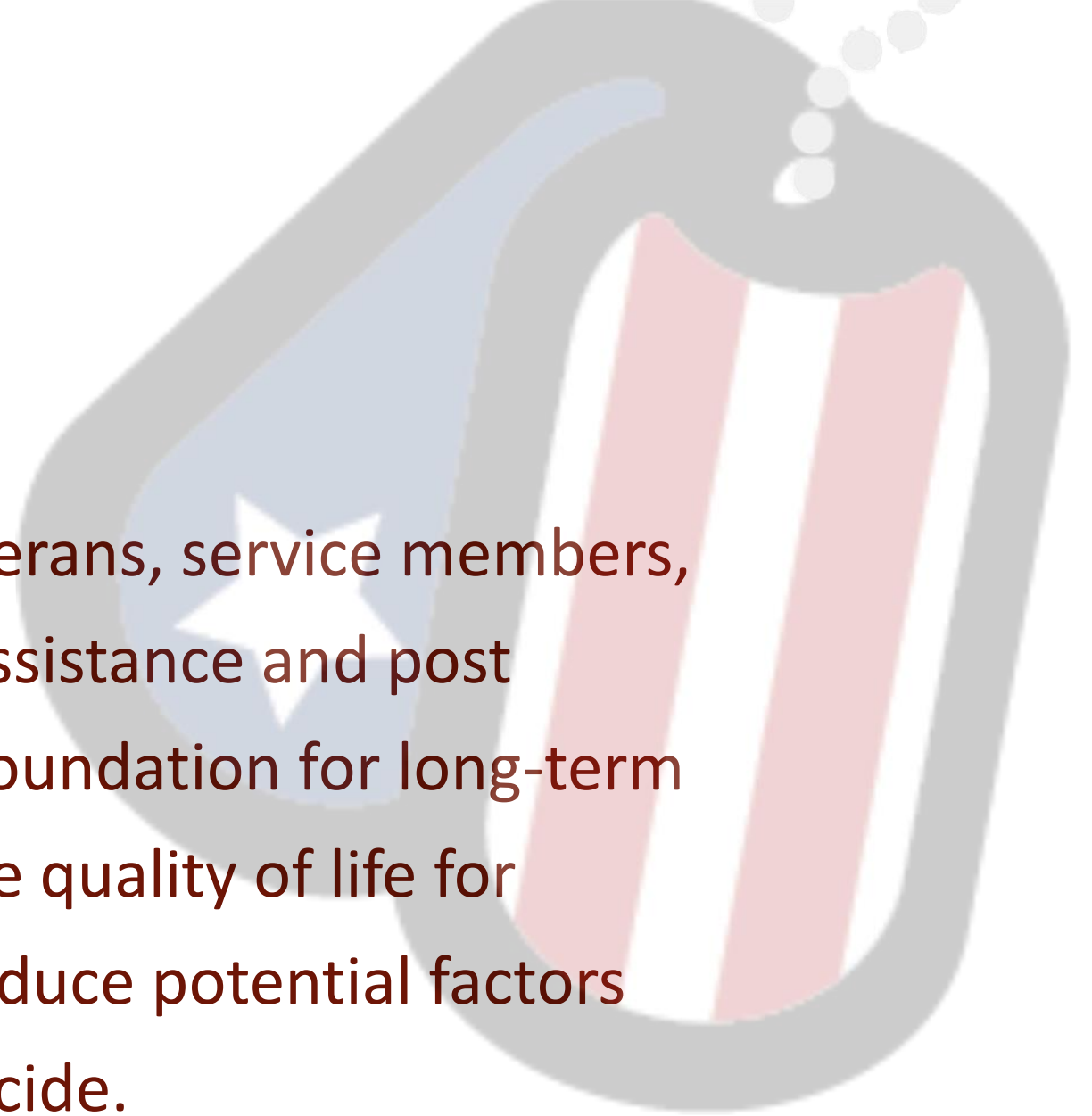

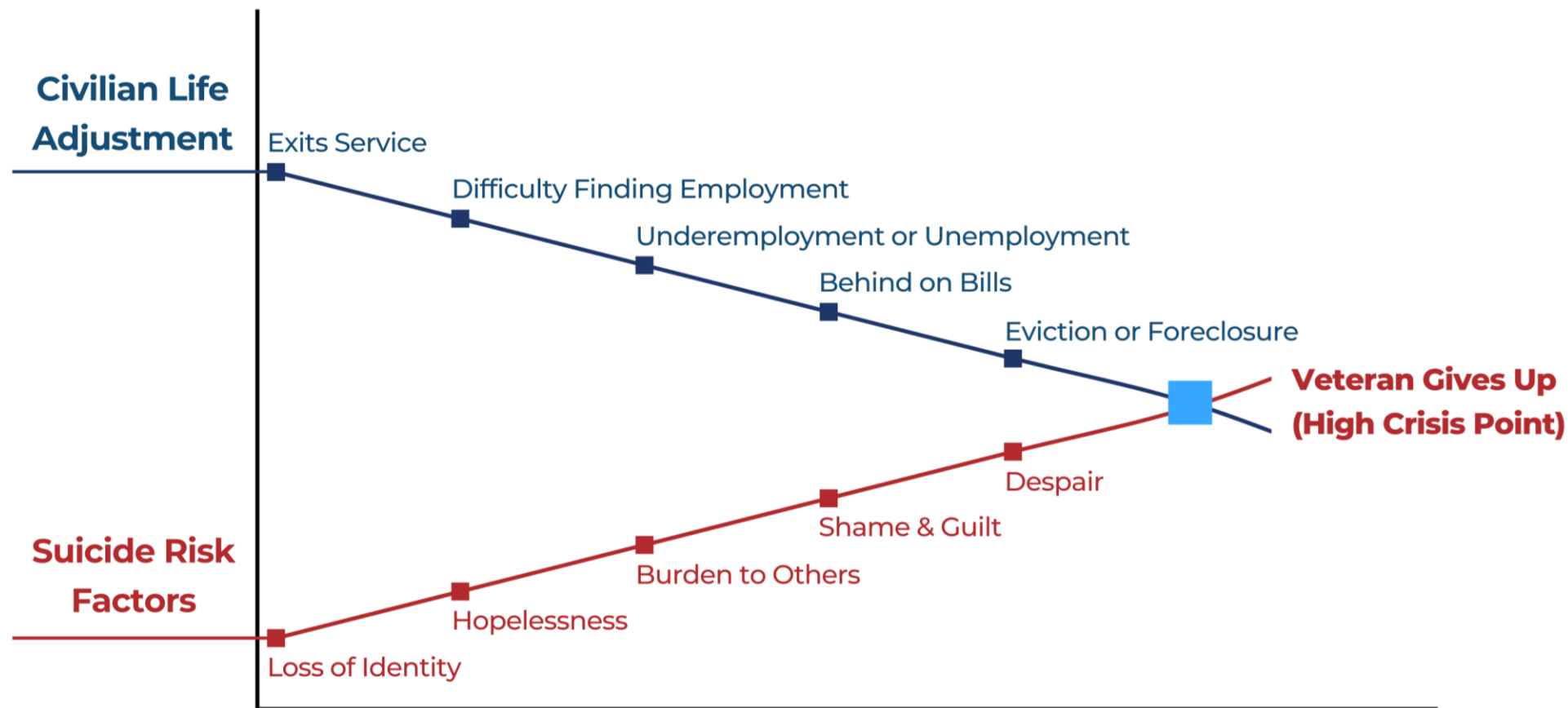
Mission

Impact Story

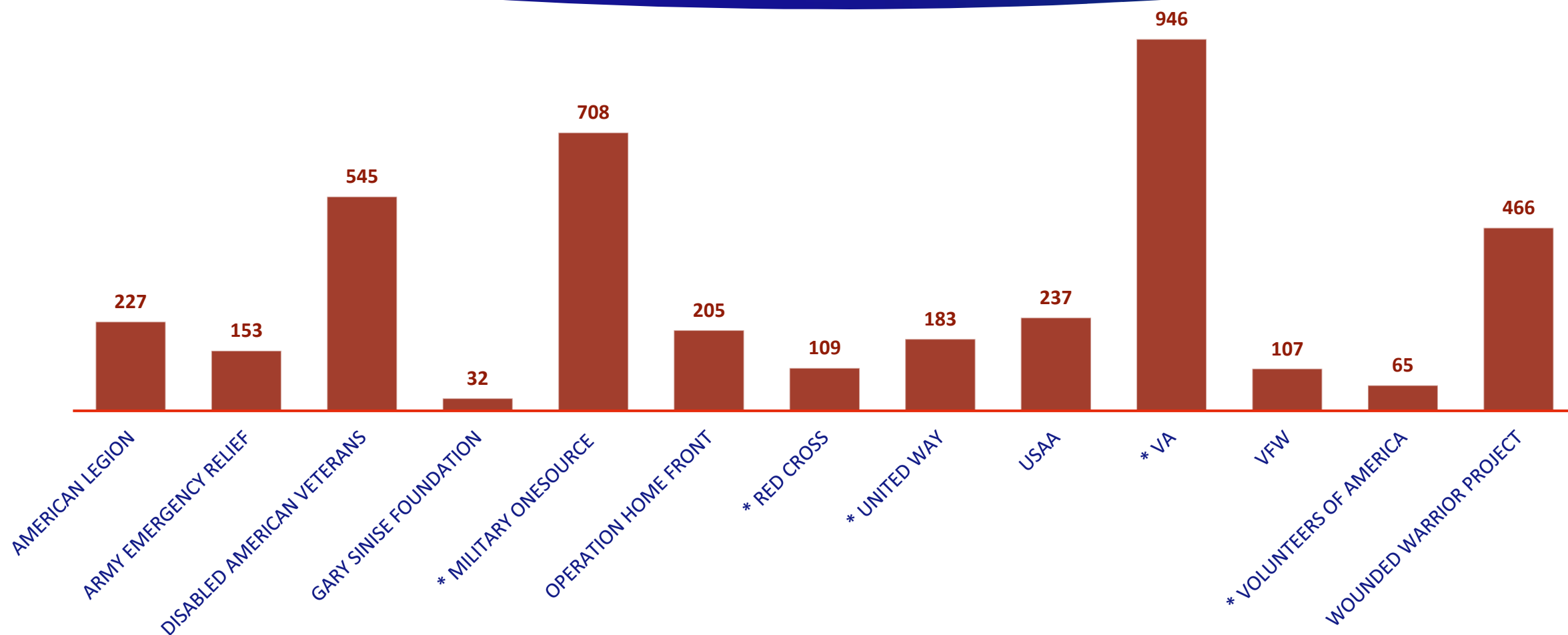
The veteran retired from active duty in 1997 with 20 years of service, receiving both retirement benefits and a 20% VA disability rating. He struggled with anger management and mental health issues, which ultimately impacted his civilian employment.

After six years with his company, the veteran began experiencing severe anxiety due to ongoing sexual harassment by a female contractor. When he escalated the issue above his supervisor, he was terminated in December 2024. His therapist later verified the emotional and psychological hardship he endured.

We assisted him with mortgage payments, water, electric, and food support.

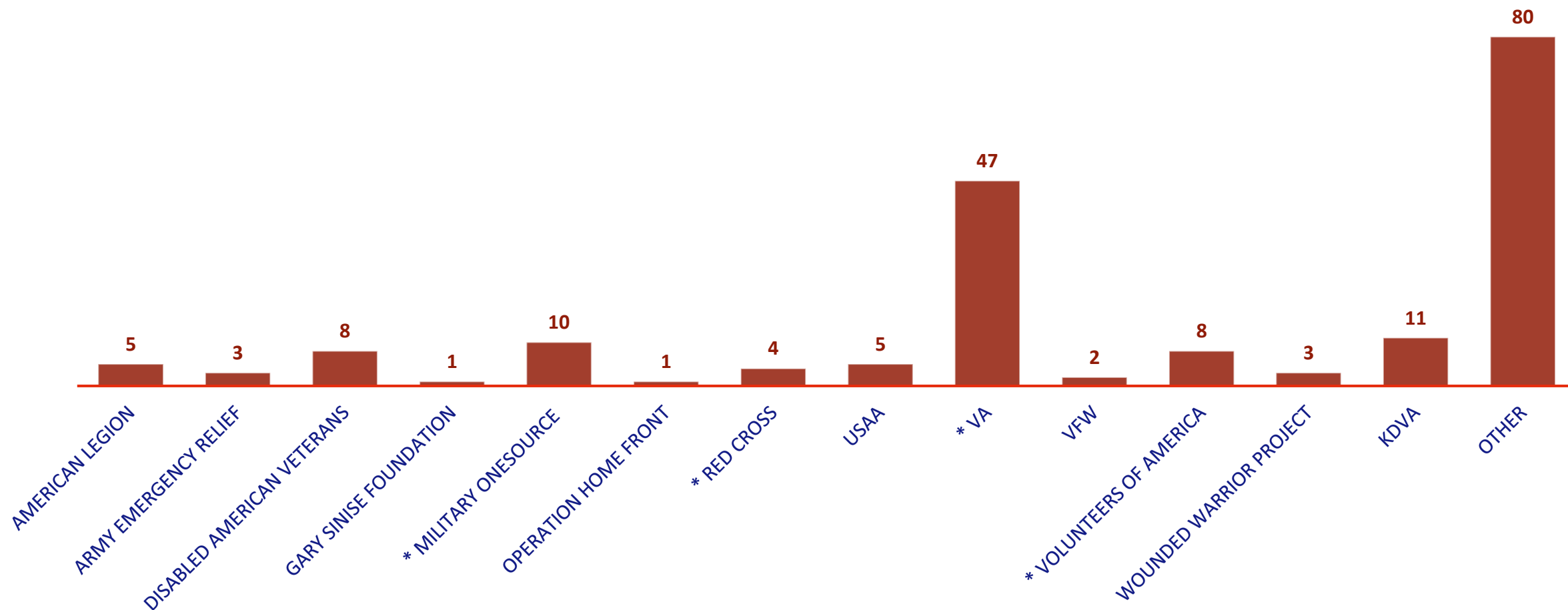


Nationwide Referral Sources - 2024
